

Pastor's Notes

"Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing. In all circumstances give thanks." 1Thessalonians 5:16-18

Mary and Joseph faced many challenges in the months that led to the birth of Jesus. Mary responded wholeheartedly to the invitation of the angel Gabriel; Joseph needed some time to hear the angel's confirmation in a dream. Mary spent the first three months of her pregnancy with her cousin Elizabeth. Returning to Nazareth, she and Joseph quickly completed the marriage rituals and left for Bethlehem - a difficult journey for a pregnant woman. They arrived in Bethlehem with limited resources and no family or friends. The kindness of a stranger provided shelter in a cave with his livestock. There, Mary gave birth with Joseph as the only family to comfort her. They established a home in Bethlehem but were forced to flee to Egypt to escape King Herod. They were refugees in a land in which they neither spoke the language nor were familiar with the food or customs. Only after some time had passed were they able to return to Nazareth and establish a home among family and friends.

Through all of this, scriptures tell us that Mary and Joseph remained close to God and continued to *pray without ceasing*. Joseph communicated with God even in his dreams; Mary treasured in her heart all that was occurring. They continued to *give thanks to God in all circumstances*, even the most challenging. Mary's song of praise, the *Magnificat*, proclaims the loving hand of God in what she is experiencing. Joseph brings the infant Jesus into his heart and home as God's gift. Through prayer and thanksgiving, Mary and Joseph came to *rejoice always* for the blessings and presence of God amid the struggles and successes of their early family life.

The third Sunday of Advent reminds us that our time of preparation is, above all, a time of rejoicing. To reach this joy, we are challenged to make time to connect with God in prayer and to recall all in our life for which to be grateful. We are invited to give ourselves some moments, alone or with others, to step away from all the chores of the season and dwell with the God who chooses to dwell among and within us. We are sent as messengers of joy to others, especially those weighed down by sorrow, loneliness, or want in any form. This is not an empty joy that ignores the struggles of others. This is the joy of Joseph and Mary; the awareness of God in our midst; journeying with all of us; offering in each moment the gifts that we most need.

I give thanks for the blessings of your generosity through the Giving Tree, our Food Pantry, and the cookies and toys given to others; for your support for our mission as a parish at Christmas and throughout the year; and for your vibrant faith and hospitality to all who enter our doors. God has blessed us. As we come together for prayer in these days, may we give thanks to God in all circumstances, and rejoice in the presence of God among us.

In the gospel, John tells us, "There is one among you whom you do not recognize." This is a startling revelation. He is already here. He was already there and he is here now. He will never leave us. We are everyday in the presence of God. He is also referred to as the light, here to banish the darkness of fear, hatred and greed. He is here to help us spread compassion, love and peace in the world. God gives himself to us so that we can give ourselves to others. He is counting on us to carry and spread his message. We are his eyes, ears and hands on this earth. What can we do as we prepare for Jesus' birth to welcome Him into our homes and our hearts? How can we individually do one thing this week to share His care for those with whom we come into contact with at home, work or school? In the first and second readings, through Isaiah and Paul's urgings we hear of glad tidings, healing and freedom. The feelings they stir in us are joyous because it is Gaudete Sunday and we are filled with intense anticipation. The candle on the Advent wreath is a bright color. We are reminded to pray and give thanks but we are to temper our actions with good judgment, keeping close what is worthy and rejecting what is evil. Justice and praise will soon appear.

Special Circumstances For Receiving The Eucharist

The Catholic Church has historically recognized the intimate relationship of wheat hosts and wine as matter for the Eucharist. However, if you have Celiac Sprue Disease or a family member suffers from a gluten intolerance or if you are alcohol intolerant, receiving the Eucharist is life-involving in seriously challenging ways. The logistics or manner of accommodating lay persons with gluten or wine intolerance in a parish setting during the Liturgy of the Eucharist is left to the afflicated party and the pastor to decide the best way during Mass for the afflicted party to safely receive the Precious Body or the Precious Blood.



SAFE AND SOBER HOLIDAYS

Did you know that 10-13% of all the people in any community live with the disease of alcoholism or other chemical dependence? This includes 10-13% of our parish community. Each person who lives with a chemically dependent person also has a disease that negatively affects the lives of at least four other persons. 40% of the members of any community, including ours, know someone, or are concerned about someone, or are angry at someone who lives with this progressive and potentially fatal disease.

If you care about someone who has a drinking or other drug problem, I encourage you to get help <u>for</u> <u>yourself</u>. Go to ALANON if you are affected by someone's chemical dependency. Go to FAMILIES ANONYMOUS if you are the relative or friend of a young person with drug or behavioral problems.

Go to ADULT CHILDREN OF ALCOHOLICS if you are the adult son or daughter of someone with an alcohol or other drug problem. Get help for yourself before you attempt to intervene in the life of someone who is addicted. This is the best gift you can give to someone who is dependent on alcohol or another drug.

Here are some healthy guidelines for holiday drinking and entertaining.



HOLIDAY ENTERTAINING GUIDELINES Never tell a guest, "Aw, c'mon. One drink won't hurt you. It's Christmas!" The calendar has <u>no</u> effect on the effects of alcohol.

Don't serve more than one drink per hour to any guest. Minimize the time before serving food.

Don't poison your guests.

Don't give a guest who "doesn't drink" a hard time. Don't argue when someone says, "No thanks."

Provide non-alcoholic refreshments and let your guests choose.

Hot coffee or cold towels only make a person who is drunk more awake. If a guest is drunk, do not let him or her drive home. Get them a ride or cab or let them sleep it off.

Drunk drivers can kill people.

HOLIDAY DRINKING GUIDELINES Drink <u>only</u> if you can. If you have been told

not to drink, or if you take medication that does not mix with alcohol, don't drink.

Just one drink can hurt you.

- Don't drink more than one drink per hour. If you can drink more than this without feeling any effect, you have a symptom of the disease of alcoholism.
- A high tolerance for alcohol is a sign of disease <u>not</u> a good thing.
- Don't drink if you "don't drink." Don't take a beverage to avoid hurting your host or hostess.

Not drinking is okay.

Alcohol mixes better with the gasoline in a car than with the driver. If you plan on having a "really good time?" then plan on not driving.

Children's Liturgy of the Word

The Word of the Lord has a message for children as well as adults. Children's Liturgy of the Word offers the children an experience to hear the scripture in words that they can understand. Here at St. Francis we are fortunate and proud to have adult volunteers and Presiders of Liturgy who journey with our children so that they can experience the Word of the Lord with a message that is relevant and fitting for them.

Our Saturday evening 5:00 pm. Mass offers the opportunity for children in Grades Kindergarten—Fourth to experience hearing and reflecting on the Word of the Lord in a way that is an empowering experience. Children in these grades are invited to follow their Reflectors of the Word to a prayer space away from the gathered assembly to hear the Scriptures in words they can understand.

Children's Liturgy of the Word "kicked off" the school year on Saturday, October 14. Allen Sterwalt, our Director of Music, along with our Cherub Choir and SF Choristers (Children in Grades 1-8) led us in prayer with music. Children's Liturgy of the Word takes place in church whenever the children's choirs lead us in song/prayer. The Scriptures we hear will then be taken from the Children's Lectionary and the homily will be given in a way that children are able to relate to a little more readily. The children in Grades K thru 4 will go to their prayer space on the Saturdays that the choirs are not singing.

The Christmas Wafer

The Christmas Wafer (also known as "Oplatki") is available in the Rectory during office hours Monday through




Friday 9:00 am until 8:30 pm, Saturday from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm and on Sunday between 9:00 am to 2:00 pm.

The word "Bethlehem" means "the house of bread." The breaking of the bread is a sign of charity, unity and friendship. Religious family customs bring the truths of faith into the home. One of these beautiful Christmas Eve customs is the Christmas Wafer. The thin wafer bearing the Christmas characters is broken by the head of the family and distributed to each member. With a simple prayer for God's grace and the welfare of all members of the family, those present as well as those who are absent, the head of the house breaks the wafer and distributes it, one piece to each person at the table. While doing so, each member of the family is kissed and wished a joyful feast. Members then greet one another in the same way.

The spiritual lesson in this age-old custom is that the unity of the family is grounded in God's love for us. May you experience unity and love through this simple celebration.




