

Pastor's Letter

The Grace of Gratitude

As we enter Thanksgiving week, it's worth remembering that gratitude is not just a mood or a polite instinct - it's a deeply Christian posture. St. John Henry Newman once reminded his congregation that everything we have is God's gift: our life, our health, our reason, our faith, our friendships, our opportunities, even the quiet mercies that get us through each day. Nothing is "owed" to us, Newman says. It is all "undeservedly given, day by day continued to us solely by his mercy." When we look at our lives through that lens, suddenly gratitude is not a seasonal exercise - it becomes the way a Christian sees the world.

Newman goes even deeper: we are not only recipients of God's gifts - we ourselves belong to God. We are His by creation, redemption, and the new life given to us in baptism. We were not made for lonely independence, nor for the illusion that we are self-made. We were made to live in relationship with the One who guides, protects, forgives, and sustains us. Gratitude flows from recognizing that we are held by a love far larger than our own strength.

As we look back on the past year - its joys, its trials, its unexpected turns - it is good to pause and notice the quiet ways God has been present. The dangers avoided. The mistakes corrected. The prayers whispered in uncertainty that, in God's time, found their answer. The moments of consolation, of clarity, of small healing. Newman invites us to "trace his guiding hand" through our years, to see how God has been a shield, a companion, and at times even a gentle disciplinarian, drawing us onward toward life. Gratitude grows when we remember where we have been - and who has walked beside us.

Of course, as Thanksgiving arrives this week, gratitude also extends to the very human joys that surround us: the gathering of family and friends, the warm homes, the shared meals. Even the turkey - bland creature that it is - becomes something marvelous once it's properly supported by gravy, stuffing, and cranberries (a reminder that God's grace can elevate even the simplest things!). May this season open our hearts to gratitude in all its forms. May we recognize every blessing as a sign of God's faithful love. And may we carry that spirit of gratitude into Advent and the year to come.




Jim Donahue State Farm Cereal Collection For St. Francis Xavier Food Pantry

The Christmas Wafer (also known as "Oplatki") is available at the Rectory.

The word "Bethlehem" means "the house of bread." The breaking of the bread is a sign of charity, unity and friendship. Religious family customs bring the truths of faith into the home. One of these beautiful Christmas Eve customs is the Christmas Wafer. The thin wafer bearing the Christmas characters is broken by the head of the family and distributed to each member. With a simple prayer for God's grace and the welfare of all members of the family, those present as well as those who are absent, the head of the house breaks the wafer and

distributes it, one piece to each person at the table. While doing so, each member of the family is kissed and wished a joyful feast. Members then greet one another in the same way.

The spiritual lesson in this age-old custom is that the unity of the family is grounded in God's love for us. May you experience unity and love through this simple celebration.


