Pastor's Letter

"My father was a wandering Aramean." Deuteronomy 26:5

Who am I and from whom did I come? Moses gave clear instructions to the people of Israel that, having entered the Promised Land and benefitted from its fruits, they should give thanks and remember their origins. The bounty of their new homeland was <u>not</u> due to their worthiness nor the result of their own efforts. Their freedom, the land in which they could now raise their descendants, and the abundant produce of the land were all gifts from a loving God. God had led them out of slavery, through the desert, and into a rich land they could call their own. And God had done so despite their complaints of hunger and thirst, their turning away from God to worship false idols, and their lack of trust that God would protect them.

On this first Sunday of Lent, we hear that Jesus was *led by the Spirit* into the desert to face the same temptations as his ancestors. In the face of hunger, Jesus refuses to complain, but rather reaffirms his trust that God will provide for his needs. In the face of his own powerlessness, Jesus refuses to grasp for security, but rather proclaims that he will rely on God's power alone. And in the face of his own vulnerability, Jesus refuses to tempt God, but rather places his life in God's hands. Jesus opens the path to a new Promised Land through fasting, giving alms, and prayer.

And so, we begin again to walk this journey with the Lord. This is not a journey that we plan with some personal goal or accomplishment in mind. **Like Jesus**, we allow ourselves to be *led by the Spirit* in response to God's invitation. We empty our minds and our hearts and quiet the noises that distract us from recognizing the presence of God. We fast for a time; but not in hope of losing weight and fitting into a new Easter outfit. In fact, our fasting may not involve food at all. We might fast from television or video games. We might fast from some of the activities that overfill our schedule and leave little room for being still.

Like Jesus, we trust that we have been given all that we need. In gratitude, we open our eyes and hearts to see the ways in which God is inviting us to share some of our abundance with those in greater need. We seek to become more aware of the ways in which people are experiencing hunger, poverty, or rejection. We offer our time and our talent to defend the defenseless, to speak on behalf of the silenced, and to feed the hungry hearts whose resources are limited.

Like Jesus, we go off by ourselves and place God at the center of our lives; *we listen* for what God is asking of us. *We set aside time* in each day simply to place ourselves in the presence of God, even if that time seems "unproductive" by our own standards. We confess our sins and experience God's healing mercy. We place in God's hands those who are struggling, isolated, or afraid. We listen for the urges that God places within us and pray for the discernment and determination to follow where God leads us.

Who are you, and from whom did you come? Lent offers us an opportunity to spend time with God and allow God to tell us what God sees. We can fast yet not grow hungry; give away yet not grow poor; be still and yet be filled with life. *The Spirit is eager to lead.*

What place does God have in my life? This is a question to consider in the next 40 days. We are reminded of the 3 tenets of Lent: prayer, fasting and almsgiving. By means of prayer our hearts and minds are changed, making us think differently about ourselves, the people around us and our world. By fasting we join Jesus in sacrifice. We become more aware of God's presence in our lives. By almsgiving we share our gifts and talents, our mercy and love with those in need.

In the first reading we rejoice with the people who have withstood 40 years of wandering, regrouping and suffering to be brought to "this land flowing with milk and honey." God remained with them on their journey, a constant presence as he is with us in our trials and troubles.

In the second reading, God urges us to not only express our faith internally in our hearts but to externally express our faith through our mouths. Through us his presence is felt and revealed in the world.

Lent is a time of testing. What an extraordinary role model Jesus is for us. What courage and obedience are displayed for his father in the face of great temptation. His father remained with him as he is in our lives when we experience moments of weakness and darkness.

We will face challenges during Lent. We may falter at times, but we will not fail because Jesus is with us. He loves us and only wants the best for us. He will never leave us.

This month, we highlight the Catholic prayer app which parishioners have joined as a parish community since we introduced it in October 2024. The Hallow app is one new way in which SFX is responding to parishioner feedback gained during the "Disciple Maker Index" survey in 2023. Our Pastoral Associate, Maggie McMahon, shares: "We received 271 responses from people who attend Mass *at least* weekly. Approximately 64% said the parish does not teach them to read or pray with scripture, and 35% said the parish did not provide events or opportunities to which they could invite others. And these were responses primarily from people who came to church at least once a week, if not more! We immediately prioritized addressing these gaps in spiritual formation. When we heard about the opportunity to become one of the first 'Parish Partners' with the Hallow prayer app, we saw a resource that had the ability to transform prayer lives at St. Francis Xavier and beyond."

St. Francis is now able to equip parishioners in ALL of the above areas!

- Hallow teaches us to pray in new ways from traditional Catholic prayers like the rosary to meditation and contemplative prayer to prayer with music.
- On our parish Hallow page, parishioners are able to share reflections and prayer intentions, as well as pray for the prayer intentions of others in a virtual **communal faith-sharing environment.**
- Hallow reflections almost *all* include some element of **Scriptural reflection**, but the app also includes **Scripture-specific content** like: Bible in a Year, daily readings and Gospel reflections, scriptural meditation and contemplative prayer, and more.
- Hallow is easy to share with others as a "first step" towards joining or returning to a faith community.

The Partnership enables us to offer six all-parish challenges (free to all those who join our Hallow page) and a \$1 first year subscription to all premium content on the app.


There are a number of volunteer opportunities for high school students that count toward required service hours. Parents are encouraged to volunteer as well.
