

Pastor's Letter

*"Why were you looking for me?
Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?"*
Luke 2:49

I have come to appreciate today's gospel as insight into the life of the Holy Family. Jesus acts and speaks in today's gospel like most adolescents who are pursuing their vision without much thought for how their pursuit might affect others in the family. Joseph and Mary had been searching for their son for several days. They were worried about what might happen to their young son, alone in a large and unfamiliar city. When they do find him, Jesus seems to have little compassion for their concern. He presumes that they "should have known" where to find him. He wonders what *their* problem is. Like any person under the age of 26, the frontal lobes of his brain were not yet fully developed. The young Jesus is biologically not yet able to always make good decisions.

Luke tells us that Jesus returned to Nazareth with his family and was obedient to them. Whether or not this incident is a factual account, Luke is making the point that the "holy" family was not a "perfect" family. They experienced the same upsets, tensions, and range of emotions as most other families. When finalizing which books were to be included in the New Testament, the early church chose to exclude other "gospels" that presented Jesus as a "miracle child", performing miracles before he became an adult. In fact, there are no miracle stories until after Jesus had been baptized by John in the Jordan River and spent thirty days in the desert, at roughly 30 years of age.

Holiness requires neither perfection nor sinlessness. Yes, Mary was offered a special grace that gave her the inclination to always say yes to God. Yet being without sin did not keep Mary from frustration, anger, worry, or any other emotion that parents may experience. Having an emotion is not a sin; it is what we choose to do with that emotion that can lead to sin. We may easily connect with what Mary is feeling when she says, "Son, why have you done this to us?" We also can imagine that there were other moments of tension in the life of this family.

The holiness of the Holy Family of Nazareth is that they never allowed their emotions to become a reason to be unkind to one another. Mary and Joseph taught Jesus by word and example what he needed their guidance to learn. They guided him on right paths and corrected him when he began to stray from those paths. He came to know and understand love from within his home and through living in this family.

The Feast of the Holy Family comes at just the right time in the Christmas Season. The anticipation and preparations for Christmas Day have passed. People may be exhausted, and emotions may still run high. We may be spending more uninterrupted time than usual with family members. For those "returning home" for Christmas or gathering with siblings and other relatives, we may feel the tensions of being treated as someone whom we have not been since childhood. Unresolved disagreements and unforgiven hurts may lurk beneath the surface. Even in a Hallmark movie that always ends well, there are moments of tension that threaten the picture of a "perfect" family.

So, enjoy whatever time you can spend with those whom you call family. Learn from the holy family that while *no family is perfect*, all families can treat one another with love, kindness, and, when necessary, forgiveness.

A Christmas Message of Stewardship



In October, I joined the Hallow challenge about *Mere Christianity*, highlighting a series of radio talks given by C.S. Lewis during World War II. These fascinating talks, which gave a former atheist's arguments for God and how to live out Christian values in the world today, gave hope to a weary world in the 1940s. The reflections in this Hallow challenge honed the cerebral perspective of my faith. Little did I know that Hallow was just setting me up for the Advent Challenge: 25 days of reflection and prayer which led from thinking with my brain to accepting in my heart. And did these reflections bring me face to face with where I am in personal relationship with Jesus!

As I have shared with my adult children, a grade school understanding of God likely cannot stand up to our questions as we pass through the challenges of each decade of life. In these past few months, I have felt a continual battle in accepting God's design. Devoting time in daily prayer and reflection (using the Hallow app!), and then talking it over with my husband and others in the SFX community, have been instrumental in strengthening my relationship with Jesus to come to some measure of openness and acceptance of God's plan. Our Lord is born into this human experience, into communion with us. Our battles will continue. The way through is Emmanuel, in communion with each other.


