

Pastor's Letter

I pray always with joy in my every prayer for all of you.

And this is my prayer: that your love may increase ever more and more in knowledge and every kind of perception, to discern what is of value, so that you may be pure and blameless for the day of Christ, filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ.

Philippians 1:4,9-11

What brings you joy? Advent joy is traditionally celebrated with the rose candle that we will light next Sunday, but it is a virtue of the entire season. The scriptures today include this joyful proclamation of the apostle Paul to the Christian community at Philippi. John the Baptist appears in the Gospel of Luke, proclaiming that God's salvation is near. John could be harsh with those who opposed his prophecies or failed to transform their lives. But to those who came to him with repentance, seeking hope, John went about "proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins." His mission was to *prepare the way* for the coming of God into our world. John's joyful expectation of the arrival of a savior was so contagious that large crowds came to him in the desert.

What is John inviting you to <u>set straight</u>, to <u>lower in humility</u>, or to <u>make smooth</u> and so prepare a path for God into your heart and your home? The answer is about more than decorating a tree, buying a present, or baking cookies. These activities are wonderful when they inspire joy in the heart. Yet John speaks to a deliberate *inventory and housecleaning* of our interior lives; to make room for the Child of Bethlehem to be born in our hearts this Christmas. Is there some clutter that needs to be cleared away or simply taken off your to do list. Maybe you need to set aside some time to read to a child, to visit with a sick or homebound friend, or to ask God's help to heal fractures in your relationships. Our primary task in the remaining days before Christmas is to *make room for Jesus to dwell with us* in our homes and our hearts.

Archbishop Cupich recently sent all pastors a long explanation of how we will celebrate the **Feast of the Immaculate Conception** this year. The bishops in our part of the country have removed the *obligation* to attend Mass on most holy days that fall on Saturday or Monday. One exception is the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, since Mary is the Patroness of our country under this title. However, when the liturgical calendar was prepared and printed for this year, the materials stated that the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, which had been moved from Sunday to Monday, December 9, would <u>not</u> be a holy day of obligation. As a result, **Cardinal Cupich has dispensed all Catholics in the Archdiocese of Chicago from the obligation to attend Mass on December 9**th. We will, of course, celebrate the Feast of the Immaculate Conception this Monday at the 8:30 morning Mass.

Today is the day! Plan to arrive early or stay late so you can attend the Third Annual Yule Flip Pancake Breakfast this Sunday morning in Joyce Hall. **Reservations in advance are not required.** You will be served pancakes and sausage by members of our Knights of Columbus group and by students in our School of Religious Education. And the gym will hold a variety of activities for children as well as an opportunity for a visit with Santa. I hope to see you there!

The coming holidays have resulted in early printing deadlines with our bulletin publisher. As a result, more current events may not be addressed for the next few Sundays. We will catch up when the printing schedule returns to normal after January 5th.

Reflection For the 2nd Sunday of Advent

Advent continues. "Are you ready?" as Fr. Rich asked us a few weeks ago.

Joyful expectation, preparation and anticipation are upon us. Something great is going to happen soon. All obstacles to celebrating with God will be removed. The paths and winding roads will be made straight, the valleys and the gorges will be filled to level ground and the rough ways will be made smooth.

The prophet Baruch in the first reading explains how God once more looks kindly upon Jerusalem. She no longer needs to be sad and mournful because He again recognizes her and her children. "You will be named by God forever, the peace of justice, the glory of God's worship". Be joyful for God has shown his mercy.

In the second reading Paul is also filled with joy by expressing his thankfulness to the Philippians for remaining prayerful. He asks them to increase in their love and to continue to find their best selves by discerning what is of value in their lives.

This Sunday also carries the theme of peace. It is our hope that the Christ child will bring peace to our troubled world as we prepare our hearts in faithful waiting. We come together as a community of faith, open to all. This period before the birth of Christ is also a time to deepen and renew our relationship with God. We are asked to be patient, prayerful and trusting. Let us step backward from what preoccupies us and distracts us and make a straight way for the Lord. "Come Lord Jesus."

An update To Our New Church Sound System

We have been getting some great feedback on our new church sound system! A few weeks ago, we were looking to raise an additional \$33,000 toward the total system cost of \$150,000. I am excited to announce that several parishioners graciously responded and an additional \$8,000 has been donated!

We hope that YOU will consider joining this mini campaign to help us raise the additional \$25,000 – see below for options.

Another update: the altar carpet will be replaced upon completion of the audio system installation. Our existing carpet will need to be taken up in certain areas in order to install wiring under the altar. Tom Cunningham (SFX parishioner and DeSitter Flooring co-owner) offered to replace the carpet, which DeSitter installed about 20 years ago. The spots and the wax stains have been a challenge to remove, and this was the perfect time to have new carpet installed. Thank you to Tom for this amazing gift!

OPLATKI

The Christmas Wafer (also known as "Oplatki") is available at the Rectory.

The word "Bethlehem" means "the house of bread." The breaking of the bread is a sign of charity, unity and friendship. Religious family customs bring the truths of faith into the home. One of these beautiful Christmas Eve customs is the Christmas Wafer. The thin wafer bearing the Christmas characters is broken by the head of the family and distributed to



each member. With a simple prayer for God's grace and the welfare of all members of the family, those present as well as those who are absent, the head of the house breaks the wafer and distributes it, one piece to each person at the table. While doing so, each member of the family is kissed and wished a joyful feast. Members then greet one another in the same way.

The spiritual lesson in this age-old custom is that the unity of the family is grounded in God's love for us. May you experience unity and love through this simple celebration.

Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)

For our seniors over the age of $70\frac{1}{2}$



A Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) allows individuals age 70½ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to make a direct, tax-free transfer of funds from their IRA to qualified charities, such as St. Francis Xavier Parish. This is a unique opportunity to make a significant impact while also benefiting from potential tax advantages through a QCD.

Here are some key benefits of making a QCD from your IRA:

- 1. **Reduce your taxable income**: The amount transferred directly to charity does not generate taxable income, which may reduce your annual income level. This may help lower your Medicare premiums and decrease the amount of Social Security subject to tax.
- 2. **Fulfill your RMD**: If you are 73 years old or older, your QCD can satisfy all or part of your required minimum distribution.
- 3. **Simplicity**: The process is straightforward—just instruct your IRA custodian to make the gift directly to us.
- 4. **Make a Difference**: Your QCD will make an immediate impact on our mission to *belong, believe, and be love*.

As we reflect on the blessings of the past year, we invite you to consider making a QCD to St. Francis Xavier Parish. If you would like to ensure your contribution is received in the current tax year, it is best to initiate your QCD prior to December 10.
