



#### **Pastor's Note**

October - The Month of the Holy Rosary

Dear Friends,

October has long been celebrated in the Church as the Month of the Holy Rosary - a time when the faithful are encouraged to rediscover this simple yet profound form of prayer. The Rosary, as we know it today, took shape through the devotion of the Dominican Order. In the 13th century, St Dominic and his followers helped popularize it as a way for ordinary people to meditate on the life of Christ and the mysteries of salvation. Through its joyful, sorrowful, luminous, and glorious mysteries, the Rosary remains one of the Church's most beloved and accessible paths to contemplation.

For some, the repetitive nature of the Rosary can seem daunting or monotonous. Yet that repetition is precisely what gives it its spiritual power. Like the steady rhythm of breathing or waves on the lakeshore, the cadence of the Hail Mary's and Our Fathers quiets the mind and opens the heart. The words fade into a gentle backdrop as the soul begins to enter the mysteries themselves - to walk with Mary through the life of her Son. Prayed with patience and attention, the Rosary becomes not mere recitation, but true meditation.

Recently, Pope Leo XIV reminded the whole Church of the Rosary's power for healing and peace. During a General Audience he said, "I invite everyone, each day of the coming month, to pray the Rosary for peace - personally, in the family, in community." As we take up this invitation, we pray for peace in our world, especially in Gaza, Ukraine, and all places torn by conflict. We pray for peace in our own nation - an end to violence, a renewed spirit of mutual respect, and reconciliation among all people. And we pray for peace within our homes, our families, and our Church.

May this October be for us a month of quiet prayer, of meditative rhythm, and of renewed hope in Mary's intercession. Through her, may we come ever closer to the Prince of Peace.




#### **Pink Ribbon Community**


