Pastor's Letter

The wisdom from above is pure, peaceable, gentle, compliant, full of mercy and good fruits. The fruit of the righteous is sown in peace for those who cultivate peace. James 3:17-18

This passage from the Letter of James offers both hope and challenge as we witness to our faith in an election year. Pope Francis recently stirred controversy when he encouraged <u>all</u> eligible American Catholics to vote in the November election. He identified a key position of each candidate that is contrary to Catholic teaching on the respect for life from conception to natural death: protection for the unborn child; and the compassionate treatment of immigrants and refugees. However, Pope Francis gave equal weight to care for the unborn and care for the immigrant as issues of respect for human life and dignity; and he <u>refused</u> to endorse either candidate. Instead, he challenged American Catholics to set aside time in the remaining weeks to pray, to listen to other viewpoints, and then, with the guidance of the Spirit, to use a well-formed *conscience* to discern which candidate best supports the dignity of human life in our country at this moment. This discernment most likely will lead Catholics to different decisions. Nonetheless, **our unity is grounded in Christ** and our willingness to be guided by the Spirit.

Wisdom from above rarely leads everyone to the same conclusion in political matters. **Wisdom is a gift of the Spirit that guides us** in how we come to a decision, even when it leads different persons to different conclusions. *Wisdom challenges us* to act with purity – separating ourselves from political rhetoric, unsubstantiated accusations, and personal attacks. *Wisdom challenges us* to pray for peace in our own hearts and with those with whom we disagree. *Wisdom challenges us* to speak to one another with gentleness in our disagreements, and to show mercy to the vulnerable among us at <u>every</u> stage of life. *Wisdom challenges us* to discern the decision that I have come to believe will bear fruit for both rich and poor; for the privileged and those struggling to get by, for the popular and the belittled or ignored.

The Spirit's gift of wisdom often does not lead us all to one "right" answer. Faith nonetheless challenges us to bring the qualities of wisdom to all major decisions. *When I choose to act according to my conscience,* I begin by letting go of the conclusions that are easiest for me to consider and the arguments that support my preconceptions. *When I choose to act according to my conscience,* I must listen deeply to what God is speaking in my heart while I observe the words and actions of each candidate. *When I choose to act according to my conscience,* I accept that others, even those closest to me, may be led to different conclusions. Peace comes not out of a forced uniformity, but rather when I allow God to bring our *diversity into harmony.*

In today's gospel, the disciples of Jesus argue over who will be first when Jesus comes into his kingdom. They have dismissed his prediction of rejection, suffering, and a cruel death. In fact, they are quite insensitive to Jesus after what he has just shared and are focused only on "What's in it for me?" Yet their insensitivity comforts me and gives me hope. If Jesus chooses to teach rather than dismiss <u>them</u>, then I also have reason to hope. There is a chance that Jesus will offer me the same mercy when I place my needs and desires above what God asks. Again and again, Jesus offers us the opportunity to take up the cross and resume the journey with him.

This week, the fourteen members of the Pastor Transition Team began their work to develop a document that outlines the strengths, hopes, qualities, and opportunities for growth of St. Francis Xavier Parish. I invite you to join me in praying for them. May their discernment over the next few months be guided by wisdom from above so that their efforts sow the good fruits of mercy and peace.






