



Pastor's Notes

"The people were astonished at his teaching, for Jesus taught them as one having authority." Mark 1:22

Something about the teaching style of Jesus amazed his listeners and gathered crowds from the very beginning of his ministry. Mark suggests that this came from the authenticity of Jesus – the congruity of his words and actions. *Jesus was genuine*; his message of God's love and mercy was consistent with the physical and emotional healing he brought to those who were suffering. He spoke not to put others down by placing himself above them; rather, he lifted others up and taught us that the least and last among us are the first in the kingdom of God.

One of the three major areas of our mission as parish is *to learn to live the gospel in word and deed*. And a major part of this mission includes the programs of religious formation we offer to our elementary school children and high school youth. This weekend we highlight our parish elementary school, which has been a core part of the parish mission for over 100 years. We invest a significant portion of our resources to provide an option to families who want their children to complete their elementary school studies in an environment that can incorporate elements of the Catholic faith throughout the day. It is a valuable complement to our Religious Education Elementary Program that shares the Education Building and provides faith formation outside of the school environment.

St. Francis Xavier Elementary School is blessed with a faculty and administrative staff that could easily receive a higher salary in a public or charter school, but who offer their talents to our school because *they believe in our*

parish and school mission. Our parish school is blessed by the generous support of parishioners who contribute time, talent, and financial resources through Sunday contributions, school fundraisers, and contributions to the school endowment. Our parish school graduates are welcomed, at Lyons Township and several Catholic high schools, as students well prepared for the transition into high school studies. Sports, music, and other extracurricular programs expand student learning beyond the school day. *Thank you to all the school staff, teachers, and volunteers who make tis possible.*

St. Francis Xavier Elementary School *welcomes all parishioners to a School Open House* this Sunday morning, from 10:00-12:30. *All parishioners are welcome at all school events*, including sports, band concerts, and the spring play. I encourage you to take time to learn about what your commitment and generosity make possible.

The parish school is close to completing a Strategic Plan that will set goals and objectives for the next 3-5 years. Many parishioners contributed their feedback last fall and have played a critical role in shaping this plan. We will publish the plan when it has been finalized. Thanks to all who have contributed their time and talent to this effort.

Astonishing? Perhaps not to those who have come to know our parish elementary school from the inside out.



ONCE AGAIN, HERE IS A REPEAT OF OUR REPORT FROM LAST WEEKEND!

At this midpoint in our fiscal year, here are some financial highlights:

- Dozens of responses to the parish's request for 4% increases in Sunday offertory collections have come in. Our Christmas contributions continue to come in we have collected about \$148,000 toward our Christmas budget of \$158,000.
- We had a great initial response to the Finance Council's appeal to parishioners to switch to electronic offertory: 82 additional families enrolled in this system that ensures consistent contributions throughout the year. In addition, many parish households continue to make stock donations and/or use the Sunday envelopes consistently to support parish operations. One of the following pages of this bulletin contains more information regarding electronic giving...check it out!
- Our cash savings, from the generosity of decades of SFX parishioners who came before us, remain strong. Our goal is not to use these savings for ordinary operations so that they are available for campus building improvements and emergencies.
- We are running at an operating deficit for the current fiscal year. Recall that our budget is set so that our income breaks even with expenses. Our expenses are running close to budget. However, total collections are about \$50,000 below what is budgeted at this point in the year.

Meeting our budget enables us to do all we want to do for our parish and our community. Our children learn about Jesus' love through the liturgy and sacraments (and sing to us at some of the 5pm Masses – check them out!). Our youth experience the Spirit throughout the year in small groups and on retreats and mission trips. Our adults find help along the journey through many SFX ministries. ALL appreciate your support. Please review your situation and the chart below, and increase your contribution if you are able. God bless you all for your continuing support of our parish!



It's Flu and Cold Season!

As a reminder during cold and flu season, please remember to protect your health and that of others. Proper steps would include:

- * If you have a serious cold or the flu, please stay home on Sunday. You are not obligated to attend Sunday Mass if you are sick.
- * Be aware that others might not want to shake hands during the Sign of Peace. They might be protecting YOU. Please don't attempt to force others to shake hands against their will.
- * If you are not feeling up to par, but you are not sick enough to stay home or, if you are coughing or sneezing, please don't receive Communion from the cup and do not hold hands during the Our Father; do not shake hands or hug other people at the Sign of Peace a smile and nod of the head with the words, "The Peace of the Lord be with you" will suffice; do not drink from the chalice of the Precious Blood; receive the Host in your hand, not on your tongue. Although there is no evidence that germs are transmitted in this way your fellow communicants might be reluctant to receive.

Show concern for your brothers and sisters in the community, especially the elderly and chronically ill, and follow these simple guidelines to ensure a healthier winter for us all!


