

Pastor's Notes

Nations shall walk by your light. Isaiah 60:3

Happy New Year!

We know little of the magi of Matthew's gospel, who arrive sometime after the birth of Jesus with their precious gifts. Tradition numbers them as three because of their three gifts; but we do not know their number. Matthew states that they come from "the East"; but we are not told their countries of origin. We know not whether they are men or women, young or old, familiar with one another or meeting on their common quest to find the king whose birth has been announced to them by a star in the heavens.

The early Jewish disciples of Jesus, for whom Matthew writes his gospel, see in the magi the fulfillment of an ancient prophecy: that people from all the nations would one day praise the Lord in Jerusalem. Ironically, the authorities in Jerusalem perceive news of this birth as a threat to their power. The same star that starts the magi on a pilgrimage to meet the newborn king also stirs the King Herod to demand the life of every male child under a certain age. Mary and Joseph become refugees in Egypt to escape Herod's cruelty and protect their child. Matthew's community is told that, from the moment of his birth, Jesus was received as both a sign of hope and a threat to religious and civil authorities. Who are the magi of our day that invite us to welcome the presence of God in our midst with open hearts? Who are the "nations" who seek to walk with us, guided by God's light?

The love of God in Jesus is indeed a light for <u>all</u> peoples and nations. The star in the night sky continues to lead us on a journey into the heart of God. Our journey is more likely to be one of connecting with those around us than with those from faraway lands. Yet we must always be open to the magi from afar who invite to see God acting in new and unexpected ways. We are seekers of the presence of Christ in our midst; and we welcome those who arrive at our door and whose gifts help us to see more clearly the love of God in our midst.

This is the twelfth day of Christmas, when drummers drum as magi bow and the birth of God's Word made human is revealed to all the world. May this feast of God's light and love for all peoples lead all to walk in the light of God's Love.

Merry "Little Christmas"!





We have all experienced moments or days of darkness. How beautiful the words of Isaiah are: "Rise up in splendor! Your light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon you." We probably all agree that a blue sky and warm shining sun is preferable to a gray, cloudy day. Those sunny days can make us smile; so, too, we can smile if we remind ourselves that our light has come, that the glory of the Lord shines upon us. In times of darkness can we remind ourselves of this glorious promise and see not darkness, but light? The light God promises us.

And then St. Paul talks about the stewardship of God's grace that was given to him. At St. Francis we have been thinking about our own stewardship. What can we do? Perhaps we can help people to see the light, not darkness. Perhaps we can remind people of God's glorious promise of light. God's light can be shared with others in many ways—through financial assistance, through physical help, or through positive words and friendly smiles. Any of those actions can be the Star that leads someone to Christ. We can be that Star.

A Stewardship "Epiphany" in 2019

What will a stewardship way of life look like in 2019? What gifts of stewardship can we give to Jesus, just as the Magi did? The Magi did not seek out Jesus to gawk at Him, they sought to worship the newborn Lord. Part of that worship included offering gifts. I read an article from a priest years ago (I am embarrassed that I forgot his name, but his message stuck with me) that mentioned the three gifts offered to Jesus from the Magi: gold, frankincense, and myrrh and how they relate to gifts of stewardship. He explained that we can find symbolic meanings of stewardship behind these gifts. For gold, we might see this in relationship to treasure, which seems the most obvious out of the three. Frankincense is an ingredient in the incense used at Mass, which then can represent the time we offer in worship and prayer with God. Finally, he went on to mention that it takes effort and knowledge to transform and create perfumes, so myrrh is a fitting symbol for the gift of talent. All three gifts that the Magi presented to Jesus represent gifts of time, talent, and treasure we can share with our parish.

In 2019, let us consider how we choose to join the Magi.

- Our choice to worship together on Sunday, and to extend a warm welcome to an in-pew neighbor, are examples of our commitment to stewardship of time.
- Our choice to share our talents, as a Greeter, Eucharistic Minister, or catechist represents our willingness to share our talents.
- Our decision to place a regular financial gift (online or in the basket) to support the St. Francis Xavier mission and ministries shows care and attention to a shared responsibility for our spiritual home.



Each of us has a role to play!

During 2019, you will have the opportunity to share your time, talents, and treasure and we hope you will engage with the faith community in one or all of these stewardship practices. We are a unique place, made up of parishioners, visitors, Catholics, returning Catholics, de-churched or anonymous Catholics, and faithful from all denominations. **To provide nourishing Liturgies and sacraments, dynamic faith formation resources, and engaging and welcoming ministries, we need everyone's participation to the extent each is able.** As you reflect on your New Year's Resolutions for 2019, consider a resolution to be a good steward. Like the Magi, take a journey to a deeper relationship with Jesus by practicing a stewardship way of life in 2019.






