Pastor's Letter

When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled....
Acts of the Apostles 2:1

In the Jewish agricultural calendar, the Feast of Pentecost, or *Shavuot*, marked the celebration of the first harvest of the year. The life that returned to the earth with the coming of spring had begun to bear fruit. We tend to associate harvest with autumn. But in a desert climate, each harvest was significant, given the uncertainties of weather and other threats to crops. The feast brought people from all over the Jewish diaspora to Jerusalem for the celebration. Thus, it was not only a time ripe for the harvest of the earth, but a moment ripe for the first harvest of new disciples of Jesus from many lands.

On Pentecost Sunday, we hear two accounts of how the first disciples received the Holy Spirit. In John's gospel, Jesus gently breathes over the apostles on the morning of his Resurrection as he says, "Receive the Holy Spirit." The Spirit dwells in them; but they remain behind locked doors even after Jesus appears a second time to dispel the doubts of Thomas. In Luke's Acts of the Apostles, the Spirit appears in that same room fifty days later as "a strong driving wind" and "tongues of fire." They are driven from the room in which they were hiding and begin to boldly preach to peoples of the many lands of the Jewish diaspora in a language that all understand and that leads many to belief in Jesus.

How does the Spirit seek to in-spire, breathe into, you this Pentecost? Does the Spirit enter as a gentle breath to stir your heart and lead you to reach out to others in love? Or does the Spirit enter as a strong, driving wind and send you to make Jesus known to others in a language that they will understand? The Spirit comes to inspire each of us that we might bring that breath of life to others. The gifts of the Spirit are many and diverse, as St. Paul reminds us today. It is in our communion of diverse gifts that we, a communion of believers, make Jesus present for others and fulfill our mission to bring his life to the world. We come together for Word and Eucharist each week to be sent out as the Body of Christ, bringing his healing message of God's love through the breath of the Spirit blowing through us.

How does the Spirit seek to inspire our faith community in the call to deepen our efforts to bring the message of Jesus to others in word and action? What is the "new harvest" that God wants to bring to fulfillment in this community through our lives? Are we willing to be the messengers of God's love in Christ through the power of the Spirit?

This weekend, we as a nation pause to remember and give thanks for the men and women who offered their lives in defense of our values. It is appropriate that our day of remembering has its roots in the aftermath of a war in which brothers and sisters fought one another over the future of this country. There are no winners in war. Both sides suffer the loss of loved ones and the painful consequences of taking a life, regardless of how just the cause or necessary the deaths. And so, we not only remember those who sacrificed their lives in war; we pray for the healing of those who still live with the emotional and physical wounds of war. We pray for the wisdom to avoid war whenever possible through peaceful resolution of conflict, so that no one need ever die in vain.

ONGOING PROTECTION OF CHILDREN AND YOUTH

On Tuesday, the Illinois Attorney General's office released its completed report on the investigation of the Illinois Catholic dioceses' response to the child sexual abuse crisis. Once again, we mourn the grave damage done to the many people harmed by such abuse.

The Archdiocese of Chicago continues to strengthen and enforce policies and procedures to safeguard children against sexual abuse and provide pastoral support to those abused. Archdiocesan policies and procedures, first developed 30 years ago, endure and serve as a model for organizations and professionals throughout the US and the world that face their own reckonings. St. Francis Xavier Parish and Elementary School remain in full compliance with these policies and procedures.  - Advises the pastor and principal on contracts and negotiates with the assistance of Archdiocesan attorneys and facility resources.

• Implements Archdiocesan human resource policies related to hiring and termination, annual staff evaluations, and benefit administration.

3) Administration

 Manages the workforce timekeeping and payroll systems with the Parish Accountant.




