



Pastor's Letter

"Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." Matthew 28:19

The "Great Commission" comes with the final words of Jesus to his disciples in Matthew's gospel. Matthew wrote his gospel for a community primarily composed of Jewish followers of Jesus at a time when they were being expelled from the Jewish synagogues, even by family members. They were confused that news of the resurrection of Jesus from the dead had led to rejection and persecution rather than rejoicing and praise. Jesus promises that he will continue to be with them until the end of time; he promises that the power given to him by the Father will dwell with them through the presence of the Spirit. Yet, as Jesus prepared to ascend into heaven, the disciples gathered with him both *worshipped and doubted*.

The coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost gave them the courage and the strength to carry out their mission as disciples. They followed the command of Jesus to baptize those who chose to embrace the person and message of Jesus in the name of a Triune God. And the Triune God, in whose image humankind was created and in whose name believers are reborn, was to become the model for how the community of believers was to understand who they were and how they were to act in the world.

Our God is One; our God is Three. We proclaim this *in faith*, even as we continue to grow in understanding of this mystery. Our one God is a communion of three distinct Persons. Each Person has a specific role: the Father creates; the Son redeems; and the Holy Spirit animates all of creation with the breath of God's many graces. At the same time, we believe that these Three Persons are so in communion with one another, that all three always work in deep relation with and to one another. *This is the God in whose image we have been created* and who models for the church how we are to live and act. Through the Eucharist, Christ continues to shape and send us as One Body in Christ. The Spirit breathes distinct gifts into each of us that are intended to be shared in harmony with one another and in service to those in need.

Our mission, like that of the first disciples, is to proclaim Jesus as Lord of the living and the dead and to live his command of love for all others in all aspects and moments of our lives. We do not force baptism on others. Rather, we invite others to come to know Jesus by sharing the stories of our relationship with him. We want to share with others the joy we have found in Jesus and his message. We hope for them to make our community of faith a fuller reflection of God by coming into communion with us in Christ. The work of the *missionary disciple* carrying out the "great commission" is not done so much on street corners as it is *in the ordinary sharing of our lives in Jesus with family, friends, and strangers*.

Our parish elementary school will soon bid farewell to **Mrs. Peggy Evans**, who is retiring after maintaining the school's office records and tracking important school data for the past twenty-two years. **Thank you, Peggy**, for the support you have given to our teachers, staff, and school families. You are a treasure.

This Monday we pause to remember. Memorial Day, originally called Decoration Day, was established to honor the sacrifice of both Union <u>and</u> Confederate dead after the Civil War by placing small flags on their graves. Its meaning and observance expanded after each World War. For many it has expanded even further to honor those who sacrificed their lives in the struggle for civil liberty and justice for all. And many call to mind and heart the women and men placing themselves at risk this day to keep us safe and to defend our values. Let it is also be a day to pray for that day when peace and justice will guide <u>all</u> human relationships, and the only sacrifice necessary will be that which builds bridges and heals wounds.

PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL INVITING NEW MEMBERS TO CONSIDER

Parish Pastoral Council guidelines call for an ongoing rotation of PPC members. Several members of the current PPC are stepping down after several years of serving on the PPC. I thank Barb Kalnes, Marko Magajne, and Tony Pangan for serving in this important leadership position through the pandemic and into our initial evangelization efforts. Each will continue to serve in parish ministries.

We have begun the process of discerning parishioners to invite onto the PPC who will enhance the diversity of parish voices on the PPC going forward.

According to the guidelines, PPC members serve a two-year term and can ask to remain on the PPC for an additional one or two years. (Note: We have extended this guideline for the initial members to account for two COVID years.) After four consecutive years, a member is asked to step away from the PPC for at least five years before seeking to return. This allows us to continue to involve new voices.






Companions Journeying Together






