

Pastor's Notes

"The measure with which you measure will in turn be measured out to you."

Luke 6:38

What is the measure with which we measure? We live in a time in which instruments can be calibrated to give precise and accurate measurements. Yet many of us have tried to "cheat" the bathroom scale in our favor. We are less able to cheat the scale in matters of commerce. Yet how often do we hold back when it comes to giving away our time, our talents, or our material wealth? Or how often do we try to keep things "even" in our dealings with others, careful not to give away any more than we expect to receive in return? How often do we wait for the other to "give first," whether that be an apology, a sign of compassion, or a loan?

Jesus challenges us to be generous in giving to others. "Stop judging and you will not be judged." "Bless those who curse you and pray for those who mistreat you." "Lend expecting nothing back." "Love your enemies and do good to them." Jesus leaves little "wiggle room" in how his disciples must act. Yet he also puts these challenges in context: "Be merciful just as your Father is merciful." Our generosity is not meant as an act of altruism, but rather of *gratitude* for what God already has done for us. Whenever we are tempted to hold back or demand our "fair share," Jesus asks us to consider what God continues to do for us and ask God's grace to do the same for others.

This weekend throughout the Archdiocese of Chicago, parishioners are being asked to contribute to the 2019 Annual Catholic Appeal. This annual pledge drive funds much of the charitable and social justice outreach of the church in Chicago and the work of Catholic Relief Services throughout the world. This includes outreach to parishes in communities with limited resources; neighborhoods plagued by violence in various forms; protection of the unborn; and care for immigrants and refugees in our country and in other parts of the world. Those who benefit from the Appeal may never have the means to repay us and will never know us by name. We reach out to them as sisters and brothers in need; we do so in gratitude for the blessings God has bestowed on us.

If you are not prepared today to make a pledge at Mass, you have several options. You can take home an envelope and return it to the office or place it in the collection basket next weekend. If you prefer to donate online, you can go directly to the Annual Catholic Appeal website (giving.archchicago.org/annual-catholic-appeal) or reach the Appeal website via the parish website (www.sfxlg.org). Please remember to designate St. Francis Xavier – La Grange as your parish. Any donations to the Appeal above our parish goal are given to the parish and used for ongoing maintenance projects on our parish campus. The rebate that we received from the Archdiocese last year will allow us to replace the church air conditioning unit, which made it clear last summer that it is reaching the end of reliable service.

Thank you for your many forms of generosity to the mission of the parish, the mission of the Archdiocese, and the mission of Church in our world.

The St. Francis Xavier School Advisory Board is accepting applications for a three-year term on the Board. Wonder what it takes or how the process works? Below are some common questions people have about becoming a board member.

Common Questions:

Do you have to have experience on a board or had a job in education? NO, you do not have to have prior experience on a school board or experience in education to apply.

How much time is this commitment? We meet once per month plus 1-2 supplementary meetings each month. Expect approximately about 6-8 hours per month.

Do you have to have a child at the school to apply? NO, we encourage parent (guardian) of a Religious Education student, young adult parishioners and alumna/us of SFX. Candidates need not be parents.

How does the application/selection process work? There is a one page application, a face-to-face meeting with the members of the Board and then the Board votes on the slate of applicants.

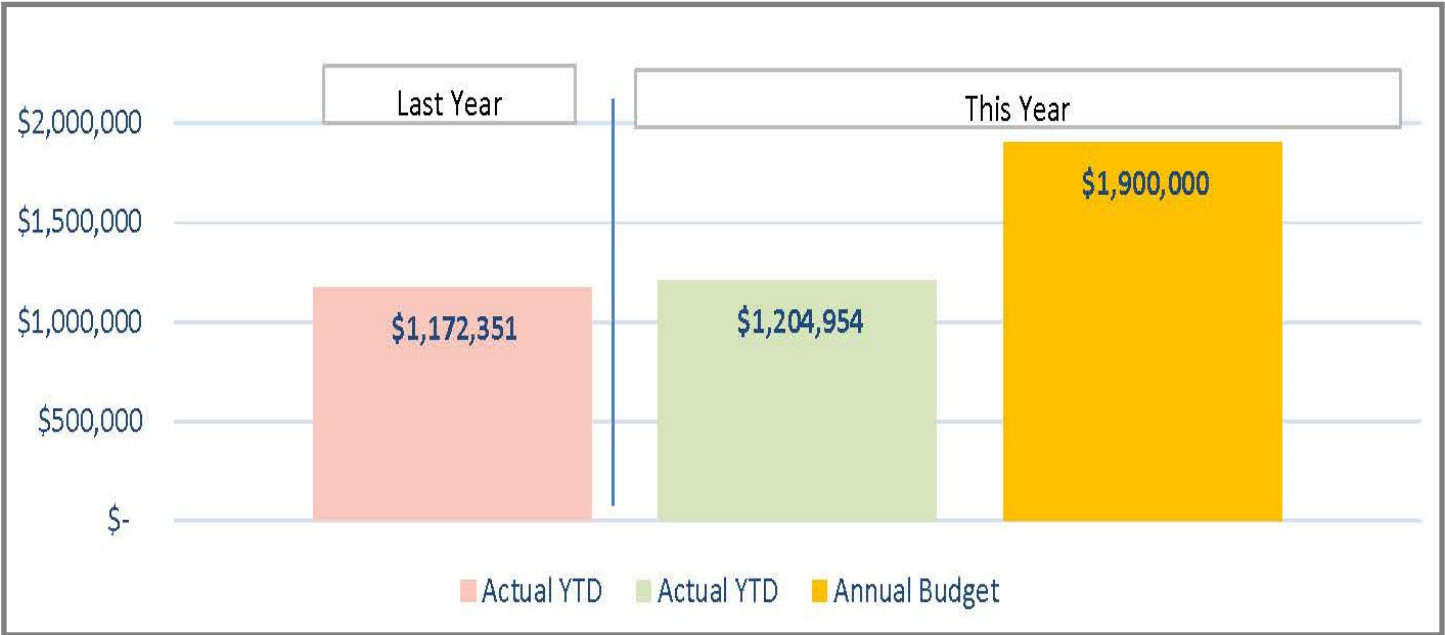

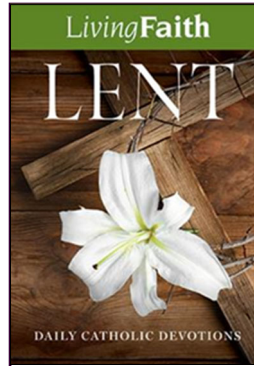

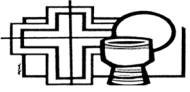
