

Scripture Reflection

The impulse of the first parable is to pull the weeds. The impulse during our whole Christian living is to be impatient with ourselves as we grow in our discipleship, meeting challenges and temptations along the way. Part of living the paschal mystery is to be patient with ourselves, especially when we have failed. The mercy, forgiveness, leniency, justice, and patience of God encourages repentance. Even our mistakes are ways that we have "ears...to hear" and learn better the ways of God. God's final judgment comes at the faithfulness and have borne fruit. As we grow into being God's kingdom, as we learn better to live our birthright, as we grasp more fully what God's will is for us in our daily living and respond faithfully, we become more like the firstborn Son, more like worthy citizens of the "kingdom of heaven."




On Thursday, July 27 there will be NO masses. Both times of 7:45 and 9:00 am will be Word & Communion Services. Thank you for your understanding.

UNITY HALL AND FUNERAL VISITATIONS

These early months of experimenting with Unity Hall are a time of learning the creative possibilities and the limits of our new space. Our intention has been to move visitations being held before the Funeral Mass from the church into Unity Hall, when the family prefers to begin the day at the parish rather than at the Funeral Home. This can occur whenever the church is not in use for another service.

However, we need further discussion of the requirements and scheduling challenges of making Unity Hall available for visitations on the day <u>before</u> the Funeral Mass. Our parish plant is a busy place during most of the year; and our day school and religious education programs require space in our parking lots throughout the school year. We believe that an afternoon and evening visitation requires accommodations that a Funeral Home is better equipped to provide for the family and guests on a consistent basis. We have decided that the parish cannot accommodate visitations on the day before the Funeral Mass before we have given this more consideration. I ask your patience and understanding as we continue to consider how Unity Hall can best support our mission and ministries.

#MaybeHeDoesntHitYou. Highlights the Reality of Emotional Abuse at www.usnews.com.

Abuse is not always just physical. Women took to twitter to share their experiences with emotional abuse. Abuse in a relationship isn't always physical. Powerfully underscoring that fact, writer and artist Zahira Kelly posted a string of tweets on May 1 detailing emotional abuse using the hashtag #MaybeHeDoesntHitYou. Her words sparked a Twitter campaign in which women shared apparent experiences of emotional abuse at the hands of a partner:

#MaybeHeDoesntHitYou but he compares you to other women, criticizes your body and constantly tells you, you aren't doing enough for him.

#MaybeHeDoesntHitYou but he manipulates you and threatens to commit suicide if you leave him.

#MaybeHeDoesntHitYou but you're embarrassed to tell ur friends what he's said to u because u know they'll ask "why are you still with him?"

#MaybeHeDoesntHityou but he tries to control who you talk to, where you go, what friends you can have, and acts like it's out of love.

Domestic violence and abuse encompasses not only physical violence, but emotional and psychological abuse as well. Kelly told BBC, "abuse is often seen as very cut and dry, and only physical. For several years now on social media, on a daily basis, I talk about many different forms of abuse and what they look like," she said.


