

Pastor's Letter

"Whom shall I send? Who will go for us?"
"Here I am," I said, "send me."
Isaiah 6:8

We hear God's call to three men, each of whom feels unworthy at the moment he is called. The prophet Isaiah, who will become the greatest prophet of the Old Testament, receives his call at a time when the divided kingdom of Israel is in a period of decline. People have turned away from God's covenant with Israel. The northern kingdom will soon be conquered, and invading armies will reach the walls of Jerusalem soon after that. Isaiah is overcome with an awareness of his own sinfulness until a messenger of the Lord touches his lips with a red-hot coal. This act frees him from his sinfulness and gives him the confidence to accept God's call. Paul presents himself as one who persecuted the early church and is therefore the last and least of the apostles. He insists that it is by the grace of God alone that he has become an apostle with the strength to carry the message of God's salvation in Christ to the Gentile world. Finally, **Peter** offers his boat to Jesus on a day on which the crowds became so large along the shoreline that Jesus must preach to them from a short distance offshore. Peter and his partners then follow the command of Jesus to lower their nets for a catch, despite what had been an unsuccessful night of fishing. When they find their nets filled to overflowing. Peter falls to his knees at the bottom of the boat and proclaims his unworthiness to even be in the presence of Jesus. At this very moment, Jesus tells Peter not to be afraid and calls Peter to follow him.

Three calls to three men who each confess their unworthiness to receive God's call. Three men who receive healing and the grace and then follow where God leads them. What is God asking of each of us this day? If we are honest with God and ourselves, we, too, will acknowledge that we do not merit the call to discipleship because of our own efforts. We are imperfect human beings who too often reject God's way of love to pursue our desire of the moment. Isaiah, Paul, and Peter witness to us that we are made worthy for whatever God asks of us by the grace of God, freely given to us in love. God desires to do great things through us. God will provide the gifts and the grace to do what God asks of us. Our willingness to do God's will is all that God asks of us.

What is God's call to you this day? How does God invite you to take part in building the kingdom of God? You may not receive the call of Isaiah to lead an entire society to conversion of heart. Yet you may be called to change the hearts of those closest to you by the example of your life. You may not receive the call of Paul to carry the message of Jesus to all parts of the world. Yet you may be called to witness to your faith in the way you interact with friends, neighbors, and coworkers. You may not receive the call of Peter to leave everything behind to follow Jesus. Yet you may be called to grow deeper in faith by journeying with Jesus in prayer, study, or service.

This weekend we celebrate all who volunteer their time and talent in one of our parish ministries. Your willingness to offer your gifts in service to Jesus is critical to the vitality of this faith community. Your gift is a blessing that we deeply appreciate.

Remember that there is **no Sunday 5:00 PM Mass <u>this Sunday</u>** due to the popularity of the Super Bowl. Enjoy the game; enjoy the commercials, or enjoy a good book as you choose!






Receiving God's grace through the sacraments is a core of our Catholic faith. This past weekend we celebrated the Rite of


Transition Prayer






