Pastor's Letter

This is an excerpt from my Pentecost Sunday homily. Find the complete text <u>here</u>.

Several years ago, the former Illinois Attorney General initiated an investigation into the policies and procedures of the six Catholic dioceses in the State of Illinois. This followed disclosures that several dioceses in another state had continued to cover up incidents of abuse. The current Attorney General recently released the results of that investigation. Although some of the statistics in the report are being disputed, the investigation affirms the ongoing efforts of the Catholic Church in Illinois to protect vulnerable populations and report, review, and respond to abuse allegations.

Nonetheless, the report again places before us a painful truth that will <u>always</u> be a tragic part of our history. In past decades, some priests abused their position of trust and caused deep harm to vulnerable individuals. Some church leaders, either not understanding the harm being done, or fearful of the consequences of open disclosure, chose not to disclose what was occurring. We cannot minimize the harm this caused to those abused and to their families. We, as a church, continue to live with the consequences of the actions and decisions of the past and have an ongoing responsibility to assist those who were abused and their families.

In 1991, Cardinal Joseph Bernardin responded quickly to the recommendations of treatment professionals. He <u>immediately</u> **published the names and removed from ministry** <u>all</u> priests against whom a previous allegation had been substantiated. He worked with professionals to establish the framework of an archdiocesan response:

- ♦ **Policies and protocols** to protect the vulnerable and report cases of alleged abuse.
- ♦ An **independent review board** to evaluate accusations and recommend action.
- ♦ An **office to assist** <u>anyone</u> who brought an allegation to the Archdiocese.
- More detailed screening of priest candidates, and background checks and training programs for priests, church employees, and volunteers with youth.

Ten years later, the US bishops met to develop procedures for <u>all</u> US dioceses, based largely on the Chicago guidelines. They continue to be reviewed, reworked, and refined.

None of what the church in Chicago has done for the past thirty years can erase the harm that was done in the past. We, the church of today, must continue to pray for those who were harmed, especially for those who struggle to find healing and peace in their lives. We who serve the Church must remain committed to teaching, implementing, and observing the policies and procedures that provide safe environments for the most vulnerable we serve. And we must never again attempt to cover over rather than openly face our faults and failures. It is impossible and damaging to deny the wrong and harm caused by the action and inaction of some church leaders and ministers. So how do we move forward as church?

Luke's story of the early church in *Acts of the Apostles* is a story of a believing community united in Jesus and witnessing through the power of the Holy Spirit. They witnessed <u>both</u> in their love for one another <u>and</u> in facing their struggles to live Christ's command of love. They did not run from or hide their failures. Rather, they saw that they were but earthen vessels, imperfectly holding the treasure of God's love in Jesus, entrusted to them.

This is how we move forward. Our identity as the church is not a result of <u>our</u> efforts or lack thereof. We are a communion in Christ, diverse and united, and alive in the Spirit. We admit the scandal that has weakened our witness and harmed so many; but we do not allow this to define us as church. We reach out in prayer and compassion to those who have been harmed. We commit to comply with the policies and procedures that keep the vulnerable among us safe. And we go out to proclaim the gift that is given to us in the church: a communion in Christ, both united and diverse, sent with the gifts of the Spirit to profess the good news of the gospel through word and action.

ONGOING PROTECTION OF CHILDREN AND YOUTH

St. Francis Xavier Parish and Elementary School remain in full compliance with these policies and procedures. Job Opening: Parish Business Manager

The Business Manager is a professional administrator who reports directly to the Pastor. This minister assists the Pastor with stewardship of the financial and personnel resources of the parish, working closely with the Facility Manager, School Principal, Accountant, other staff members and volunteer leadership in managing our parish strategically and responsibly.

1) Financial Management

- Prepares and analyzes the annual budget, balance sheet and income statements for the parish and elementary school.
- Supervises the Parish Accountant in maintaining bookkeeping functions.
- Meets with the Parish Finance Council at least five times per year. Advises and informs the Council regarding current giving trends, upcoming capital and annual projects, operating income, cash-flow analysis, and other pertinent information necessary for the Council to provide insight and assistance in the financial strategies of the Parish.
- Supports the facility manager, especially with respect to large capital expenditures and Archdiocesan contracts.
- Advises the pastor and principal on contracts and negotiates with the assistance of Archdiocesan attorneys and facility resources.

2) Personnel Management

• Implements Archdiocesan human resource policies related to hiring and termination, annual staff evaluations, and benefit administration.

3) Administration

 Manages the workforce timekeeping and payroll systems with the Parish Accountant.

Collection For Retired Priests

Next weekend, there will be a special collection for the Retired Priests. There are over 200 Retired Archdiocesan Priests. They represent 30% of all the priests serving in the Archdiocese. Normal retirement age is 70 for Chicago priests. Sixty-five priests still live in a rectory and assist the parish on a regular basis. Close to 140 retired priests celebrate Sunday Mass weekly, perform marriages and baptisms; and visit the sick in hospitals. Without these dedicated men, many parishes would not be able to offer the full range of Masses and sacraments that are currently available.

This collection is solely for the retired priests of the Archdiocese of Chicago. The retired priests of the Archdiocese receive no funds from the Religious Retirement Collection taken up in December. Those funds go for religious nuns and brothers and religious order priests.

The Archdiocese of Chicago is committed to caring for our retired priests, but we need your assistance and the generosity of every parish community.




