

Pastor's Letter

For the foolishness of God is wiser than human wisdom, and the weakness of God is stronger than human strength.

1 Corinthians 1:25

When we attempt to converse with God in ways that are most familiar to us, we tend to fail. Saint Paul explains that many of the Jewish people could not accept who Jesus was because he did not show them the signs they expected of the Messiah. They took Jesus literally when he proclaimed that he would destroy the Temple and rebuild it in three days; such a thing was not humanly possible and therefore not a sign of the long-awaited Messiah. The Greek world at the time of Jesus valued wisdom and sought to deepen their understanding of the world beyond the physical through ongoing dialogue with one another. The words of Jesus were foolish and not to be considered seriously. Yet this seeming foolishness, Paul insists, is the deeper wisdom of a God who operates beneath and beyond the limits of human wisdom. The weakness that the world will perceive in the death of Jesus as a condemned criminal is but an expression of the strength of God bringing life to all through the death and Resurrection of Jesus.

We have never witnessed a crucifixion in person. In the Roman world, crucifixion was both a death penalty and an instrument of deterrence. It was a torturous and humiliating death, as much for the observers as for the one being crucified. The person on the cross hang, barely clothed and struggling to breathe. Their limbs would weaken until they could no longer sustain a position that would allow them to breathe. However, this was only the immediate effect of crucifixion on the observers. Crucifixions were staged near the entrances to cities or along well-travelled roads. Bodies were usually left on the cross to be scavenged by birds of prey; what gradually fell to the ground would then be scavenged by other animals until only the bones remained. This displayed both the power of the Romans and the consequence of rebelling against Roman rule.

Yet the early Christians boldly held up a cross as proof of *God's power* over suffering and death. The world had done its worst to demonstrate its power over human life. God brought Jesus back from the dead and restored life. The cross had become a sign of *God's* victory; the seeming weakness of Jesus on the cross proved stronger than human strength. The seeming foolishness of God's actions made complete foolishness of human wisdom. The death of Jesus on the Cross indeed became the destruction of the Temple and its former purpose. The resurrected Body of Jesus would bring new life and communion between God and humankind.

The next three Sundays of Lent direct us toward Jerusalem and Holy Week. Will we join our early Christian brothers and sisters and embrace the Cross as the symbol of God's wisdom and power? Are we willing to sit quietly with God and invite him into the ways in which the Cross is part of our lives at this moment? Where does God invite me to trust that *God's power* is greater than that which we fear? And as we face suffering in our world, often caused by the misuse of power, do we believe that God is more powerful? Are we willing to learn God's wisdom? Despite what the world might want us to believe, are we willing to believe in God's power over suffering and death and become missionary disciples of the Resurrection of Jesus?
