Pastor's Letter

There are **different** kinds of spiritual gifts but the **same** Spirit, there are **different** forms of service but the **same** Lord, there are **different** workings but the **same** God who produces **all** of them **in everyone**. To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit. 1 Corinthians 12:4-7

Paul writes to an early Christian community that was known for its tensions and conflicts. Corinth was a prominent port city, and it attracted people from all parts of the Mediterranean. Corinthians were diverse in culture, language, beliefs, and priorities. Their diversity had become an obstacle to living and witnessing as the <u>One</u> Body of Christ. How could they achieve any semblance of unity or peace?

In his two letters to the Corinthians, Paul employs the image of the human body. Our bodies are comprised of many distinct members, each of which serves a particular purpose and function. In a healthy body, the many distinct members collaborate for the good of the whole. They avoid interfering with one another's functions except to support another member when problems occur. Illness or dysfunction occurs when one element of the body acts with a purpose contrary to that of another. Healing requires the various elements to return to a state of harmony.

This is how we are called to be church. Each member of the church has been given specific gifts by the Holy Spirit that are to be used for the good of the whole. If any one member is unable to function well, the "health" of the entire body is affected. If the various elements within the church community work at cross purposes and/or refuse to seek harmony and the common good, the entire body becomes ill and less able to fulfill its purpose. The community of the church must seek the healing power of the Spirit to restore and/or maintain harmony.

Paul's message also applies to people of faith as citizens. The 2024 election year intensified tensions and divisions that already existed among diverse points of view. Many issues are now "off limits" within families or among friends. Political leaders often refuse to seek common ground; they may even reject good ideas simply because they come from the "other side." Religious leaders, too, make various and even contradictory proclamations of "right" and "wrong" that leave many people confused, feeling that they no longer belong, or questioning their faith.

This Monday, we inaugurate our President on the same day that we celebrate the legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Each inauguration offers a new opportunity to advance the dream of becoming a nation in which all God's children encounter a path to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness. We will never fully achieve this dream on earth; nonetheless, we continue to strive toward it. We recommit ourselves to the ideals of this nation amid the challenges of our economy, the environment, world tensions, just immigration policies, and a deepening respect for the dignity of every human life. This is not the work or responsibility of <u>any</u> one person. The Spirit has distributed among us <u>all</u> the gifts to act toward the common good with wisdom and compassion.

We continue to pray for the people of the Los Angeles area, especially those who have lost homes or loved ones and the firefighters who step into harms way to protect others.

Have you considered attending the new Alpha series that begins January 27? Do you know of others whom you could invite to attend with you? Who might be waiting for your invitation?

Mid-year Offertory Update



Last October in the annual report, we set forth our plan for a break-even budget, contingent on an offertory increase of \$110,000 (or 6%). After several years of operating at a deficit, a major goal was to achieve this 6% increase with a combination of increases in donations from those who have steadfastly given over the years AND from our parishioners who made the decision to regularly commit to financially steward our parish.

We are excited to announce that for the first 6 months of the fiscal year (through December 31), total offertory was \$997,547, an increase of \$73,314 (7.9%). This is GREAT news! Your financial investment is one way you demonstrate your commitment to each other. All of us know the importance of community to grow in our faith as disciples of Christ, sharing our joys and challenges with each other. Belong. Believe. Be Love. God bless you for your trust that our parish will steward your investment with these four words ever in mind.

Everyone's continued investment in our ministries will enable us to meet the needs of the community we serve. The spirit in which you give of your financial resources shows that you believe in our mission and see the fruits of our ministries. 
