Pastor's Notes

"Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming: 'This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand, Repent, and believe in the gospel."" Mark 1:14-15

Jesus bursts into public ministry with a bold proclamation that *God's kingdom is being fulfilled here and now*. In Mark's gospel, those who are called to work for this kingdom must leave everything behind and *follow immediately*. Therefore, the response of the first four disciples seems to occur without hesitation. It is more probable that Simon, Andrew, James, and John had known about Jesus and his words and actions for some time before they leave behind their families and their livelihood to follow him. Whether over weeks, months, or in an instant, their hearts were transformed in a way that will shape the rest of their lives.

Jesus is as patient with us in his call to follow him. We may or may not be able to identify the precise moment in which we made our first conscious decision to follow him. Perhaps that moment has not yet occurred. And most likely, our initial response was followed by the same ups and downs experienced by the first disciples. We, like they, are *on a journey* with the Lord. New circumstances in our lives and our world repeatedly call us to renew our commitment to the journey – especially when we must discern new ways of seeing, hearing, and acting in service of God's kingdom.

Last weekend, our children preparing for First Eucharist received a cross to wear when they join us for Sunday Eucharist. Please encourage them by your word and example as they journey into a deeper relationship with the Lord and all of us. This weekend, we had invited medical students from Loyola University Medical Center, to share their stories with us. These young men and women, protected by the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals order (DACA), too often have been used by <u>all</u> segments of the political spectrum as pawns to score political points, rather than as persons deserving of human dignity and respect. They are unable to join us today; but you can hear their stories in a CBS news segment at https://www.cbsnews.com/ news/daca-dreamers-medical-students-uncertain-futureloyola-university/. How does the call to serve God's kingdom on earth shape our attitudes, words, and actions in our nation's search for a just political solution that respects the dignity of each human person?

Last Monday, I participated in an interfaith prayer breakfast to commemorate the life and legacy of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. People from the broader La Grange area came together for prayer, fellowship, and reflection on the life and mission of the Rev. Dr. King, and his challenge to us fifty years later. Those present were asked to commit to a year of peace and action in our community and in our relationships. A copy of the document that each of us signed, *The MLK50 Pledge*, is included in today's bulletin and has been posted on the parish website. I ask you to read it, and encourage you to sign and return a copy to the parish office. Members of faith communities throughout the LaGrange area are being asked to do the same.

Continued blessings in these early days of the new year.

Last Sunday, I met with a young woman who is considering a career change. She is bright, educated and accomplished, and if she makes the move she is contemplating, it will be a major transition. When I asked, "Why this, and why now?" she answered, "I've felt God calling me into church work for years. It just took me a while to say 'Yes.""

How easy it seems for these two sets of brothers – Simon and Andrew, and James and John - to drop everything and follow Jesus. Perhaps there was more to the story and their decision making than we heard in today's Gospel. But the result remains solid: Jesus said, "Come, follow me" and they did.

We all have a vocation - a call to follow Jesus. The Second Vatican Council affirms that each of us in our own way hears the call to holiness and mission. May we always respond to the call of Jesus with open hearts and willing spirits. May the work of our lives, within the Church and beyond it, help to build the Kingdom of God.



At this midpoint in our fiscal year, here are some financial highlights:

- Dozens of responses to the parish's request for 4% increases in Sunday offertory collections have come in. Our Christmas contributions continue to come in we have collected \$148,680 toward our Christmas budget of \$158,000.
- We had a great initial response to the Finance Council's appeal to parishioners to switch to electronic offertory: 82 additional families enrolled in this system that ensures consistent contributions throughout the year. In addition, many parish households continue to make stock donations and/or use the Sunday envelopes consistently to support parish operations. One of the following pages of this bulletin contains more information regarding electronic giving...check it out!
- Our cash savings, from the generosity of decades of SFX parishioners who came before us, remain strong. Our goal is not to use these savings for ordinary operations so that they are available for campus building improvements and emergencies.
- We are running at an operating deficit for the current fiscal year. Recall that our budget is set so that our income breaks even with expenses. Our expenses are running close to budget. However, total collections are about \$45,000 below what was budgeted at this point in the year.

Meeting our budget enables us to do all we want to do for our parish and our community. Our children learn about Jesus' love through the liturgy and sacraments (and sing to us at some of the 5pm Masses – check them out!). Our youth experience the Spirit throughout the year in small groups and on retreats and mission trips. Our adults find help along the journey through many SFX ministries. ALL appreciate your support. Please review your situation and the chart below, and increase your contribution if you are able. God bless you all for your continuing support of our parish!

Children's Liturgy of the Word

Our Saturday evening 5:00 pm. Mass offers the opportunity for children in Grades Kindergarten—Fourth to experience hearing and reflecting on the Word of the Lord in a way that is an empowering experience. Children in these grades are invited to follow their Reflectors of the Word to a prayer space away from the gathered assembly to hear the Scriptures in words they can understand.

Children's Liturgy of the Word takes place in church whenever the children's choirs lead us in song/prayer. The Scriptures we hear will then be taken from the Children's Lectionary and the homily will be given in a way that children are able to relate to a little more readily. The children in Grades K thru 4 will go to their prayer space on the Saturdays that the choirs are not singing.

Here is the tentative schedule: February 3—Combined Choirs; February 24—Choristers; March 3—Cherub and March 24—Choristers



PEACE **DACA** Awareness campaign Do you know the facts regarding the DACA program?

What is DACA? It's the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals program, created in 2012.

DACA applicants must have:

- Come to the U.S. prior to turning 16 and be at least 15 years old
- Been younger than 31 years of age on June 15, 2012
- Graduated high school, be in school, or served in • the U.S. armed forces
- Not been convicted of a felony and not pose a • threat to national security or public safety
- Pay a fee of approximately \$500 and renew every • 2 years

Common Misunderstanding

- Obtaining DACA is not a path to citizenship
- DACA recipients are ineligible for most federal • programs, including health care (e.g., Medicaid)
- DACA does not apply to children younger than • 16 or the parents of U.S. citizen children or lawful permanent residents
- While the majority are Hispanic, DACA • recipients come from all over the world.

There were 689,800 DACA recipients as of September 2017. They pay taxes and play a critical role in supporting their families. Learn the facts at National Immigration Law Center: www.nilc.org.


