

Pastor's Letter

Called to Tell the Story

St. Francis Xavier is a blessed and gifted faith community that comes to life through our investment of time, talent, and treasure. The parish year that ended on June 30, 2023, was a year of renewed commitment and increased participation. More of you began to feel that it was safe enough to return to weekend Masses. You were joined by a growing number of young families, whose children provide a joyful “toddler chorus” at our Sunday morning Masses. The results of an Archdiocesan survey in the spring affirmed that St. Francis Xavier is a place of welcome, vibrant liturgy, and active outreach to those in need.



Your *stewardship of treasure* made this possible. The following report is one way we remain accountable to all who invest in our parish mission. We highlight some of the ways we practiced the good stewardship of time, talent, and treasure and present some basic statistics and the financial facts and figures at year end. Your *ongoing stewardship of treasure* is crucial to our continued vitality.

This past year, we continued to come into a fuller embodiment of our mission. Name Tag Sundays and “welcome evenings” helped us to better know one another and introduce new families to the parish. The parish gardens began to be restored through the leadership of a descendent of the woman who initiated a garden ministry over thirty years ago. Three open meetings led a discussion of the importance of women holding leadership roles in the Church, including a possible reopening of the ordained diaconate to women. We formed a parish Evangelization Team that has begun to encourage and implement ways in which we can engage in greater outreach to others, sharing our stories and personal experiences of Jesus. We expanded our administrative staff by shifting Jennifer Zeisloft into the position of Director of Stewardship and Development and hiring Peter Brown as our Director of Operations. In short, we established a solid foundation for the Holy Spirit to inspire our further growth and outreach with your support and involvement.

I ask each household to consider prayerfully the financial gift you can offer to fund our mission and ministries *this year*. The “Giving Treasure FAQ” page of this report provides a variety of ways to do so. Consider the value of our parish mission to your household and this community. If you have not yet begun to invest in our mission, please join those of us who do. If you invested in our mission this past year, **thank you!** If you donated electronically or via special gifts, you also helped us to anticipate our income.

Thank you for setting aside time to review the Annual Report. I thank our Director of Stewardship and Development, Jennifer Zeisloft, our Accountant, Jane Bandyk, and the parishioners who serve on our parish Finance Council for their dedication and counsel this past year. A letter from the parish Finance Council offers their perspective on our current financial situation. We are blessed to have such wise stewards of our resources.

God bless you all. Your faithful stewardship of Saint Francis Xavier continues to make us a vibrant community of faith in which *all are welcome* to come to know and serve the Lord Jesus. May we continue to **tell the story** and live our mission in Christ.

Finance Council Letter

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

In our previous annual report, we emphasized the significance of taking a "clear and deliberate look at our financial future as a faith community." We successfully realigned our resources to further develop our stewardship of treasure. The results of this initiative prompted our recommendation and Father Bill's decision to invest in separating the roles of development and financial/operational management, ensuring the long-term stewardship of our parish.

While we have made significant progress, it is crucial to acknowledge the financial challenges we currently face. An operating deficit of \$101,562, combined with the \$700,000 roof/window project, significantly depleted our savings. Government funding helped us achieve an operating surplus during the 2021-2022 fiscal year, providing relief from the impact of COVID-19. Unfortunately, this funding has now ended. Additionally, inflation rates of 5% in recent years have significantly outpaced our rate of offertory increases. **The Finance Council's primary focus is achieving financial balance in our operations, where revenues match expenses.** Without this balance, we may have to curtail ministries to align our future budgets.

There are several encouraging factors contributing to our financial health:

- Weekend mass attendance and school enrollment is on the rise.
- The number of new families registering at our parish is the highest it has been in years.
- We've made strategic investments in our staff, hiring Deacon Peter Brown as the Director of Operations.
- We've created a Development Director role, with Jennifer Zeisloft transitioning into this position.

We humbly request our fellow parishioners who currently contribute to consider a 5% increase in your offertory gift for the fiscal year 2024. Our budget was approved with an operating deficit of approximately \$90,000, after accounting for a 5% offertory increase. For those who are not regular contributors, we invite you to prayerfully consider supporting the parish financially on an annual basis. Out of our 3,300 registered parishioners, only about 40% donated monetarily at some point during the past fiscal year. **Various methods of giving can be found on the final page of this report.**

We are immensely grateful for your trust in our stewardship of the financial resources of St. Francis Xavier Parish. Our parish is blessed with an exceptional staff and volunteer base whose deepest desire is to act as missionary disciples of Christ. Let us collectively support them in their mission.

Devoting Time in Prayer

"Hail, Mary, full of grace..." A tradition stretching back at least 500 years. St. John Paul II called it his favorite prayer. The rosary is prayed by many SFX parishioners as they devote time to God. For example, every Thursday, parishioners come together on Thursday mornings at 8:15am in the church or by the Mary Garden (weather permitting). Some bring special intentions. Others give an update on a special intention they may have shared previously. And then they pray the rosary. Newcomers are welcomed, settling in to learn anew what they may have observed their parents or grandparents pray often. Says Keli Dudek, "This group is my favorite at St. Francis. With all the stresses – from our kids at home to the wide-world – praying the rosary brings me faith, peace, and the confidence that Mary's hand is in the world."



The elementary school and SFX parishioners gather each October in the parking lot, praying the Living Rosary. As Katie Filbin shares, "I'm always amazed at how moving it is to hear our entire student body, along with fellow parishioners, pray the rosary together. It was a gorgeous fall morning and I have no doubt that everyone felt the presence of our Blessed Mother."

Sharing Talent

Our parish is blessed with many strong volunteer leaders. In Fall 2022, Katie Mulcahy approached Mary Freeman, our Outreach Coordinator, and Maggie McMahon, our Pastoral Associate, to promote dialogue on the restoration of the female diaconate. "Re-thinking the Participation of Women in the Church" was one of the major topics about which Pope Francis invited dialogue in light of the Synod on Synodality (taking place as of this publication date!). With women in the lead roles, SFX Parish hosted three listening sessions to gather input from parishioners ranging from ages 15 to 88. The Spirit electrified the room!



St. Francis Xavier Parish was a key leader in this Discerning Deacon archdiocesan-wide initiative. We experienced some of the fruits of these listening sessions in September at Mass when five women shared their reflections of the Sunday Scriptures. **Very few parishes offer an opportunity for men and women to reflect on Scripture during the homily.** We are indeed blessed to have such faith-filled volunteers who share their talents with us all! Stay tuned for updates on this topic throughout the year in our bulletin.

Giving Treasure



Historically the practiced model of "church" for American Catholics was one of first believing the same things and **then** belonging to one another. Presently inspired by Renew My Church, St. Francis is responding to the needs of our contemporary society by flipping the historical model upside down...first: you belong. You belong to God, you belong to Love, and we belong to *each other*. This belonging, this deep sense of community and welcome, then brings us to believe and behave as a community.

Those who already feel this sense of belonging are called to act as instruments of Jesus' love by witnessing their faith and inviting others to do the same.

To facilitate both the experience of belonging and the ministry of witness and invitation, the parish staff and Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) placed an emphasis on hospitality last year. Hospitality moments which took place last year (Nametag Sundays, the Yule Flip, after-Mass socials) were building blocks which strengthened, and continue to strengthen, our community. Those who might have been tentative entering into these moments met others who welcomed them. Your donations provide opportunities for our community to get to know each other and support each other as disciples, so taking the next step as witnesses in faith is that much easier.






**2022-2023 Revenue and Support
Church and School of Religious Education**




**2022-2023 Expenses

Finance Report

During budget preparation, the Finance Council, Director of Operations, and Principal strive to present the Pastor with a budget for approval whereby income equals expenses. For the 2023-2024 budget, the Finance Council recommended a 5% offertory increase and the use of \$89,833 in parish savings to cover the budget deficit.

Note 1: A masonry tuckpointing project was completed in July 2023, costing approximately \$50,000.

Note 2: The Education Building Roof and Window project was completed in September 2023.

Note 3: The Educational Endowment Fund charter has been amended to benefit the operating and capital expenses of the elementary school only. An estimation of \$100,000 originally intended for all parish educational purposes was reallocated from the Educational Endowment Fund to the Parish Endowment Fund for use in covering operating and capital expenses of all parish education endeavors.

Note 4: In October 2023, restricted funds on deposit fell to about \$1.4 million when liabilities for the window/roof and masonry projects were paid out.

*As of June 30, 2023, the Food Pantry maintained reserves of \$166,264, which are not included in our **net** cash position because they will be used for food pantry purposes only.

Giving Treasure - Frequently Asked Questions

Considering which method of giving is right for you? Curious about ways in which St. Francis parishioners give? Check out the FAQ below.

What method of giving is most cost-effective for the parish?

Online donations from your bank checking or savings account. The processing fees for these are about 0.5%, as compared to credit card fees of 3.5%. For example, an annual donation of \$1,000 via bank account provides support of \$995, compared to \$965 from credit card. We are happy to report that the largest percentage of last year's Sunday offertory funds (32%) came from this method of giving. To give in this method, scan the QR code below or [Click Here](#).

If I want to give using my credit card, can I cover the higher transaction fee?

Yes – now you can! This is new to Give Central, our online giving processor. Log into your Give Central account and select “I would like to cover the processing fee” when you make or change your contribution. Currently, about 22% of our annual Sunday offertory is received from this method. To give in this method, scan the QR code below or [Click Here](#).

Can I continue using my offertory envelopes?

Absolutely. We continue to receive 30% of our Sunday offertory in this way. We are looking at ways to reduce the cost of printing and mailing, and there may be future changes to the number of envelopes and frequency of mailing.

How important is my Christmas or Easter donation?

Very important! As the pie charts on the Revenue and Support page demonstrate, these two special donations totaled 10% (\$215,000) of our funding last year. While all parishioners receive the envelopes with Fr. Bill's Christmas and Easter reflections, you can alternatively set up online giving right now using the QR code below or [Clicking Here](#).

Are there any other methods to give to offertory?
