Pastor's Letter

"You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses to the ends of the earth."

Acts 1:8

Be my witnesses. Before returning to heaven, Jesus gave his followers a commission to go out to all the world and tell the good news of God's love and our salvation in Christ Jesus. Jesus assured them that the Holy Spirit will soon fill them with the gifts they need to fulfill their mission. Yet Jesus is not only speaking to the eleven apostles, or to the bishops who will become their successors. Jesus commissions every person baptized into his death and resurrection to become missionary disciples. The gospel and the gifts of the Spirit are given to us for so much more than our own good; nor are they meant to be celebrated only when we gather in our places of worship. As Deacon Andy reminds us at the end of Mass, "Our mission begins" when we go out, nourished by Word and Eucharist, to bring Jesus into our homes, our communities, and wherever we meet others seeking to learn or hoping to find what we have received.

The final days of the Easter Season urge us to pray to receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit anew. We carry a message of hope that is contrary to much of what this world values and promotes. **We seek God's direction,** which comes to us through many diverse voices and in our *willingness to listen to one another* until the voice of God among us becomes clear. This is the Spirit that lives at *the heart of synodality*, as Pope Francis calls *all* voices in the Church to *come together and listen to one another* with open minds and hearts; to discern God's voice through the many voices. We are a diverse people. Some might try to convince us that human persons are beyond the possibility of consensus or finding common ground. Yet **we believe that we <u>all</u> become <u>one</u> Body in Christ**; we come together to be Christ in and for the world.

Our mission as disciples of Christ is especially critical when some with opposing views, on one side or the other, try to convince us that <u>only one</u> view can be the "correct" one and that we should defend <u>one</u> point of view to the exclusion of all others. **We believe** that each person is loved by God and has an important role among us. **We act** to uphold the dignity of each person, especially those who are judged, mistreated, or disregarded. This witness of the early Christian communities literally <u>attracted thousands</u> of diverse people from across the Mediterranean basin within a relatively short period of time. **This is the mission on which Jesus sends us** and for which the Spirit gives us the gifts we need.

This weekend the Spirit Choir and coordinators of the Sunday 5:00 PM Mass during the school year begin a well-deserved summer break. Thank you to Jeremy Michor, Ann Maney, and the members of the Spirit Choir for leading us through another year of joyful song unto the Lord. Thank you to Katie McCarthy, who serves as sacristan and who trains and coordinates our teen lectors, ministers of communion, and ushers during the school year. Your generous service to our youth and our worship community is deeply appreciated. There is no 5:00 PM Mass this Sunday due to Mother's Day. The Sunday 5:00 PM Mass resumes next week and will continue throughout the summer except for three weekends: Memorial Day, Father's Day, and Labor Day. The Spirit Choir will return the weekend after Labor Day.

This weekend, we celebrate the vocation of motherhood in its many expressions among us. We honor mothers who gave birth and who adopted children into their life; stepmothers; grand and great grandmothers; godmothers; teachers, mentors, and coaches; and *all* women who give life to others through their lives. We are blessed this weekend with the reflections of three women of our parish: Maureen Windmoeller, Claire Jakubisin, and Laura Cullinane. We give thanks for all the women who have been mothers in each of our lives; we ask peace of heart for mothers who have known the loss of a child; and we pray for healing for mothers who experience broken relationships due to their own limits or the limits of others. God bless you all!

PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL INVITING NEW MEMBERS TO CONSIDER

Parish Pastoral Council guidelines call for an ongoing rotation of PPC members. Several members of the current PPC are stepping down after several years of serving on the PPC. I thank Barb Kalnes, Marko Magajne, and Tony Pangan for serving in this important leadership position through the pandemic and into our initial evangelization efforts. Each will continue to serve in parish ministries.

We have begun the process of discerning parishioners to invite onto the PPC who will enhance the diversity of parish voices on the PPC going forward.

According to the guidelines, PPC members serve a two-year term and can ask to remain on the PPC for an additional one or two years. (Note: We have extended this guideline for the initial members to account for two COVID years.) After four consecutive years, a member is asked to step away from the PPC for at least five years before seeking to return. This allows us to continue to involve new voices.

If you are willing, interested, and able to be considered for a two-year term on the PPC, please submit your name to Father Bill no later than June 2. If you have any questions, please contact Father Bill or one of the parishioners whose names are listed below.

Total Collected through April Last Year: \$ 1,504,155

Total Annual Offertory Budget: \$ 1,846,000

Amazing news: Easter offertory met our budget (a 7.5% increase over last year)! And through the first ten months of our fiscal year (through April), our parish offertory has increased 5%. Your generosity has made a meaningful impact on a vibrant parish!

All three forms of stewardship were alive and present at St. Francis Xavier last weekend. The parking lot was not often empty as we hosted two First Communion Masses, high school senior Mass and pizza party, Name Tag Sunday, and coffee and donuts in Unity Hall after the morning Masses. We also celebrated the attainment of a milestone for our educational endowment fund. Our congregations welcomed back two prior pastors, Fr. Bill Stenzel and Fr. John Hoffman, to celebrate with Fr. Bill Tkachuk and Fr. Rich Milek – it was a walk down memory lane! Supporters of this endowment shared:

Ministry of Care is Planning to Expand

A Minister of Care is a person who brings the gift of the eucharist and friendship to fellow parishioners and others who are homebound, living in nursing homes, or recovering in the hospital. Our visits help those in need stay connected to the parish and our faith community.

It's a very rewarding ministry and I promise you will receive more than you'll give. The time required varies depending on the activity you choose. Perhaps a few minutes or more on a homebound visit to an hour or so conducting a Prayer and Communion Service or bringing the eucharist to those in the hospital. Those visiting the homebound schedule visits convenient for the minister and the person being visited. Nursing homes and the hospital have fixed schedules.

The Archdiocese requires new ministers to receive 12 hours of instruction prior to being commissioned. After training, you will "shadow" other ministers to learn about your chosen activity. When you are comfortable, you'll receive a quarterly schedule.
