Pastor's Notes

"Whoever does not accept the kingdom of God like a child will not enter it." Mark 10:13

The disciples see children as one more distraction in the mission and ministry of Jesus. Once again, Jesus teaches them that it is just the opposite. It is the children who become, not distractions, but a model for discipleship. Those given least importance become the most important. Their gentle, generous giving of the little they have becomes the "way" of the disciple of Jesus.

How do we adopt the attitudes of children in our discipleship?

- * We are called to be grateful for what we have. A child celebrating a first birthday often is more fascinated with the ribbons, the wrapping paper, and the empty boxes than with the presents. They find joy and are grateful for what the moment contains.
- * We are called to be kind. A little child who becomes upset with a person or unmet need may cry in protest for a time; then they move on. It is as we grow older that we learn to hold grudges and become unkind to those who hurt us or are unlike us.
- * We are called to share with others. Children do not have an innate sense of "mine." Often the fewer "possessions" children have, the less intense their sense of exclusive ownership. Children are able and willing to learn to share.

This month we as a parish focus on the attitudes and practices of good stewardship. Stewardship is a word more familiar to Protestant than to Catholic Christians. Sadly, it entered Catholic vocabulary associated with the need to "give more" to the church. Stewardship is much more; it is a way of living that guides <u>all</u> aspects of our lives. **Stewardship originates in an attitude of gratitude**: a belief that everything we have is a *gift entrusted to us* by

God. Gratitude leads to kindness in our attitudes toward others, especially toward those in need. Kindness leads to sharing what I can of God's gifts of time, talent, and treasure.

The focus this weekend is Stewardship of Time: the time we devote to prayer and presence with God and our faith community. At the core is gathering with the community for Eucharist once each week. Attending Sunday Mass is a habit given less importance amid the demands of busy lives and hectic schedules. Nonetheless, I continue to encourage all households, especially families, to take one step forward from your current family or personal practice. For those of us who are here regularly, we practice stewardship of time when we actively engage in Sunday worship and warmly welcome all who gather with us.

Stewardship of time is practiced at other community prayer opportunities, such as the monthly Taize prayer, small faith groups, and our new monthly Eucharistic Adoration Hour. Stewardship of time also includes time for family and personal prayer. And stewardship of time is our commitment to spend time getting to know other parishioners, especially through events offered by various parish organizations. Last Saturday's Oktoberfest is a great example, and I thank those whose efforts made the evening both welcoming and fun. Other fall opportunities include the parish Theater Night at the Theater of Western Springs; the Men's Club Pig Roast; and the Falcon 5K.

What one thing might you add or change in how you and your household practice stewardship of time? How might you practice a more childlike use of God's gift of time?


Scripture Reflection

In 1980 the US bishops published a document titled Called and Gifted: The American Catholic Laity. It was short and was often published as a brochure, but it was nonetheless an important text commemorating the fifteenth anniversary of the *Decree on the Apostolate of the Laity*. The bishops spoke of the four calls of laity: adulthood, holiness, ministry, and community. Today's gospel definitely calls us to adulthood, to a mature reading of the text.

The US bishops wrote in 1980, "Adulthood implies knowledge, experience and awareness, freedom and responsibility, and mutuality in relationships. It is true, however, that the experience of lay persons 'as church members' has not always reflected this understanding of adulthood." What a remarkable statement from the bishops! So, we read today's gospel in light of our knowledge and experience of human relationships. We grapple with its meaning, recognizing that Jesus' sayings are hard. But we never stop following. We never stop being a disciple. We are adults in his church, with freedom, responsibility, and mutuality in relationships.

WHAT:

During Adoration, sometimes referred to as a Holy Hour (but can be of any duration), the Blessed Sacrament is exposed on the altar for individual, silent Adoration. As Catholics, we proclaim the Real Presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament, not only during the Mass but in the preserved Hosts. As St. John Paul II taught: "The Eucharist, in the Mass and outside of the Mass, is the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, and is therefore deserving of the worship that is given to the living God, and to Him alone."

Religious orders and the clergy have participated in Eucharistic Adoration for centuries and have encouraged the laity to do the same.

Each pope since Vatican II has implored the laity to increase devotion to the Blessed Sacrament during Adoration.

St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta called Eucharistic Adoration "the best time you'll spend on earth."

HOW:

Adorers are invited to pray a rosary or other devotions, meditate on Scripture or meditate on devotional books. Adorers may also choose to just simply sit and 'be' with Jesus.

WHEN:

Beginning on **October 18,** SFX will be exposing the Blessed Sacrament for Adoration *every* 3rd Thursday of the month in the Church from 6:00-7:00 pm.

Pray for us, O holy Mother of God, that we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.



How to Pray the Rosary

- 2. Say the Our Father.

- 5. Announce the First Mystery; then say the Our Father.
- 7. Say the Glory be to the Father.
- 8. Say the Fatima Prayer after each decade.
- 9. Announce the Second Mystery: then say the Our Hail Mary, full of grace; the Lord is with thee; blessed art *Father*. Repeat 6-8 and continue with the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Mysteries in the same manner.
 - 10. Say the Hail, Holy Queen and Closing Prayers on the medal after the five decades are completed.

As a general rule, Joyful Mysteries are said on Monday & Spirit. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall Saturday; Sorrowful Mysteries on Tuesday & Friday; Glorious Mysteries on Wednesday & Sunday; and Luminous Mysteries on Thursday.

Jolene's story

The abuse

My partner has been physically and emotionally abusing me for about twelve months. It's started with pushing and shoving and taking my keys when I wanted to leave. He was very insecure about past relationships and jealous of people he thought were a threat. We would have evenings where he'd been drinking and start calling me names. It would go on for hours until he would fall asleep. The next day it was always the same, he was sorry and he didn't know why he said and did the things he did.

I believed him at first but after the third time I knew it was a mistake and I had to get out. The final straw was the worst behavior, hours of verbal abuse and name calling and then he became violent when I tried to call someone. That night it dawned on me things will never change. I had to put myself first and do what was right for me. How could I let myself be hurt this way?

How I coped

I believed he wanted to change. We even went to counseling together but it didn't last. I kept telling myself that it was the drink, or I tried to change my way of thinking and acting. Nothing worked. I knew I had to get out. I confided in a friend who helped me cope and then to eventually leave.

How the situation changed

After the last time, I had the strength to tell him to leave. Of course, he wouldn't leave, but I asked my friend for help and she reinforced to him that I wanted him out, or else I'd call the police. He believed me then because I'd told someone.

What helped me

My belief is that this was wrong and no matter what, his behavior was not my fault. Good friends helped and are still helping me to get stronger. I will seek counseling now and I know I'll keep going forward and get stronger still.

What I would say to others

Believe in yourself and tell yourself you deserve better. I know it's hard but you can get out, you don't have to live like this. No matter what they tell you, never ever believe that the abuse is your fault.


Parish Counselor
