



Pastor's Letter

"Beloved, we are God's children now; what we shall be has not yet been revealed." 1 John 3:2

I can recall times in my life during which I did not feel "good enough." I may have done something that I feared God would <u>never</u> forgive or, at least, had placed in my "permanent record." I may have said or done something that harmed another person in a way that I could not take back or undo. Or I may have made a series of decisions that left me feeling isolated from others and from the person I was meant to be. It always saddens me when I am listening to another person who expresses fear of God's punishment or who is holding on to some past thought or action for which they cannot forgive themselves.

We are God's children <u>now</u>. This is despite <u>anything</u> we might have thought, said, or done; and <u>not</u> because of anything we have done to "deserve" or "earn" it. We are God's beloved children now because God created us out of love; God cannot do anything except to love us. Nor can we do anything to lose God's love. God's bond of love with us is unbreakable. No matter how many times or in what ways we may pull away from God's love, we cannot escape it. We only prevent our hearts from letting God's love in.

Of course, there are those who insist that God is vengeful; God keeps a record of all our faults and punishes us until we have sufficiently atoned for our sins. The Old Testament is filled with stories of people who understood their misfortunes and suffering as God's punishment for their unfaithfulness. Sacrifices were offered regularly in hopes of gaining God's favor. Even in our day, we have heard some people insist that earthquakes, natural disasters, and even wars are God's punishments for the sins of those who suffer. Their prayers are **motivated by fear of what God might do** <u>to</u> them rather than by gratitude for what God has done <u>for</u> them.

The mystery of Divine Mercy, which we celebrated last Sunday, is that **God loves us deeply** <u>no</u> <u>matter what</u> we may say or do. St. John reminds us that God so loved the world that God sent his Beloved Son so that we might have life through faith in him. Today, Jesus presents himself to us as the Good Shepherd who seeks out not only those who already "belong" to the fold, but also those who have not yet heard his voice. God's desire is for us to be **one flock under** the guidance and protection of **one shepherd**. There is nothing we can or need do to "earn" our place in God's family. We need only open our hearts to receive God's love. As members of God's family, **our mission is to carry the message of God's love** to those who have not yet heard or not yet believed in such a love. Jesus lives in us and sends us as missionaries, to seek and welcome others who may become one with us in him.

Do you believe, in <u>this</u> moment of <u>this</u> day, that God loves you unconditionally and wants only that you open your heart to receive God's love? I have come to believe, in those moments when my faith in God's love for me is weak, that God pursues me relentlessly until I allow myself to finally dwell in God's love. More importantly, I believe that **Jesus sends each of us** to bring the message of God's love to those who feel far from it – whether due to illness, loss, worry, fear, or the harsh judgment of others. But that message will only ring true if we have come to believe that **we are God's beloved children** <u>now</u>. Do you need to hear that God loves you? **GOD LOVES YOU!** Is Jesus sending you to tell that to someone else? Now is the moment.




