

Pastor's Letter

"Why do you seek the living one among the dead? He is not here, but he has been raised." Luke 24:5-6

Several women from Galilee come to the tomb at daybreak to anoint the body of Jesus. Two beings in dazzling garments suddenly appear and announce that Jesus has been raised from the dead. Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women rush to tell the apostles what they had seen and heard. "But their story seemed like nonsense, and they did not believe them." Yet the women persisted.

The Resurrection of Jesus was not easily embraced by the first witnesses. Jesus appeared to them many times over forty days. He called them to believe, reassured them, forgave them, fed them, breathed peace upon them, and promised to be with them always. They slowly began to tell their story to others, and the number of believers grew. Then the Holy Spirit filled them and sent them to people across the Mediterranean basin. As we grow in faith, we continue to tell their story to family, neighbors, and friends.

Christ is Risen! Indeed, He is Risen! This traditional Orthodox Easter greeting is exchanged when two believers meet or enter the home of another. I first learned this dialogue as a child in the Orthodox dialect of my Eastern European grandparents. We Catholics have no similar Easter greeting. We dress in our Easter finest and sing "Alleluias" in church. However, once we leave the church, we seem to drop any mention of Christ and his resurrection.

"Happy Easter!" is a joyous greeting, as is the celebration of the early morning arrival of the Easter Bunny. Yet we tend to omit our reason to celebrate: **Christ is Risen!** Jesus conquered the power of sin and death through his death on the Cross. His resurrection opened the path to heaven for us all. Easter eggs symbolize the tomb out of which came new life even though it seemed empty. Baskets filled with treats remind us of God's abundant blessings. The foods in the special Easter baskets brought to be blessed overflow with foods that celebrate a return to abundance at Easter dinners.

At the Saturday Easter Vigil, we welcomed Angela Diaz, Caleb Hurtado, Jason O'Brien, John Rateike, William Shufflebarger, and Keith Spence, into the Church through Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. We fully initiated as Catholics Golriz Connolly, May Goshorn, James Liebenson, Ian Matthews, and Jeremy Tyner through the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist. Next Sunday, we will celebrate Confirmation and Eucharist with one remaining candidate, Nicole Pohl. These women and men give witness to the activity of the Spirit among us and the willingness of parishioners to invite others into our journey with Jesus. Welcome, sisters and brothers, joined with us in Christ. May you continue to be a blessing for us.

I pray that this Easter Day includes time for you to be joyful and give thanks. I thank <u>you</u> who regularly bring life to our place of worship and to our mission in Christ. Blessings to you who are new to us, who are with us only occasionally, or who are "testing the waters." Your presence is **important to us.** You make us more complete by choosing to be with us; you belong here! I pray that you will always feel at home *in this space and among us*. This is the mission Christ has given us. Finally, welcome to you who are visiting with family or friends. It is good for us to be together. Christ is Risen! Indeed, He is Risen! Alleluia!

A new day is dawning for Catholic men. Now is our hour! The future of the world and the Church is happening on our watch. His mercy is new every morning. A new hope is rising!



In the spring of 2012, my family planted roots in La Grange Park, and from the very beginning, we knew we wanted to build a life filled with faith, community, and tradition. My husband Rob and I quickly registered at St. Francis Xavier Church. For us, becoming part of a parish wasn't just a formality—it was a heartfelt priority. With two young daughters, we wanted to create a foundation of belonging, comfort, and faith that would guide them through life, just as my own childhood parish, St. William, had done for me. Growing up on the Northwest side of Chicago, my church



was more than a building—it was the heartbeat of our neighborhood. It defined who we were, where we came from, and how we connected with others. St. William Church was my anchor, my compass, and the backdrop of my most cherished memories.

Our family has been blessed to participate in the Teen Mass, with my daughter lending her voice to the Spirit Choir. The Feast of Mercy or Divine Mercy Sunday has been celebrated in many countries, dioceses and parishes for many years. Pope John Paul II, the Cardinals, Bishops and Priests who have read the diary of St. Faustina have come to appreciate the significance of this feast. But now, ever since the Holy See had decreed that the "Second Sunday of Easter would be known as Divine Mercy Sunday," many more are seeking to go more deeply into the words of Our Lord to St. Faustina that were meant for all humanity.

Pope John Paul II in his homily at the canonization of Sr. Faustina on April 30, 2000 said: "Jesus shows His hands and His side. He points, that is, to the wounds of the Passion, especially the wound in His Heart, the source from which flows the great wave of mercy poured out on humanity".

The image of Jesus, The Divine Mercy, is to have a special place of honor on the Feast of Mercy, a visual reminder of all that Jesus did for us through His Passion, Death, and Resurrection...and a reminder, too, of what He asks of us in return—to trust Him and be merciful to others.

The Eucharist is the "Fountain of Life". The Eucharist is Jesus, Himself, the Living God, longing to pour Himself as Mercy into our hearts.
