

Pastor's Letter

"I found delight in the human race." Proverbs 8:31

My father grew up in the Back of the Yards neighborhood on the south side of Chicago. He fulfilled his parents' dream of graduating from college, serving in the Navy, and building a lifelong career with the same company. In marrying my mother, he became Catholic, confronted a culture from the far side of Europe, and moved to the northwest side of Chicago. So, it was one more adjustment when his eldest son announced his desire to become a priest.

Dad became someone I could turn to for support and guidance; I could share with him both the joys and struggles. He was glad that I came here in 1990 and could see that I truly loved what I was doing. The delight in my spirit delighted him.

My father died in 2013, two years before I returned to this parish. Yet there have been moments when I have spoken with him in prayer or heard his advice in a moment when I needed to remember. I deeply appreciate the blessing of his life. In fact, I can accept, and even embrace with a smile, the moments in which I find myself doing the exact same things that used to annoy me when I was young.

Such is the delight of the creator, Father God of whom Proverbs speaks. He has placed us within creation with a rich diversity that he invites into a communion of love in and with him. This is the mystery of Father, Son, and Spirit.

The Trinity is an image of Church at our best. I often see it reflected in the life of this parish. We reach out to all to embrace and learn from our diversity. This is what a loving father does, whether a father by birth, adoption, or guidance – reflecting the Father's delight in us.



2025 VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL **REGISTRATION NOW OPEN!**

We are pleased to announce that registration for Summer 2025 is now open. As you may know from previous announcements, SFX is partnering again with Grace Lutheran for this summer's VBS program. The VBS program will run June 23-27 (Monday-Friday) from 9:00am-12:00 noon. VBS is open to children aged 4 through 4th grade. 5th and 6th graders can participate as members of a "service crew" that will spend the week organizing and conducting a series of service projects.

The little ones will attend VBS at Grace Lutheran. The service crew will be based at SFX school this year. Due to space constraints attendance will be capped at 150 for the little ones and 30 for the service crew so please register early.

A successful VBS program is not possible without the help of parent, teen and middle school volunteers. We are happy to continue to offer two in-person sessions and a virtual option for families for the 2025-2026 school year.


Our options are:




