Pastor's Notes

The Spirit drove Jesus out into the desert....

Mark 1:12

Each Lent begins with an account of Jesus spending forty days in the desert. Mark makes it clear in his gospel that Jesus did not do this on his own, but rather in response to the intense prompting of the Holy Spirit. God sent him into a time and space in which there would be few distractions and little comfort, save the love and protection of God. Mark does not provide a detailed account of the three temptations recorded by Matthew and Luke. He simply tells us that Jesus was "tempted by Satan" while "angels ministered to him" "among wild beasts." The desert experience of Jesus was a time when he came to deeply experience the love of God amid trial and temptation. It was a time in which he became grounded in his mission to proclaim the kingdom of God, calling all to repentance and belief in God's love and mercy.

Each Lent invites us into a new desert experience in the pattern of Jesus' own experience. We are not called to devise some torturous, demanding path for ourselves that we either fail to follow or feel some sense of accomplishment if we make it to the end. We are invited to listen to the invitation of the Spirit, which may or may not be a push to go where we would not choose to go. It is a call to fast for a time from that which distracts us so that we might place ourselves consciously in the presence of God. It is a call to prayer, devoting some time each day to quiet meditation, morning Mass, the rosary, or some other practice that quiets our hearts. It is a call to give alms by freely sharing some of what we have kept for ourselves with someone in greater need. The Spirit might call us to reconcile with God or a friend for some harm we have caused: or to make peace with someone who has harmed us and against whom we are holding a grudge. In the desert, we can expect, in some form or other, the aid of angels, the presence of wild beasts, and the temptations of Satan. But through it all, we will be offered the deep,

abiding love of God and the promise that God will *always* walk the journey with us.

We enter this Lent with the presence of a virus that has created its own desert experience as it continues to limit our relationships and activities. We enter this Lent with economic insecurities and less confidence in many things that we used to take for granted. We enter this Lent invited to know more deeply God's loving presence in our lives and in our world. We enter this Lent with faith and hope that the inevitable crosses of life will be transformed by God's love into resurrection and redemption.



Reflection for the First Sunday of Lent

Artists often depict the story of Noah and his ark as being one of contrasts-the ominous darkness of the storm, foreboding clouds, and savage waves and the imagine of placid water, blue skies and a distant rainbow. But what happened in the boat? We are left to imagine the fear, suffering and uncertainty the humans felt during the voyage-trapped with the wild beasts and birds and unsure about when the nightmare would end. It would have required great faith to believe that they would one day see the light again! Our experience of the pandemic has been similar-filled with darkness, fear, and uncertainty about the world into which we will emerge. As Catholics, we are a people of hope, a people who anticipate the good news of the resurrection. The poet, Amanda Gorman, has painted an image of what will await us in the light of Easter morning.

"When day comes we step out of the shade, aflame and unafraid the new dawn blooms as we free it for there is always light, if only we're brave enough to see it if only we're brave enough to be it."

PASTOR EVALUATION

Every priest of the Archdiocese is asked to engage in a periodic evaluation of his ministry. This evaluation has taken various forms over the years, always inviting parishioners to participate in some manner. The current evaluation tool of the Archdiocese, the Catholic Leadership 360 Review, is directed by an independent, national group. From Your SFX Parish Counselor

There's a fine line between stress and anxiety. Both are emotional responses, but stress is typically caused by an external trigger. The trigger can be short-term, such as a work deadline or a fight with a loved one or long-term, such as poverty, discrimination and chronic illness. People under stress experience mental and physical symptoms, such as irritability, anger, fatigue, muscle pain, digestive troubles and difficulty sleeping.

Anxiety, on the other hand, is defined by persistent, excessive worries that don't go away even in the absence of a stressor. Anxiety leads to a nearly identical set of symptoms as stress: insomnia, difficulty concentrating, fatigue, muscle tension and irritability.

Both mild stress and mild anxiety respond well to similar coping mechanisms. Physical activity, a nutritious and varied diet, and good sleep hygiene are a good starting point, but there are other coping mechanisms available.




