ST. FRANCIS XAVIER ANNUAL REPORT JULY 1, 2017—JUNE 30, 2018

Sisters and Brothers in Stewardship,

I present the St. Francis Xavier Annual Parish Report for the fiscal year from July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018.

The 2018 Parish Year led us into completion of all but one of the remaining major projects of our Capital Campaign this past summer. This includes the new, fully accessible vestibule of the Monsignor O'Brien Gymnasium, parking lot improvements, and the bonus of Unity Garden as a beautiful and accessible approach to Unity Hall. Ongoing Capital Campaign contributions will enable us to complete the final major project, a new fire and smoke detection system in the church and education buildings, within a few years.



Encouraging changes also are happening within the walls of our church and education buildings. The Parish Pastoral Council continues to invite more people into the parish conversation and leadership. Young adults joined others to establish new committees to plan social/fundraising opportunities for parishioners of all ages, to encourage an attitude of stewardship (grateful devotion of time, sharing talents, and investing treasure) to care for the mission and ministries of the parish, and to create parish Twitter and Instagram accounts. Our parish elementary school adopted a strategic plan that will strengthen our ability to offer a Catholic elementary education to families who want to provide this to their children.

I am excited and grateful for the blessings of St. Francis Xavier Parish. You, the people of the parish, are the most important blessing God has given to our mission in Christ. With your investment, we will continue our commitment to parish education and formation programs for all ages and support the talented and generous teachers, catechists, and volunteers who make these programs possible. We will continue to dedicate resources to our vibrant liturgies that nourish parishioners of all ages, and to welcome inquirers and newcomers. We will continue to reach out to our community and communities beyond through charitable ministries such as the Food Pantry and support for St. Agatha, our sharing parish on Chicago's west side; and through engagement in social justice issues such as ecumenism, gun violence, and comprehensive immigration reform. We will continue to maintain and enhance our facilities, including a new sound system for Joyce Hall and a new church air conditioning unit to replace our aging one.

To remain vibrant, and to do all of this, requires an ongoing generosity of time, talent and treasure on all our parts. This past year we had to rely on the generosity of past years to meet a significant operating shortfall; this was despite careful management of parish expenses by our Business Manager and parish Finance Council. The Finance Council and I ask you to consider a 4% increase in your annual offering; and to consider electronic giving via GiveCentral if you are not yet enrolled. Electronic giving is a great help in planning and managing the parish budget and has shown encouraging results in recent months. Your generous investment through good stewardship, to the extent that your household is able, makes possible our shared mission.

God bless you for all you continue to contribute to the many successes of this past year. God bless us all in our efforts this year. Peace, Fr. Bill





STEWARDSHIP OF TREASURE PARISH FINANCE COUNCIL REPORT

As we celebrate stewardship here at SFX, the Finance Council presents the current trends and budget outlook regarding giving. During the past fiscal year, **offertory giving was even** with the previous fiscal year (compared to a *budgeted* increase of 4%). While giving was flat, SFX made the decision to continue investing in the parish, specifically through developing a strategic plan for the Day School and specific capital improvements to the parish infrastructure. **The expenditures associated with these initiatives resulted in an operating deficit of \$95,000.** We continue to have strong cash reserves, a legacy of those who came before us. While our financial strength allowed us to absorb the \$95,000 operating deficit, fiscal responsibility is a primary goal for the Finance Council.

Considering the traditional vibrancy of the parish, our review of expenses indicates church expenditures are well managed. From the Day School's perspective, the strategic plan established a framework to consider efficiencies regarding the leased space for the preschool and kindergarten programs. For the past 20 years, we have leased space from the First Baptist Church to accommodate an increase in enrollment that occurred at the turn of the century. Over the past ten years we have been returning to the strong, but smaller enrollment that preceded the increase. Two years ago, first grade returned to the Education Building. In collaboration with the Finance Council and School Advisory Board, Fr. Bill Tkachuk and Principal Sharon Garcia made the decision to initiate the plan for reunification of all students in the Education Building. At the end of this school year, the lease with the First Baptist Church will terminate. The monies freed up from the lease termination will enable SFX to accomplish other goals established in the strategic plan and the mission of the parish.

Like the stewards of any thriving entity, our goal is not only to balance the budget, but also to ensure resources are available in the future when additional investments in the parish are needed. *The Finance Council has recommended to Fr. Bill Tkachuk a balanced budget this year, based on a 4% increase in total offertory (including Sunday, Christmas, and Easter).* Note that **last year**, our budget was ALSO based on a 4% increase in offertory, with the actual offertory results coming in flat with the previous year. Therefore, the suggested increase of 4% spans two years as we try to catch up with two years of moderate operating expense increases.

As conscientious stewards of the parish's treasure, the Finance Council continues to review parish operating expenses with Jennifer Zeisloft, the parish Business Manager, on a quarterly basis. In collaboration with the Buildings and Grounds Committee, we look for what is best for the parish from a building infrastructure perspective, staying proactive so that facilities are well maintained. Working with staff members and representatives of our many ministries, we continue to sustain our spiritual and liturgical traditions while exploring new ways to reach out to and engage existing and new members of the parish. We appreciate the time you spent during October to determine how you would engage in the SFX community as a good steward. We appreciate your commitment. May we all join together to support each other today, and to gift future generations with our investment in SFX.

SFX also sets aside some of its own budget for mission-driven giving beyond the parish. Examples include: a donation toward the purchase of a new ultrasound machine for the *Women's Care Center* in La Grange; financial support to *Interfaith Community Partners* whose mission is to maximize independence and well-being for older adults; the *Archdiocese Office of Human Dignity and Solidarity* on behalf of DACA students; and *Interfaith Community for Detained Immigrants* for their work with individuals and families affected by immigration detention, deportation and post-detention.

In addition, SFX provides programs such as the Day School Service Day, Religious Ed Toy Shower and Youth Ministry Giving Tree for St. Agatha Parish, Teen Mission Trip, and All Parish Service Day. Parishioners provide ongoing donations of food, clothing and household items to strengthen outreach to our local community through the Food Pantry. The parish hosts an overnight shelter in Joyce Hall in collaboration with the BEDS Plus organization.

Auxiliary organizations also benefit missions beyond the parish. For example, Catholic Women's Club hosts The Tyler Toy Drive in support of the Pediatric Oncology Treasure Chest Foundation, and Men's Club financially supports Habitat for Humanity and BEDS Plus.




125th Anniversary Capital Campaign & Capital Projects

In 2014, SFX embarked on a capital campaign to fulfill part of its Prophetic Plan to maintain, enhance, and expand parish facilities. Almost 1,000 families joined in support. The overwhelming success of the campaign enabled the parish to enter into three years of substantial capital projects from 2016 – 2018. The addition of Unity Hall has been used for Sunday morning Masses, providing wiggle room for youngsters with their families. Overflow Christmas and Easter Masses view the liturgies on Unity Hall's audio/visual system. The Hall has been used for countless meetings involving Religious Ed and Day School, adult education presentations, ministries ... the list goes on and on. The gym and Joyce Hall renovations in the Education Building are almost complete. bringing "oohs and aahs" from parishioners and visitors alike. The gym vestibule was completed this summer, with new accessible viewing area and bathrooms. And an addition to the campaign's scope: our new Unity Garden, which includes a new paver area (blessed in the photo above), electric power transformer, waterproofing, and decorative lighting.

Pledge payments are scheduled to come in through December 2021. Our projects are almost finished Our commitment to St. Agatha Parish's Educational Endowment Fund is set to be fulfilled by June 2020. God bless all who supported the 125th Anniversary Capital Campaign, investing in these wonderful parish facility enhancements!

The Christmas Wafer


The Christmas Wafer (also known as "Oplatki") is available in the Rectory during office hours Monday through Thursday 9:00 am-8:30 pm, Friday 8:30 am



-4:30 pm; Saturday 9:00 am-5:00 pm and on Sunday between 9:00 am-1:00 pm.

The word "Bethlehem" means "the house of bread." The breaking of the bread is a sign of charity, unity and friendship. Religious family customs bring the truths of faith into the home. One of these beautiful Christmas Eve customs is the Christmas Wafer. The thin wafer bearing the Christmas characters is broken by the head of the family and distributed to each member. With a simple prayer for God's grace and the welfare of all members of the family, those present as well as those who are absent, the head of the house breaks the wafer and distributes it, one piece to each person at the table. While doing so, each member of the family is kissed and wished a joyful feast. Members then greet one another in the same way.

The spiritual lesson in this age-old custom is that the unity of the family is grounded in God's love for us. May you experience unity and love through this simple celebration.

Feast of Christ the King

We gather today on the last Sunday of the church's calendar year; the Sunday called Christ the King. Today is the culminating day of an entire year's journey through the scriptures. The story of faith has been retold beginning with Advent's expectation. We then followed the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus in the gospels. The early steps of the church were retraced through Pentecost and beyond. And we followed the teachings of the apostles through the Sundays in Ordinary Time. All of this brings us to this day, the day we celebrate Jesus as King.

People in our culture today, however, are usually not comfortable with the notion of kings and queens. Our ideas about them often come from the stories we read as children. The notion of power comes with this image of ours. Power can do some cruel things to us and to our world, depending on how it is used. Sometimes power can make us not be who we were meant to be. We become someone other than ourselves. We use power as something we hold over others or something we use to help us get ahead.

Christ, our King, is not swayed by power or uses power on his behalf. Jesus does not use his power to command and dictate. After all, we hear once again in today's gospel that Jesus was handed over to Pilate to stand trial. Not something you would think one of power would allow to have happen. And yet he did.

Today's feast challenges us to live out the reign of God every day. Most people who handed Jesus over to Pilate did not recognize him as King. Today, we are challenged to recognize this same King in the faces of starving children, the imprisoned, and those in need of social assistance. We're challenged to see Christ the King in the lonely, the marginalized, the elderly. Can you see him in overworked parents and in the struggles of our young people?

Christ, our King, invites us and empowers us on this feast to look with eyes of faith and reach out in love to the King hidden in every person so that the Kingdom of God may reign. In so doing, we can bring life, hope, and peace to the world around us.

How will we honor and serve Christ the King to those we meet this day?

The Prayer Shawl Ministry members knit and crochet prayer shawls intended to



Infant Baptisms


