

Pastor's Notes

"The moment you eat of it, your eyes will be opened, and you will be like gods who know what is good and what is evil." Genesis 3:5

The serpent beguiles the first human persons with the temptation to be like gods and to have the knowledge of good and evil. Suddenly the fruit that God had forbidden them to eat seems "pleasing to the eyes and desirable for gaining wisdom." The serpents promise proves true, and they quickly gain knowledge of what is evil, unaware that, up to this point, they had known, only and instinctively, what is good. What had seemed pleasing and desirable becomes an obstacle in their relationship with the Creator. They are separated from the good that is God, and instead become like "gods" who hunger for food that cannot satisfy and wisdom that leads to ignorance.

Our ancestors told this story out of their awareness of the human temptation to choose that which will harm us in order to find a quick fix for our hungers. As a result, we lose the grace of humility and begin to hide the naked truth of our dependence on God and our temptations to grab onto something other than God that might give us independence and power and end our hunger for good. In the process, we become dependent on the very things that we thought would give us independence – sometimes to the point of addictions that threaten our life and sanity.

It is for this reason that the Spirit leads Jesus into the desert, the exact opposite of the garden of the first temptations. After forty days in the desert, hungry and tired, Jesus faces three temptations from the devil: to satisfy his hungers without God; to test God's love by creating a crisis for God to prove God's love; to turn to a false god to obtain at least a fleeting sense of power. Without the pleasures of a garden, Jesus looks within to God's love and the centrality of that relationship in his life. He rejects short-term pleasures with trust that only God can provide what will satisfy. This is the message Jesus will bring to the world through his preaching, his healing, and his willingness to surrender his life in trust that God is more powerful than death.

What tempts me at this point in my life to become "wise" by choosing quick fixes that fail to satisfy the hunger that can only be satisfied by God, and only fully satisfied when I dwell fully with God in the kingdom that awaits us all? What is pulling me away from God with the false promise that I can become like a god and control all my needs and protect myself from all harm? What started as a good thing in my life that now threatens to take over my life? What do I need to let go of, at least for the next forty days, if only to gain perspective and more deeply root myself in God's love?

The answer is different for each of us. May we encourage one another to face the challenge of the desert so that we may rejoice in the good news of the garden that now holds an empty tomb.

Every First Sunday of Lent, we hear the story of Jesus' temptation in the desert. After his time there, Jesus had a clearer idea of who he was and what God was asking of him and calling him to do—to bring about God's kingdom.

Lent is a time for us to find a "desert," somewhere that is quiet and away from the routine and distractions of daily life—not for forty days, of course, but for a little time every day, if possible. Only there can we reflect on, contemplate, who we are as followers of Jesus. There we can see how faithful we have been—or not—to what God is calling us to be and do.

In our desert, we can see whether we have been distracted from our discipleship by the "things of this world"—often very good things, but ones that have become overly important. After our time in the desert this Lent, let us re-commit ourselves to our vocation of building the Kingdom of God through our acts of almsgiving, love, kindness, compassion, forgiveness, and peace making.




