

Pastor's Letter

"It is as if a man were to scatter seed on the land and would sleep and rise night and day, and through it all the seed would sprout and grow, he knows not how." Mark 4:26,27

"Summer Time" is an important part of the natural cycle. Flowers bloom, grass grows, cicadas sing and plant eggs for future arrivals, and newborn cattle, sheep, and deer grow toward maturity. The warmer air tends to slow us down, and the extended daylight allows us to spend time outdoors. Some of us will be travelling; some will be taking part in summer camps and Vacation Bible School; and others will simply enjoy time on the porch or in the backyard. When we reach September, many of us will realize that we have changed during the summer months: a different outlook, a new friend, a new hobby, or a renewal of body or spirit. We probably will not notice the changes from moment to moment; yet summer will have changed us.

Jesus uses an image of hidden growth to describe the coming of the kingdom of God. The first disciples were anxious to know the when, where, and how of the arrival of the kingdom. They were frustrated that so little progress seemed to be made as Jesus travelled from town to town, preaching and healing. At the time of his death, and even for a while after his resurrection, the disciples remained unsure of whether God had accomplished anything in Jesus. So, Luke left us the *Acts of the Apostles*; stories of the early communities of believers and the surprising and miraculous occurrences in those first decades of Christianity. The destruction of Jerusalem and the persecution of Jewish disciples of Jesus *pushed believers out* to carry their message to Africa, Asia, and Europe. Persecutions and martyrdoms spurred the growth of the early communities rather than its extinction. Believers came to trust in the power and presence of the Holy Spirit to accomplish, in and through them, the seemingly impossible. In retelling their stories, they realized what God had been doing among them while they were "asleep."

How will this community of believers grow and change this summer? What will the Spirit be doing among us as we move at a slower pace with fewer meetings and activities? What will we come to realize when we reach September? New families to our community will have stopped in to "try us out", and many will have remained. We may have developed some new relationships with parishioners through block parties and strolls through the neighborhood. People and events may have caused us to move in new directions or to go deeper into our relationship with Jesus. The kingdom will have grown within and among us.

Happy Father's Day to all called to the vocation of fatherhood: fathers, stepfathers, grandfathers, great grandfathers, godfathers, mentors, teachers, and coaches. Blessings on all men who share their wisdom and hope with a younger generation and whose voices may come in our minds to guide us at key moments. Four parish men bless us this weekend with their reflections. We give thanks for the fathers and father figures in our lives. We ask for peace of heart for all fathers who have experienced the loss of a child. We pray for the healing of fathers who have experienced broken relationships due to their own limits or the limits of others.

This is my last column until late summer. The priests of the Archdiocese come together out of town this week for three days of rest and renewal; lay leaders will offer morning communion services on Tuesday through Thursday. One of my nephews gets married in early July; and I will travel to Cape Cod with a classmate again this August. What will you be doing while God is quietly at work within and among us? Allow time to enjoy the blessings of summer. Slow down, relax, enjoy time with family and friends, and be aware of the blessings in your life. And set aside some extra quiet time with God.

Weekday Masses June 17-20, 2024

Priests serving in the Archdiocese of Chicago will gather for their biennial convocation from June 17 through June 20. This gathering is an important and necessary time of spiritual renewal for the priests, so that they can better serve the People of God.

The priests have been asked to clear their schedules, so that they can fully participate in this experience. Consequently, during those four days, there might not be weekday Masses celebrated in some parishes. However, there will be prayer services to be determined by each parish. In cases of emergency, parishioners can contact parish staff who will make whatever referral is appropriate.

The people of the Archdiocese can support their priests in several ways. Their patient understanding of scheduling changes is very important. Even more important is the prayerful support they extend to priests who have prayed for them and with them. and shining examples of a holy, simple and joyful life.


