Pastor's Letter

*Jesus came and touched them, saying, "Rise, and do not be afraid."
Matthew 17:7*

Peter, James, and John were overwhelmed after seeing Moses and Elijah conversing with Jesus and hearing God's voice declaring Jesus as God's beloved Son. They were terrified and set their faces to the ground. Jesus calls them to rise and let go of their fear. Like Abraham, Moses, and Elijah, they are to journey where God will lead them, trusting in God's loving presence. He will begin to speak of the journey to Jerusalem and the suffering and death that awaits him before God will raise him from the dead. He offers them this moment of glory to strengthen them for the journey. They will fall to the ground and abandon Jesus in his greatest hour of need. *But he will again lift them up and send them out on mission; he will again tell them that they need not fear.*

Are we afraid to meet Jesus face to face? If we get a passing sense of God's presence in private prayer or in some experience, how do we respond? Do we accept that our worthiness as disciples comes, not from our own efforts, but from a loving God who invites and sends us on mission to bring the message of God's love to others? Will we allow Jesus to raise us up from whatever may put our faces in the dirt and walk with him the journey that will involve suffering and death, but that will end in resurrection? These are the questions of the Second Week of Lent.

Three parish funerals give witness to the breadth of loving support of this parish family. **Last Monday**, we celebrated a Funeral Mass for **Irene O'Connor**, a survivor of childhood polio. Irene is the last of three siblings, including Fr. Jim O'Connor and Eleanor O'Connor. She was a dedicated servant to those with physical disabilities in the days when church facilities were inaccessible to so many. She also used her talents as a bank executive to volunteer as the parish accountant after her retirement. **Last Thursday**, we celebrated a Funeral Mass for **Laura McGhee**, who has been the art teacher at St. Francis Xavier Elementary School for many years. We will miss her talent and her wit and will remember her for the annual eighth grade art project. This **Wednesday**, we will celebrate a Funeral Mass for **Severin Paul Roth**, known to most of us as Paul and who regularly joined us for Sunday Mass. Paul was homeless and preferred to live in the local forest preserves. As he walked our streets, his friendly face became familiar to many in our area. Paul died of unknown causes last fall, and his cremated remains were released only recently. We will celebrate his life on what would have been **his 68th birthday**.

If you have not yet completed the **Disciple Missionary Index**, I encourage you to follow the link in this bulletin or on our website. If you prefer a paper survey, they are available at all church doors. The Archdiocese hopes to use the information gained from this process in future discernment of which priest's interests and talents will best serve each faith community.

Let us pray for one another. Memo pads remain in Unity Hall and at the church doors on which you can write a prayer intention for this Lent. Place the slip in one of the three glass bowls in front of the altar. The bowls are a request and a reminder for us to *keep one another in prayer this Lent*, especially the intentions that others have placed in the bowls. May our prayers for one another draw us deeper into communion in Christ.

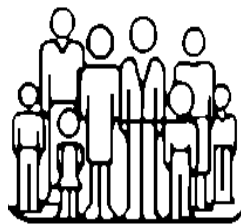

Today we are asked to put our faith and trust in God. In the first reading, Abram is asked to leave his own home and go out into the unknown. He walks out in faith as the Lord directs him to do. God invites us too to walk in faith, to face whatever might come our way with the knowledge that he is with us on the journey.

The gospel appeals to our senses of sight and sound. High on a mountain the apostles see Jesus transformed, his outward form changes before their own eyes. Then they hear the voice of God proclaiming his pride and deep love for his son. Do we recognize Jesus when we encounter him? Are we receptive to his voice in our inner being? The purpose of the School Advisory Board is to:

- Provide counsel and advise on the operation of the School

The St. Francis Xavier School Advisory Board is accepting applications for a three-year term on the Board. Wonder what it takes or how the process works? Below are some common questions people have about becoming a board member.

Common Questions:

Do you need to have experience on a board or have a career in education? NO, you do not need to have prior experience on a school board or experience in education to apply.

How much time is this commitment? We meet once per month plus 1-2 supplementary meetings each month. Expect approximately 6-8 hours per month.

Do you need to have a child at the school to apply? NO, we encourage parent (guardian) of a Religious Education student, young adult parishioners and alumna/us of SFX. Candidates need not be parents.

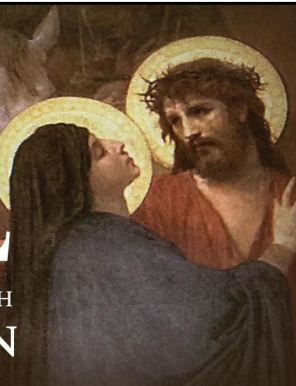
How does the application/selection process work? There is a one page application, a face-to-face meeting with the members of the Board and then the Board votes on the slate of applicants.

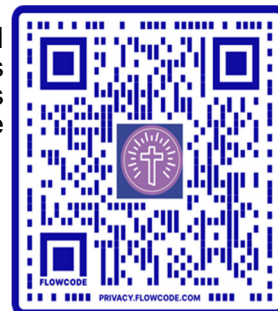
Lenten Word & Communion Service

Women's Leadership in the Catholic Church



Pope Francis has asked all Catholics around the world to engage in prayerful conversations about the movements of the Holy Spirit in the Church today resulting in a synodal document entitled "Enlarge the Space in your Tent". [Click here](#) for full document.

Female leadership in the Church and restoration of women to the diaconate has been a consistent theme globally.

"The call for a conversion of the Church's culture, for the salvation of the world, is linked in concrete terms to the possibility of establishing a new culture, with new practices and structures. A critical and urgent area in this regard concerns the role of women and their vocation, rooted in our common baptismal dignity, to participate fully in the life of the Church. A growing awareness and sensitivity towards this issue is registered all over the world." (paragraph 60)

Earlier this year, more than 60 parishioners and community members participated in 3 listening sessions to reflect on paragraphs 60-65 of the document that focused on **Re-thinking Women's Participation in the Church**. Participants were asked to provide feedback on areas of resonance and tension within the text as well as opportunities for action through the synod. The fruits of the listening sessions were sent to the Archdiocese of Chicago and will be included in the next phase of the synod.

Overall, there was a general agreement that women are the backbone of the Church. They are Called to serve the Church in areas of governance, preaching and service so that ALL feel welcomed. The need for the Gifts of the Holy Spirit bestowed upon women is **critical** and **urgent**. So much good can come from this **right now**. As a Church, we need these gifts, not out of necessity, but because they can lead to a more inclusive, loving and transformative Church that can bring Catholics back to the Eucharist and inspire the next generation.

What themes emerged?

- This is a time for conversion in the Church, conversion is for all of us, led by God and the Holy Spirit.
- Women have a fundamental equality and dignity from our Baptismal promise.
- Women bring intuition and a different perspective, and need to have a seat at the table in all areas of governance and decision-making.
- Women are bringing children and families to Mass, teaching religious education, preparing others for the Sacraments and taking care of those on the margins.
- Gratitude and recognition that women religious use synodal practices in all that they do. They are visionaries and they do not exclude anyone from their tables. The hierarchy of the Church should follow their lead.
- Women would bring a new perspective, relatability and deep vulnerability to their preaching. It could lead to women in the community saying: "They get me." "I belong!"
- Recognition that church salaries constitute cheap labor (women religious, women in ministry, including education) many of which are poverty level incomes.
- The pandemic was a global event that caused a change in attitudes and ways of doing things, including church practices. We must seize this opportunity for cultural changes that are long overdue. The timing is NOW!
