



Pastor's Letter

"Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." John 20:21

The Risen Christ imparts peace on his disciples as they tremble behind locked doors; he breathes upon them the Spirit of peace. One week later he again appears to them and offers Thomas whatever he needs to dispel his doubts. We are told that Jesus appears to his disciples several times over forty days to deepen their faith in what God has done.

Yet Jesus desires even more. He is preparing them to go out as missionaries; to carry to others the good news of his words and deeds and the significance of his Resurrection. The Spirit eventually will push them beyond the locked doors into Jerusalem and the Mediterranean world. Within a short time, they will have established small Christian communities throughout the eastern Mediterranean.

So I send you. Jesus now <u>sends us.</u> We receive the gifts of the Spirit through Confirmation and continue to be formed by Word and Eucharist. Our tongues *must not be silent.* We are sent as a voice for those in the womb and those near death; those who live with physical or mental limits; the poor, the vulnerable, and the immigrant; <u>all</u> who are judged by society as less worthy of dignity and respect. Some may judge this message as political. Nonetheless, <u>we are sent</u> to stand for and with those whom Jesus embraced as blessed.

Our mission is <u>not</u> a political platform. Nor can we exclude <u>any</u> individual or group. **Our communion** is the peace that Jesus breathes upon us and that the world cannot give. **This is the peace** that heals divisions and mends broken relationships. **This is the peace** that no one can take from us if we embrace it.

Pope Francis had died. Good Pope Francis spoke often of the challenges that missionary disciples face in a polarized society. Yet he insisted that this is not an excuse to avoid or water down our mission. On Easter Sunday, he offered words of hope and joy to those assembled and made his way through the crowd in St. Peter's Square.

We awoke on Easter Monday to the news that

I am sad for what the Church has lost and pray that Pope Francis rests in peace. I give thanks for his life, his words, and his example of a missionary disciple. He opened church doors and human hearts with humble actions and compassionate words for the marginalized, the outcast, and the oppressed.

Pope Francis called us into a spirit of *synodality*, in which *all* members of the Church seek to listen to one another <u>and</u> to honestly and respectfully share their hopes and concerns. He believed that our mission *requires* people of many different viewpoints who listen and seek to understand one another. <u>Each person</u> brings something to the conversation.

Pope Francis saw and responded to the need for women to have positions of greater authority in the Church. He removed Church leaders who failed to appreciate the deep pain of clergy sexual abuse survivors and prevent further abuse. He also made it clear in the face of opposition that each person who seeks a blessing from the Church should receive that blessing simply because each person is a beloved child of God.

Where will the Spirit lead the Church in the days to come? We pray for Pope Francis, and we pray for the Cardinals who will gather to name his successor.

Come, Holy Spirit.

We are pleased to announce that registration for Summer 2025 is now open. As you may know from previous announcements, SFX is partnering again with Grace Lutheran for this summer's VBS program. The VBS program will run June 23-27 (Monday-Friday) from 9:00am-12:00 noon. VBS is open to children aged 4 through 4th grade. 5th and 6th graders can participate as members of a "service crew" that will spend the week organizing and conducting a series of service projects.

The little ones will attend VBS at Grace Lutheran. The service crew will be based at SFX school this year. Due to space constraints attendance will be capped at 150 for the little ones and 30 for the service crew so please register early.


The Feast of Mercy or Divine Mercy Sunday
has been celebrated in many countries,
dioceses and parishes for many years.
Pope John Paul II, the Cardinals,
Bishops and Priests
who have read the diary of St. Faustina have
come to appreciate the significance of this feast.
But now, ever since the Holy See had decreed
that the "Second Sunday of Easter would be
known as Divine Mercy Sunday,"
many more are seeking to go more
deeply into the words of
Our Lord to St. Faustina
that were meant for all humanity.

Pope John Paul II in his homily at the canonization of Sr. Faustina on April 30, 2000 said: "Jesus shows His hands and His side. He points, that is, to the wounds of the Passion, especially the wound in His Heart, the source from which flows the great wave of mercy poured out on humanity".

The image of Jesus, The Divine Mercy, is to have a special place of honor on the Feast of Mercy, a visual reminder of all that Jesus did for us through His Passion, Death, and Resurrection...and a reminder, too, of what He asks of us in return—to trust Him and be merciful to others.

The Eucharist is the "Fountain of Life".

The Eucharist is Jesus, Himself, the Living God, longing to pour Himself as Mercy into our hearts.






