

Pastor's Notes

"It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you to go and bear fruit that will remain." John 15:16

"I never <u>chose</u> to be brought into this family!" Parents may hear these or similar words from an angry child or frustrated teen. It is true for most of us; but its deeper truth it is indeed parents who choose us, and who guide and provide for us from childhood into young adulthood. They choose us as a way for their love to bear fruit. They love us on our good days and on those days when they love us without necessarily "liking" us. They love us through our successes and failures, our hopes and our fears, and in our quest to discern our gifts and how God calls us to share those gifts with the world.

This weekend, we in this country honor mothers, grandmothers, godmothers, stepmothers, birth mothers, and all the women who chose to love us into life, so that our lives might bear fruit that will remain. We honor their sacrifices made, out of love, to provide a home in which we might grow and bear fruit. We honor their willingness to persevere through difficult moments and to love us no matter what. And if we carry some unresolved wound in our relationship with our mothers, we seek the grace to accept their limits and seek peace, whether in person on earth or through prayer to their souls in heaven.

I encourage you to set aside some moments to share your reflections on the women who have been mothers in your lives. Then write a note (mom's love this), make a phone call, plan a visit, or say a prayer for them. Mothers are the first to show us the love of God in Jesus, months before we are born into this world. They are our first evangelizers who witness the gospel of love through their words and actions. May their love in us bear fruit for family, friends, and those most in need of another's love.

A special thanks to all who offered their time and talent for our four Confirmation Masses and five First Eucharist Masses over the past two weekends. Thanks to Fr. Rich and Maggie McMahon, who completed a year of guiding our Freshman Quest Confirmation Program for the first time; and special thanks to Terri Simeoni, who coordinated our First Communion preparation for what was her last time (if our search committee finds a gualified replacement so that she can retire). You all helped our children and young people realize that they are loved by this parish community and important to us. Thanks also to Mary Freeman, Maggie McMahon, and all the parents who coordinated the celebration at the Sunday 5:00PM Mass for our parish high school graduating seniors. Indeed, it takes a village; and this is a great village in which to live and worship.

Beginning <u>next weekend</u>, we return to a schedule of <u>five</u> weekend Masses: Saturday at 5PM and Sunday at 7:30, 9:00, and 11:00AM and 5:00PM. This expands our potential seating capacity from 480 to 600 individuals. We hope to continue the Sunday 5:00PM Mass beyond Memorial Day, based on ongoing attendance. Please "vote with your feet" (presence) if you would like to see this Mass continue throughout the summer. Thanks to all who continue to give so generously of your time, talent, and treasure so that God may bear fruit through and in us! May we go forth to bear the fruits of God's love.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Mothers are the great unsung heroes of the pandemic. And they need our help.





Correction of March 31, 2021 offertory results. In our April bulletin, we reported that offertory was down \$181,000 over the previous year. That amount was an error due to the timing of incorporating our Easter 2020 results into our figures. In fact, our offertory was down as of March 31, 2020 by about \$122,000 over the previous year. We apologize for this reporting error. We continue to anticipate that our budgeted deficit will be substantially reduced by the end of our fiscal year, as reported in the April bulletin.

The graph above fully incorporates this year AND last year's Easter results, through April 30, and shows our offertory is \$100,000 below a year ago. Our Easter budget is \$80,000; through April 30, we have received \$66,455.

As we prepare our annual budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021, we are projecting that the parish will need to return to pre-COVID offertory levels in order to break even. With the reinstatement of the retirement plan contributions, return to normalized staffing levels and other expenses as our campus reopens, our expected breakeven offertory level is in the \$1.85 million range, similar to 2019 fiscal year levels. The 2021-2022 fiscal year budget has been developed. Look for an update in our June bulletins.

We are truly blessed to be a part of this community - thank you for your investment in our mission here at St. Francis Xavier!



Habitat for Humanity <u>transitioning to</u> Fuller Center for Housing



For over 25 years, St. Francis Xavier has been sending groups of volunteers to the Mississippi Delta to build homes with Clarksdale Area Habitat for Humanity. In fact, plans are in place for construction of the 50th volunteer-built house in Clarksdale this summer - with one important change.

The local chapter has decided to align itself with a new organization – The Fuller Center for Housing.

Headquartered in Americus, Georgia, The Fuller Center for Housing was founded in 2005 by Millard and Linda Fuller, the same couple who founded Habitat for Humanity in 1976. The Fullers founded the nonprofit as a recommitment to the grassroots, Christian principles with which they launched their original affordable housing movement several decades ago.

A 1996 recipient of the Presidential Medal of Freedom, Millard passed away in 2009, but Linda remains active in the ministry. The Fuller Center for Housing has been given a 100% score for accountability and transparency by Charity Navigator, and has received GuideStar's highest-level Platinum rating for transparency as well.

The Fuller Center for Housing (<u>www.fullercenter.org</u>) builds and repairs homes in more than 70 U.S. communities and more than 20 countries around the world. Much like Habitat, homeowners are full partners in the building process, contributing "sweat equity" as they work alongside volunteers, then repaying the costs of materials on terms they can afford, with no interest charged or profit made.

The second collection for this ministry will take place at masses during the weekend of April 16th. Donations placed in Habitat envelopes will be credited to Fuller Center. Also, you may donate online at <u>Fuller Center</u> (Habitat for Humanity) (givecentral.org).
