

What is our Discernment and Decisions Team doing now?

The parish Discernment and Decision Team is in the process of summarizing feedback from the two parish Town Halls and comments from the PPC Parishioner Engagement Survey. This will help to create a brief description of the strengths, opportunities, and challenges of St. Francis Xavier Parish in our efforts to live out the Archdiocesan vision for all parishes. Teams from St. Cletus and St. John of the Cross are doing the same. Our three documents will be incorporated into one larger document, which also will include ways in which we see opportunities to increase our collaboration in achieving this vision for our area.



The core of the Archdiocesan-vision is to **make disciples, build community, and inspire witness**. How will we bring this vision to life in our parish, in our grouping, and for the benefit of the entire local Church? The written document, which will be submitted to Cardinal Cupich for his approval, is just the launching pad for what we will be striving to achieve over the next three years and beyond.

Why Do We Need Renewal?

What is our present reality? Fewer people attending Mass. Larger numbers of people in society choosing to reject any religious affiliation. A broken world in need of healing.

1. Jesus is calling us to know him better and to follow Him more closely. We are called – and commissioned – to **make disciples**. What do we need to do to nurture current and future generations of Catholics in our individual and parish family?
2. Christ is calling us to discern what vitality means for today's parish and school, and then to **build community**. How do we work together – within and across parish boundaries and throughout the Archdiocese – to strengthen one another and create Catholic communities that are sustainable for the future?
3. As Christians, we bear Christ's light and hope in the world. Pope Francis implores us to go out to the world and to those on the margins. How can we work together in new ways to **inspire witness** within a world that is numb to the real presence of God?

An Outpouring of the Holy Spirit Is Upon Us

The Spirit remains alive and active within the Church, ever calling us to deeper relationship with God and one another. What the Spirit has in store for us is so much more than what we could imagine. Please continue to pray for a renewal that will lead to a parish of ever greater **discipleship, stronger community, and inspired witness** for the sake of all we are called to serve.


Women's Lenten Book Club





Reflection for the First Sunday of Lent

If you don't face any temptation in the faith journey, it means you are giving in to the world, and not swimming enough against the tide. As Jesus was tempted by the devil, so should we expect temptation.

The devil wanted Jesus to show His power by turning stone into bread, to which Jesus replied, "One does not live on bread alone". The same Jesus who fed five thousand people with a few loaves of bread and fish, certainly has the power to turn stones into bread. Jesus teaches us that we are given power, not to show off, but to use for good. In our materialistic world, the temptation is to worry about where our "bread" (food, money, shelter, retirement, etc.) will be coming from. If we live on the true bread from above, which is the word of God, our earthly needs will also be taken care of.

The devil then tempted Jesus with power and glory. Jesus replied that "You shall worship the Lord, your God, and him alone shall you serve". We have a choice each day if we will serve God, over the lure of power, fame, money and pleasure. Those things are not necessarily bad in themselves, but nothing should take precedence over God's reign over our lives.

Jesus was then tempted by the devil to throw Himself down for the angels to catch Him, to which He replied "You shall not put the Lord, your God, to the test". True faith is not testing God to prove Himself to us by saving us from our predicaments. But it is remaining faithful, no matter the outcome of our dire situation. Because we know that "No one who believes in him will be put to shame"!

Weekend Mass: A Home for All at St. Francis Xavier!

The Archdiocese recently revised its recommendation on wearing masks in church, allowing parishes to make masks optional. Parishioners with children too young for the vaccine and persons with compromised immunity issues for themselves or someone at home have asked us to provide an option for attending Mass in person. The parish COVID Leadership Team met last week to determine how to provide the safest possible environment for all who want to worship at St. Francis Xavier.

The following **changes** to our Sunday Mass protocols are in effect **beginning this weekend**.

- ◆ **Masks are now optional at the Sunday Masses 9AM, 11AM and 5PM.**
- ◆ **Masks are still required at the Saturday 5PM Mass and the Sunday 7:30AM Mass.**
- ◆ **Masks are now optional at all daily Masses.** Please allow appropriate distance if you are not wearing a mask.

We are **restoring the presentation of the gifts** from a table at the back of the center aisle.

Hand sanitizing is no longer required before receiving Communion. We encourage everyone to bring personal bottles for hand sanitizing. Spray bottles with hand sanitizer will be available in the front pews.

Decisions for Holy Week and Easter will be made after April 1 based on conditions at that point. **Thank you** for your continued understanding and patience.



The Board currently consists of eleven members who each serve a three-year term. Each Board member serves on one of the following committees:

- Catholic Identity

- Finance
- Strategic Planning
- Marketing/Communications



Common Questions:

- **Do you need to have experience on a board or have a career in education?** NO, you do not need to have prior experience on a school board or experience in education to apply.
- **How much time is this commitment?** We meet once per month plus 1-2 supplementary meetings each month. Expect approximately 6-8 hours per month.
- **Do you need to have a child at the school to apply?** NO, we encourage parent (guardian) of a Religious Education student, young adult parishioners and alumna/us of SFX. Candidates need not be parents.
- **How does the application/selection process work?** There is a one page application, a face-to-face meeting with the members of the Board and then the Board votes on the slate of applicants.
