Pastor's Letter

The Church That Reminds Us Who We Are Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome - November 9, 2025

This Sunday, we celebrate a feast that might sound curious at first - the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome. It's not a saint's day, nor does it commemorate an event in the life of Christ, but rather the consecration of a church building. Yet this feast carries a message that reaches far beyond bricks and mortar: it reminds us who we are as God's living temple.

The Basilica of St. John Lateran was founded in 324, and is the oldest basilica in the Western world. Its official title - a total of thirty-seven words long! - reflects its place as the "mother and head of all churches in the city and the world." Built on land once belonging to the noble Laterani family, it was given to the Church by Emperor Constantine and became the cathedral of the Bishop of Rome, the Pope himself. At the far end of the sanctuary stands the papal cathedra, the Pope's official chair of teaching authority, signifying that this is the true cathedral church of the Diocese of Rome.

Above the main altar, enclosed in an ornate, cage-like structure, rest two silver reliquaries said to contain the skulls of St. Peter and St. Paul - a striking reminder that the faith proclaimed by those apostles continues to echo through the centuries. Beneath its vast arches lie the tombs of twenty-two popes, including Pope Leo XIII, whose resting place is tucked above the doorway into the sacristy.

I've been privileged to visit the Lateran many times, most recently this past September. Each time I cross its threshold, I'm struck by the same sense of awe - not just at its artistic and architectural grandeur, but at the living reality it represents. Beneath its gilded ceilings, pilgrims from every nation

pray side by side, all part of the same divine story. The Lateran is more than stone and mosaic - it is a heartbeat of faith, a visible sign of the Church's unity across the ages.

This feast reminds us that we, too, are God's temples. The Spirit dwells not only in basilicas of marble and gold, but within the humble architecture of the human heart. Every time we gather here at St. Francis Xavier, we become - in our own way - a small reflection of that same living Church that has stood in Rome for over 1,700 years.

May we give thanks for the sacred walls that shelter us, and even more for the grace that binds us together. The most beautiful cathedral, after all, is the one God builds within us - a dwelling place radiant with love.

"You are God's building." (1 Corinthians 3:9)


