

Pastor's Notes

Jesus said, "I send you."

– And the Spirit enabled them to proclaim....
John 20:21 – Acts of the Apostles 2:4

Pentecost shifts us from our focus on the resurrection of Jesus and sends us out in mission. Disciples of Jesus neither cling to a stationary presence of Christ nor stand gazing up into the heavens for God to return. We honor the presence of Christ in Word, Eucharist, and the worshipping community. We look forward in hope to the fulfillment of God's kingdom. But most importantly, Jesus sends the first disciples in peace on that first Easter morning; the Spirit sends them to tell the good news to all the world through word and action on that first Pentecost. We too are sent at the end of every Eucharist. Jesus asks that we carry his Word into our daily thoughts, words, and actions. He shapes us into his Body in our communion with his Body and Blood. The place in which we worship is designed not as a place to "hold Christ," but as a place from which we carry Christ into our daily lives and into the lives of others.

Over the past few days, parish women, men, youth, and children have lived our mission in service to the hungry, the "other" abled, the sick, the prisoner, and many others. Thank you to those who collaborated with Mary Freeman to provide our service opportunities and to all who took part. It is often our small actions of love, empowered by the Spirit, that do the most to *set the world on fire*.

Many have been asking me about whether we will be receiving an associate pastor when Father Bill Killeen retires at the end of the month. I recently received word that Father Karol Tybor will join our staff in January, after the completion of a six-month sabbatical. Fr. Karol just celebrated his tenth anniversary of ordination. For the past four years, he has served as pastor of St. John Parish in Glenwood. I met Fr. Karol on the recent Border Immersion Trip sponsored by Catholic Extension Society, and he since has met the parish staff. He comes highly recommended by our two previous pastors, Fr. Stenzel and Fr. Hoffman. Karol impressed me within hours of meeting him in April as a kind, generous, hard-working priest who genuinely loves serving and coming to know others. He will spend some of his sabbatical time with family, all of whom live in Poland or other parts of Europe, and much of it participating in a study program in the Holy Land. He is excited about getting to know us all in the new year.

Please mark your calendars for our thanksgiving celebration with Father Killeen on Saturday, June 22.

The Saturday 5PM Mass will be followed by a reception in Joyce Hall. All are invited! I hope you can be there.

Scripture Reflections

Today, as we celebrate the feast of Pentecost, we find ourselves celebrating the mysterious movement of God in our world, in the Church, and in our individual lives. The Spirit of God, alive and working in each of us, is what is needed for us to continue to build community and to be "Church." This Spirit can be found in many ways in each of us. Everything that comes through the Spirit is a gift to us. It is when we accept the gift and share our gift(s) with others, that we can, as Church, enjoy God's presence fully alive among us.

As Christians, we find ourselves, over and over again, relying on the Spirit of God in our lives; the Spirit that was promised to us by Jesus. Pentecost celebrates the day when God's Spirit was set loose in the world. Pentecost celebrates the day the mysterious movement of God, working and alive in all of us and through all of us, began. This Spirit was first given to us at our baptism, is invoked on the bread and wine as well as ourselves whenever we celebrate the Eucharist, and is confirmed in us when we make or have made our own faith commitment at the time of our Confirmation. This same Spirit gives us what we need to be open to possibilities that can transform us personally, nationally, globally, and within the Church itself. This same Spirit gives us the courage and the strength to be open to whatever the Spirit has to give us, so that a new way of living can happen.

Today's feast is a good opportunity for each of us to personally reflect on how we accept and grow with the movement of God within us. What can each of us do to make a difference within ourselves, our family, the community, our nation, the world, the Church? What calls us to live outside the control of fear so that we can boldly and with passion live life as a Pentecost people? We are called to do something new each day. Are we open to the calling and the challenge?

Pentecost "births" us to so many new possibilities. How are we going to celebrate this birthday? Happy Birthday, Church!!







Collection For Retired Priests



Next weekend, we will take up a special collection for the Retired Priests. There are over 200 Retired Archdiocesan Priests. They represent 30% of all the priests serving in the Archdiocese. Normal retirement age is 70 for Chicago priests. Sixty-five priests still live in a rectory and assist the parish on a regular basis. Close to 140 retired priests celebrate Sunday Mass weekly, perform marriages and baptisms; and visit the sick in hospitals. Without these dedicated men, many parishes would not be able to offer the full range of Masses and sacraments that are currently available.

This collection is solely for the retired priests of the Archdiocese of Chicago. The retired priests of the Archdiocese receive no funds from the Religious Retirement Collection taken up in December. Those funds go for religious nuns and brothers and religious order priests.

The Archdiocese of Chicago is committed to caring for our retired priests, but we need your assistance and the generosity of every parish community.

Our Berghaus Pipe Organ

I am pleased to announce that we are a couple of steps closer to completing the original vision of our beautiful pipe organ built in 2003 by Berghaus Pipe Organ, Bellwood, IL. The installation of the full plan for our pipe organ was cut short due to boiler problems in 2003. Some of the allocated funds for the organ had to be moved to fix the boiler, leaving the installation of the organ incomplete.

Thanks to the support of a parishioner's generous monetary gift, we now have the prepared *Rauschpfeife III* and *Clarion* stops completed and installed. My sincere gratitude and thanks to that parishioner, who wishes to remain anonymous.

Full completion of the installation plan would involve adding two final elements: *Chimes* and the *Trompette Royale*. This beautiful instrument will continue to enhance our worship for years to come. Thank you!


Taizé Prayer


