Pastor's Notes

I pray always with joy... Philippians 1:4

St. Paul sets an example and a challenge. In the days leading to Christmas, we can be drawn into doing "more and better" than we can do and remain balanced. Paul reminds us that the most important thing we could do "more and better" in these or any days is to nurture an attitude of joy. Our national Thanksgiving Day offers a starting point, since joy flows from a sense of gratitude. Of course, the following days, "Black" Friday, "Local" Saturday, "Cyber" Monday, and even "Giving" Tuesday are designed to draw us away from gratitude for what is and into desires for things we think we lack. The candles of the Advent wreath invite us to align our hopes with the joyful promise of God's present and future presence, while holiday movies may make us aware of wishes that will not be fulfilled.

How might each day be different if we begin and end the day with a joyful prayer that names gratitude in the present and hope for what is yet to be? How might we brighten the lives of those in our household and those we meet with our joyful gratitude and hope? Do we have the courage of our ancestors in faith to stand against the darkness of the natural world and the darkness of human suffering; in fact, to be a people of joy based on hope and gratitude? How might we, this Advent, welcome Christ into our homes and bear Christ to those with whom we share our lives or simply encounter on the street or in the store?

One year ago, the Parish Pastoral Council began to lead a parish conversation on how to engage more parishioners in the mission and ministries of the parish. What do we, who already are engaged, need to do to invite and welcome new volunteers into parish life? This October, the parish Stewardship Team asked us all to consider stewardship of talents in our home, parish, and community. Two parish ministries recently welcomed new volunteers. Ed Barret has served as sacristan for the Sunday Noon Mass for many years; he recently discerned that it was time to retire from this ministry. Recent months have shown the fruit of her efforts and have brought fresh ideas to inspire our weekly celebrations. **Thank you, Celine and crew**, especially in this season that asks so much of your time and talents!

Scripture Reflection

Reflection for the Second Sunday of Advent Liturgy Planning Team #6 Sue Martin, Susie Lehuta, Susan Lindsay and Susan Lastres

The Gospel today brings us to the history of John the Baptist – the preparer of the way for Jesus. While all these powerful people listed are ruling their various kingdoms, the Word of God came to a man living in the desert. John is calling for repentance in order to be forgiven. Just so, God finds us in our own desert, and calls us a similar work. The first reading foretells of the mountains being made low. This happens when we can overcome our pride and arrogance, when we can give up the materialism that surrounds us and work on loving our neighbors. The first reading also talks of the gorges being filled to make the path easier to follow. This happens when we can work for justice and spread the love of God to all. Paul's letter to the Philippians brings to us the prayer Paul has for them (and for us): may our love increase more and more. These days of Advent hopefully bring us the time to reflect and pray for such a gift.

The Christmas Wafer

The Christmas Wafer (also known as "Oplatki") is available in the Rectory during office hours Monday through Thursday 9:00 am-8:30 pm, Friday 8:30 am-4:30 pm;



Saturday 9:00 am-5:00 pm and on Sunday between 9:00 am-1:00 pm.

The word "Bethlehem" means "the house of bread." The breaking of the bread is a sign of charity, unity and friendship. Religious family customs bring the truths of faith into the home. One of these beautiful Christmas Eve customs is the Christmas Wafer. The thin wafer bearing the Christmas characters is broken by the head of the family and distributed to each member. With a simple prayer for God's grace and the welfare of all members of the family, those present as well as those who are absent, the head of the house breaks the wafer and distributes it, one piece to each person at the table. While doing so, each member of the family is kissed and wished a joyful feast. Members then greet one another in the same way.

The spiritual lesson in this age-old custom is that the unity of the family is grounded in God's love for us. May you experience unity and love through this simple celebration.



passages, reflections by Bishop Ken Untener, prayers, action steps, quotes from the Saints, and a variety of other thoughts about Advent, Christmas, feast days, and Catholic traditions and customs.

Want peace and joy during the Advent Season? Come join us for Eucharistic Adoration! December 20, 2018 at 6:00-7:00pm

WHAT: During Adoration, sometimes referred to as a Holy Hour (but can be of any duration), the Blessed Sacrament is exposed on the altar for individual, silent Adoration. As Catholics, we proclaim the Real Presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament, not only during the Mass but in the preserved Hosts. St. John Paul II offered that "our communal worship at Mass must go together with our personal worship of Jesus in Eucharistic adoration in order that our love may be complete."

HOW: Adorers are invited to pray a rosary or other devotions, meditate on Scripture or meditate on devotional books. Adorers may also choose to just simply sit and 'be' with Jesus. If you are interested, prayer and reflection suggestions are available as starting points.

WHO: Jesus waits for us, each of us, in the Eucharist. He waits when we are joyful, thankful, frustrated, or tired. All are welcome, including children. **Families are most welcome.** Jesus specifically calls children to Himself, "Let the children come to me." Especially during this Advent Season, children can focus on the true celebration of the season: the coming of the Infant Jesus and His continued presence. Children's activities, books, and meditations on the rosary, adoration, sacraments are available for even our youngest adorers.

WHY: As we prepare to celebrate Jesus' birth, it's important to remember, He is still present with us in the Eucharist. As St. Teresa of Calcutta reminds us: The Holy Eucharist is the continuation of Christ's incarnation on earth. The mystery of the Eucharist gives us the joy of having Christmas every day. When we come to the Blessed Sacrament we come to Bethlehem, a name which means "house of bread." Jesus chose to be born in Bethlehem because He would dwell with us forever as the "Living Bread" come down from heaven. When the shepherds and Magi came to adore Him, they brought Him so much joy with their humble visit to Bethlehem that their visit has been praised and retold down through the centuries. [Y]our humble visit to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament brings Him so much joy that it will be retold for all eternity and bring the world closer to His promise of peace on earth.

WHEN: The next opportunity for Eucharistic Adoration will be **December 20, 2018.** The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed from 6:00-7:00 pm. 


Parish Counselor
