



Pastor's Notes

After the baptism...he went about doing good and healing all those oppressed. Acts 10:37-38

The live trees have long since been placed at the curb. Decorations have been taken down and safely stored away. The house and household routines are back to "normal." Holiday feasting has led some of us to post-holiday fasting. And, alas, the Bears ended their playoff run more suddenly than many of us had hoped. We may face the prospect of two more months of cold, gray days with the question, "So, what now?"

The Christmas Season ends with the celebration of the baptism of Jesus by John in the Jordan River. We are sent from a time of gratitude and wonder for God's choice to be born as one like us, and live as one among us, to a time of learning, discerning, and action. The baptism of Jesus marks the end of the life of Jesus as a tradesman, most likely a carpenter, supporting his widowed mother. The only gospel story of the life of Jesus after the events of Christmas is the story of his frantic parents finding him in the Temple – a tween who had responded to an impulse to remain in his "Father's house" for a time. Ignatius of Loyola referred to these thirty years as the "hidden life" of Jesus – a time of growing in wisdom, strength, and God's favor. It appears to have been so ordinary so as not to have drawn the attention of others.

This changed after his baptism, a second "epiphany" in which a voice from the heavens reveals Jesus as God's "beloved Son." From this point forward, Jesus proclaims the coming of God's kingdom into our world and reveals this kingdom as he heals the sick, frees those possessed, and even raises the dead to life. He blesses the poor in spirit and speaks of God's limitless mercy. He openly challenges those who would claim that some are more loved, or worthier of love, than others. He offers <u>all</u> a pathway to life.

This is our mission as we move forward from Christmas time into the "ordinary" days of the year. The poet Howard Thurman, put it this way.

Now the Work of Christmas Begins

When the song of the angels is stilled, When the star in the sky is gone, When the kings and princes are home. When the shepherds are back with their flock, The work of Christmas begins: To find the lost, To heal the broken, To heal the broken, To feed the hungry, To release the prisoner, To rebuild the nations, To bring peace among all, To make music in the heart.

Christmas Peace.



Freedom, Humility and Fairness

The word "expiate" means to free. Both the city of Jerusalem in our reading today and the action that happens to us during our baptism frees us. Jerusalem was pardoned from exile in Babylon and the sacrament of baptism pardons us from original sin. The Holy Spirit and the blessed water absolve us both. Jerusalem became the herald of good news and we become disciples of God charged to carry out his mission.

Jesus is like us in all but sin yet he waited patiently and humbly in line with the faithful to be anointed. He wanted to be with the people and not do his work from a distance. Nobody was aware of anything unusual about his presence. Not until we hear, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased" do we come to the realization of what just happened. John the Baptist in the gospel acknowledges that he is not worthy "to loosen the thongs of his sandals" when discussing the one who was to come after him. He tells us that he baptizes with water but that, "He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire." This respect and reverence on the part of John creates an atmosphere of wonder and excitement.

Finally, this week we learn that Jesus shows no favoritism. Every nation and every person who acts according to his law will be accepted. He will bring justice and peace to all. Like a caring shepherd he will gather us and keep us close. As the new year progresses may we be true to our baptismal vows and follow Jesus more closely and more consciously in our daily lives. Through our actions may we make ourselves more pleasing and beloved in the eyes of God.

Join us for Eucharistic Adoration! January 17, 2019 at 6:00-7:00pm

WHAT: During Adoration, sometimes referred to as a Holy Hour (but can be of any duration), the Blessed Sacrament is exposed on the altar for individual, silent Adoration. As Catholics, we proclaim the Real Presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament, not only during the Mass but in the preserved Hosts. St. John Paul II offered that "our communal worship at Mass must go together with our personal worship of Jesus in Eucharistic adoration in order that our love may be complete."

HOW: Adorers are invited to pray a rosary or other devotions, meditate on Scripture or meditate on devotional books. Adorers may also choose to just simply sit and 'be' with Jesus. Regular adorers have found an appreciation for the devotion: "Adoration has taught me new ways to pray, meditation, and I've learned new prayers. If you don't think you will know what to do or you're not sure on what prayers to say... you will soon find your own way to be with Our Lord."

WHY: Since Apostolic times, Catholics rightly have gathered to celebrate Mass in community as Jesus instructed. Adoration provides an opportunity for an intimate relationship with Jesus through individual worship, prayer, and listening. And we shouldn't underestimate the power of silence, which is difficult to cultivate in our society. Pope Benedict XVI wrote: "In a world where there is so much noise, so much bewilderment, there is a need for silent adoration of Jesus concealed in the Host...It is a source of comfort and light, particularly to those who are suffering."

WHEN: Beginning on **January 19, 2019**, SFX will be exposing the Blessed Sacrament for Adoration *every* 3rd Thursday of the month in the Church from 6:00-7:00pm.

We invite all to register as parishioners. If you are not receiving periodic mailings from the parish, you are not in our database. A registration form can be picked up at the back of the Church or printed out from our website, www.sfx-lg.org.

To help with our planning, we also ask that you let us know about your children, so that they can also be included in the database. Sometimes children are baptized elsewhere or families move into the parish after their children have been baptized. Consequently, we don't know about them until it is time to register for the Day School or for Religious Education. Again, the registration form available at the back of the Church or on the website can be used for this purpose.

Few things are more important than bringing children to church for our Eucharistic celebration. God bless all of you who do this. Of course, we understand if you have to take your child out into the vestibule for any reason. Sometimes they get anxious and just need to get up and move around and that's just fine. The Eucharist is a profoundly sophisticated ritual which takes time and patience to assimilate and integrate into our lives. Look at how it has deepened over time in our own lives as adults!

The fact that you parents are able to get everybody up and moving in the same direction at the same time astounds us and we are sure that it pleases God! Keep coming back!





