

Pastor's Letter

"I am establishing my covenant with you and your descendants after you and with every living creature." Genesis 9:9-10



We enter Lent with a reminder of God's ancient covenant with humankind and with all creation. God desires to be in communion with us and for us to be in communion with one another. The redesign of seating areas within worship spaces such as our own is intended to make clear that the Mass is not a private prayer experience, but rather a communal one. We are meant to be aware of the sights and sounds of those around us, and even know their names to the extent possible. We come to the Eucharistic table to be drawn into deeper communion with Christ and one another. We, not I, become the Body of Christ sent to carry the gospel to the world.

We have been using the term *missionary disciple* in recent months. The renewal that Cardinal Cupich has called for is one that teaches and forms us in our *missionary purpose and identity*. Our communion with Christ is more

than a connection between us and Christ. *Christ sends us out on mission* to bring hope and healing to all those in need and to our world. No matter how well we worship or how much we care for one another within the community, the chief sign of our vitality is *the extent to which we reach out* to care for and bring hope to those in need.

Five areas of growth define the journey of a missionary disciple and are arranged in a circle, or wheel. No one has achieved full growth in any one of these areas. We have areas in which we are stronger and areas that we have not developed as much. And there is *no set order or progression* in how a given person moves through these five areas to deepen their identity as a missionary disciple. The five areas on missionary discipleship wheel are:

COMMUNITY FAITH FORMATION MINISTRY WITNESS WORSHIP


I have listed them alphabetically to emphasize that *there is no priority or order of progression* among these five areas of growth. *We begin where we are* and discern where in the wheel the Spirit may be inviting us to grow. On each of the five Sundays of Lent, I hope to focus on one of these five areas in which the missionary disciple moves.

COMMUNITY. A missionary disciple chooses to become *connected with and related to other members* of the faith community. This goes *beyond the time spent at Mass*; it reaches into social activities, casual encounters, and coming to know one another by name. We nurture a sense of belonging when we seek ways to connect with others and to help others to make connections with one another. A "hospitality time" in which we form "circles" with those we know, leaving few entry points for those who are new or who are less adept at making connections is not hospitable. A missionary disciple is always looking for ways to help people connect with one another and to draw in the person on the edges. It involves skills that come more naturally to the extroverts among us; to an extent, we rely on their willingness to use their gifts to draw us into relationships with one another. These are the men, women, and youth whose way of being gives witness that we are a welcoming community in which all are invited to belong. Nonetheless, we <u>all</u> are called to keep an eye out for the person "on the fringe" and encourage their sense of belonging.

How might the Spirit be leading you to deepen your relationship to Christ as Christ lives among the members of our parish community? How might the Spirit be inviting you to do something that might increase a sense of belonging for a family member, friend, the person who sits near you on weekends or the one whom you often see in the parking lot or at the store? How are you being invited to deepen a sense of community in our shared mission?

Your Gift, God's Hands Offertory Report

This month, we recall our gratitude for our bereavement and funeral ministry. Since the New Year our parish gave comfort to the families and friends of seven of our faithful, now born to eternal life. Maureen Pipal, a member of our parish staff, shares how the parish supports loved ones at this difficult time.

"One of my responsibilities as the pastor's assistant is to help families and funeral homes with scheduling their loved one's funeral. We do as many as 70 funerals a year at SFX, and sometimes 3 or 4 of them fall within the same week. Visitations can also be held prior to the funeral service in church or Unity Hall. Until the time of the funeral itself, and before the families can meet with the priest, I am often in contact with them to answer any questions they may have or guide them through the process. It is often pointed out to me by the grieving families that this must be a difficult part of my job. Quite the opposite. It is a blessing to be able to be supportive in any way and is much more a ministry than a job."

St. Francis also has wonderful volunteer funeral sacristans and bereavement ministers who assist the priests/families during the visitations and funerals. New volunteers to the sacristan and bereavement ministries are always welcome.

God bless you for your generosity in supporting our bereavement and funeral ministries!



Note 1: The budget was approved based on a 5% offertory increase over last year and the use of about \$90,000 in parish savings to cover the budget deficit. Through January, our offertory is running in alignment with the budgeted 5% increase, and we continue to project a \$90,000 deficit.






