Pastor's Letter

"My kingdom is not here. I came into the world to testify to the truth.

Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice."

John 18:36,37

These are the final words of Jesus in John's gospel before his last words on the Cross. Pilate cannot grasp either the *kingdom* of which Jesus speaks or the *truth* he proclaims. Pilate lives in the world of politics, in which "truth" tends to be what best supports *my* position. This truth changes with the times and requires those who seek power to adjust the "truth" accordingly. I write this is <u>not</u> as a cynical or a judgment view of the politics of *our* day. Pilate voices a political reality that existed long before the Romans came to power. The security of his position as procurator relies on his adherence to this understanding of truth as a convenient variable. A kingdom based on a deeper, unchanging truth is beyond his comprehension.

Jesus insists that his disciples must listen to and follow the deeper truths that are not determined by who is in power or what best suits my preferences. He will soon offer his life to the truth of God's deep love for us: a love *more powerful than death itself*. Jesus proclaims a kingdom of love and communion that embraces and unites <u>all</u> who choose to belong: men and women, young and old, friend and stranger, of all races, social positions, ethnicities, immigration status, and ways of life. In his kingdom, the unborn child is no more or less treasured than the young adult or the person near death. The person sleeping on the street is worthy of equal dignity with the one living in a mansion. The person without citizenship status deserves the same depth of compassion as the child of the third or fourth generation of former immigrants.

This is the message that Jesus gives to us, his *missionary disciples*, as we journey amid the complex challenges we face as a nation and for which there are no simple solutions. How do we who are brought together as a communion in Christ embrace the deeper truth that allows us to *listen and remain bound to one another?* How do we work to advance the common good of all God's children rather than a personal definition of what is "right" and a refusal to listen to the truth spoken by Jesus?

This Thursday, most of us will gather with family or friends and give thanks for the blessings in our lives. Amid all the diverse opinions and intense emotions of those we will be with, we are called to make a conscious choice to focus on the blessings as individuals, families, communities, and as a nation. Through word and gesture, we are called to focus on those deeper truths that unite us. For at least one day, one weekend, and maybe even one season, we set aside the self-serving truths that deceive us, separate us, and stir fears that threaten our communion. Jesus reminds us that our kingdom is not of this world. We are called to strive for something deeper and larger than the limits of our disparate thoughts and positions. We are sent forth as voices of hope, which rise from our shared belief that God journeys with us and seeks to guide us both in the easy times and the challenging ones.

I am blessed to share one more day of thanks with this community that God has allowed me to serve. You are a beacon of hope in a world needing communion and peace. Thanks be to God for all with which we have been blessed. Or as the Book of Revelation says,

"To him who loves us and has freed us from our sins by his blood, to him be glory and power forever and ever. Amen."

OPLATKI

The Christmas Wafer (also known as "Oplatki") is available at the Rectory.

The word "Bethlehem" means "the house of bread." The breaking of the bread is a sign of charity, unity and friendship. Religious family customs bring the truths of faith into the home. One of these beautiful Christmas Eve customs is the Christmas Wafer. The thin wafer bearing the Christmas characters is broken by the head of the family and distributed to each member. With a simple prayer for God's grace and the welfare of all members of the family, those present as well as those who are absent, the head of the house breaks the wafer and

distributes it, one piece to each person at the table. While doing so, each member of the family is kissed and wished a joyful feast. Members then greet one another in the same way.

The spiritual lesson in this age-old custom is that the unity of the family is grounded in God's love for us. May you experience unity and love through this simple celebration.

What's this I HEAR? We are getting a new church sound system?

Yes! Our church is poised to replace its decades-old sound system! This new mixing/processing system (the "brains"), inputs (microphones) and outputs (speakers) will bring our beautiful worship space to a whole new level of liturgical experience. Please check out the Frequently Asked Questions section below and in the upcoming bulletin articles to learn more.

The system will cost \$150,000. To date, I am thrilled to announce that 15 parishioners have pledged \$117,000! We hope that YOU will consider joining this mini campaign to help us raise the additional \$33,000. Options include:

Antonio Franceschi, our Facilities Manager, provided the following information:

When will this system be installed?

Starting in December, Procom will be working in and around our church space replacing our old analog equipment with new upgraded digital equipment. During the upgrading process, a temporary system will be put into place while the overall completion of the project is done. This will allow us to continue our regular church services and other activities while the work is completed.

How was our contractor selected?

SFX selected 5 contractors who have worked in and been approved by the Archdiocese of Chicago for church audio systems. Three of the 5 responded to our requests for bids, and we selected Procom Sound Systems. We have been working with them over the past year in designing a new state-of-the-art digital sound system that would dramatically improve our audio experience in our church space, with infrastructure that could be expanded to enhance our video experience as well.

I use hearing aids. Will the new system link into them?

Yes - a WiFi-based assistive listening system will be installed. To use the system, a parishioner would download an app on their cell phone, then log into the dedicated assistive listening system WiFi network. Once logged in, the user would be able to enjoy a personal listening experience from anywhere in the church via their own personal ear buds or via their Bluetooth-enabled hearing aid.






