



Pastor's Notes

"The Spirit drove Jesus out into the desert." Mark 1:12

There are many ways to enter the desert. Mark tells us that Jesus was *driven* by the Spirit, impelled by a force he could not resist. Last week Jesus was forced into the "outskirts" by those wanting something from him. Circumstances beyond our control, or forces that overwhelm us, can drive us into a "desert space." We feel isolated and alone; that we lack the support of others, or emotional and spiritual nourishment; we are unable to set our own course, or know not the direction in which our lives are headed.

There is another way to enter the desert; not driven, but *invited* by the Spirit. We can choose to enter the desert in search of solitude: <u>not</u> isolation, but rather a sense of peace in being with ourselves and God. We can choose to enter the desert to deepen our relationship with God and find that nourishment for our spirit that only God can provide. We can choose to enter the desert with a desire to surrender the direction of our lives to God; to allow God to redirect our steps onto a more authentic path.

How do you enter the desert this Lent? Perhaps, like Jesus, you are being driven into the desert by illness, loss, a broken relationship, a lost hope, an addiction in your life or in the life of someone close to you, or by some

other force or circumstance beyond your control. Will you allow Jesus to accompany you in your desert? Will you accept the companionship of one who experienced this desert in his own life and who wants to walk with you as he walked with the distraught disciples on the road to Emmaus? Will you trust that God can bring new life into the heart of your "desert" as we journey through these forty days?

Perhaps you are invited to enter the desert by choice. Perhaps this is the desert you encounter when you set aside extra time for prayer, and, there, encounter emptiness, anxiety, or yearning as you wait to feel God's presence. Or maybe it is the desert you encounter in your hunger or thirst after a time of fasting from some of the clutter that too often fills your body, mind or spirit, and, there, must be trust that God will provide all that you need. Perhaps it is the desert of surrender to God's will, even if choosing to do so will lead to significant changes in your way of life.

The desert lies before us for the next forty days until Holy Thursday, whether driven or invited by the Spirit. Journey well.

Scripture Reflection

Reflection for the 1st Sunday of Lent Liturgy Planning Team #4 Shirley Augustyn, Sr. Marcella Hermesdorf, Diane Walsh

In today's Gospel, Jesus was led into the desert by the Spirit. Jesus spent forty days and nights fasting in the desert and was tempted by Satan during these forty days.

In the same way Jesus was tempted, we are as well. Some temptations are harmless, others are not. But if we know the means by which we are tempted, with the assistance of Jesus, we can battle anything.

We enter the desert with Jesus knowing that we will be tested but we are assured that He walks alongside of us to help us overcome our temptations.

Lent comes each year and presents us with the challenge to take stock of our lives. Lent provides us an opportunity to see more clearly what we hold within our hearts. Lent is a time for personal reflection.

So let us take these forty days and enter into the desert with Jesus and remember the vows of our Baptism in which we promised to reject sin and to live as children of God, "Repent and believe in the Gospel."

Lent 2018 **Catholic Lenten Practices**

Fasting and Abstinence

All Catholics 14 years of age and older follow the discipline of abstinence from all meat on Ash Wednesday and every Friday of Lent, including Good Friday.

All Catholics 18 years of age, but not yet 59 years of age, follow the discipline of fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. We eat only one full meal on a Fast Day and other smaller meals necessary to maintain strength and health.

Almsgiving

This traditional Lenten practice is associated with Fast and Abstinence. Money saved as a result of eating less or from "giving up" is given as alms to others who are hungry. CRS Rice Bowl or the St. Vincent de Paul Society are suggested charities for Lenten alms.

Prayer

During Lent all are called to renewal of our relationship with God through personal prayer. The community has opportunities for Lenten prayer as well:

> **Stations of the Cross** will be prayed at 8:20 am on Fridays

The Sacrament of Reconciliation

The Lenten Season of Repentance and Renewal is the most appropriate time for Catholics to confess sin and celebrate absolution.

> **Parish Reconciliation Service** Monday, March 19 at 7:00 pm

Individual Private Confession Saturday morning—9:30 am Saturday evening-4:15 pm Private Prayer in church each day.




