Pastor's Note

Pilgrimage of Grace in a Jubilee Year



Earlier this month, a group of twenty pilgrims from my previous parish, St Gilbert's in Grayslake, and I, set out on what truly became a journey of a lifetime - a pilgrimage to Italy and England, in this Jubilee Year of Grace. From the very beginning at O'Hare Airport, where we boarded our British Airways flight to Rome, to the final soaring notes of Evensong at York Minster, the hand of God was upon us. Not a single passport lost, no injuries, no missed connections - in every step, we felt the protection and providence of the Lord.

Our pilgrimage started in Rome, where we settled into our lodgings and discovered, to our surprise, the delights of Roman-style meatballs and mashed potatoes. From there, we immersed ourselves in the holy treasures

of the Eternal City. We gathered at the Vatican for a General Audience with Pope Leo XIV, an unforgettable moment of joy and blessing. We prayed before the relics of the True Cross at the Church of the Holy Cross, climbed the Holy Stairs in reverence, and marveled at the majesty of the great basilicas: St John Lateran and St Mary Major.

One of the most moving days was our journey to Assisi, where we walked in the footsteps of St Francis and St Clare. We prayed at their basilicas, visited the tomb of St Carlo Acutis, just three days before his canonization, and spent time in the Basilica of St Mary of the Angels, home of the Portiuncula, where Francis's mission truly began. Back in Rome, we visited St Peter's Basilica, the Vatican Museums, and the Sistine Chapel, where Michelangelo's ceiling lifted our hearts heavenward. Later, we descended into the stillness of the Catacombs of St Sebastian, and we even encountered a joyful bride arriving in a VW Bug convertible for her wedding at the adjacent parish church - a sign of life and hope, even among the ancient tombs. Our Roman journey concluded at the Basilica of St Paul Outside the Walls, another pillar of our Catholic heritage.



From there, our pilgrimage continued in England. In London, we experienced two very different but equally inspiring styles of worship: the solemn grandeur of High Mass at the Brompton Oratory, followed immediately by an experience of joyful, charismatic worship at Holy Trinity Brompton, home of the Alpha movement. The contrast was striking - incense and chant in one, electric guitars and warmth in the other - yet both pointed to the same Lord, present in his people. Traveling north, we visited the Holy House of Our Lady of Walsingham, a place of prayer and devotion stretching back nearly a thousand years. We prayed at Sempringham Abbey, founded by St Gilbert himself in 1100, and then journeyed on to York, an ancient city that captured our hearts. There we marveled at the towering beauty of the York Minster Cathedral, strolled the crooked streets of The Shambles, and prayed at the Bar Convent, the oldest continuously functioning convent in Britain.

Our pilgrimage reached its conclusion in the soaring voices of the York Minster Choir at Evensong - a fitting end to days filled with prayer, history, and fellowship.

This Jubilee Year calls us to rediscover the path of pilgrimage - not only across oceans and centuries, but also in the daily walk of faith. Our group's journey was one of grace, blessing, and deep gratitude. We returned home with renewed hearts, strengthened bonds of friendship, and a greater sense of what it means to be God's pilgrim people.

May our parish community of St Francis Xavier also embrace this Jubilee Year as a pilgrimage of mercy and renewal, walking together in faith, hope, and joy.




Pink Ribbon Community


