

Pastor's Notes

"By grace you have been saved." Ephesians 2:5 and 8

St. Paul believes this truth to be so important that he repeats it. We cannot not earn the salvation that is ours in Christ, no matter the holiness of our actions. Our salvation is the gift of a loving God who asks in return our gratitude and our willingness to give this gift forward to others. My sister reads this column online each week. She commented that she could have done without the detailed description of crucifixion as a Roman instrument of punishment and control. Yet it is only by comprehending the intended hopelessness of the cross that we can comprehend the depth of God's love, which transforms the cross into an instrument of grace. This is the proclamation of Jesus in John 3:16 that is cited and repeated at sports events and other large public gatherings: "God so loved the world that God gave God's only Son."

Our children in the parish elementary school and religious education program have been celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation over the past few weeks. Our fourth grade children have focused on the individual celebration of Reconciliation, having been introduced to a more communal setting in second and third grade. This weekend, in one of four services, they will participate in the individual celebration of Reconciliation. Please keep them in your prayers as they grow more deeply into this experience of God's loving forgiveness <u>no matter what</u>. High school teens are invited to a celebration planned especially for them this Sunday evening. Adults are invited to celebrate this Sacrament this Monday at St. Cletus Parish, next Monday at St. Francis Xavier, or the following Tuesday at St. John of the Cross. May we all use this opportunity to let in the loving grace of God by which we are healed and saved.

Last weekend, members of our St. Vincent de Paul Society gathered to celebrate and give thanks for the service and leadership of Paul Saladino, who has given over the leadership position to Patrick Murphy after many years of guiding the group until a new leader came forward. Thank you to both men, and to the other women and men who respond to the needs of families in our area with compassion, confidentiality, and kindness. You are a blessing.

Scripture Reflection

Reflection for the 4th Sunday of Lent Liturgy Planning Team #2 Cathy Krepps, Renee Nutt, Bernadette McMahon, Diane Redmond, Joan Stopka

"The Lord is kind and merciful; the Lord is kind and merciful. Slow to anger, rich in kindness, the Lord is kind and merciful." Psalm 103

Three words stand out from today's readings: compassion, transformation and choice. All of them have something to say about our relationship to God.

First, we see God and ourselves in a parent/child relationship. Sometimes we act selfishly with little regard for anyone else. God the father, who loves us dearly, may raise his voice and sternly warn us. We don't care. We choose to continue our destructive behavior and in the process get hurt or hurt someone else. God throws up his hands in frustration and metes out a punishment. Eventually, because his compassion for us is overwhelming and he can't remain angry, he forgives us. This process repeats itself endless times.

Second, we witness God's compassion and love for all of us who sin against him. This sin causes a death to our relationship. We distance ourselves and turn away, but His tireless and continued care and concern cause a transformation in our lives. We are redeemed and brought back to life. "By grace you have been saved. It is a gift of God." When we live in Christ and imitate Him, we are proof to the world of the richness of God's mercy.

Third, we are presented with choice. The darkness is where evil dwells and its works are hidden. Evil hates the light. The light is where we find the truth and its works are clearly seen. Truth loves the light. We have a decision to make. Let us walk together toward the light. Let our works and words bring peace to all. Let us choose to love. Let us choose Christ.

Lent 2018 Catholic Lenten Practices

Fasting and Abstinence

All Catholics 14 years of age and older follow the discipline of abstinence from all meat on Ash Wednesday and every Friday of Lent, including Good Friday.

All Catholics 18 years of age, but not yet 59 years of age, follow the discipline of fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. We eat only one full meal on a Fast Day and other smaller meals necessary to maintain strength and health.

Almsgiving

This traditional Lenten practice is associated with Fast and Abstinence. Money saved as a result of eating less or from "giving up" is given as alms to others who are hungry. CRS Rice Bowl or the St. Vincent de Paul Society are suggested charities for Lenten alms.

Prayer

During Lent all are called to renewal of our relationship with God through personal prayer. The community has opportunities for Lenten prayer as well:

Stations of the Cross

will be prayed at 8:20 am on Fridays

The Sacrament of Reconciliation

The Lenten Season of Repentance and Renewal is the most appropriate time for Catholics to confess sin and celebrate absolution.

The St. Francis Xavier Day School is one of the many wonderful ministries within the St. Francis Xavier Parish. We are fortunate to have an active School Advisory Board that works throughout the year on behalf of our school and parish community.

The purpose of the School Advisory Board is to:

- Develop, formulate, and adopt policies which govern the operation of the School
- Review and advise on the annual budget and determine sources of funding for the School

Children's Liturgy of the Word

A Unity Hall Option For Parents

A long-standing tradition of St. Francis Xavier Parish is to welcome and encourage the presence of children of all ages at Sunday Mass. Jesus taught that children reveal the attitudes that we all must adopt if we want to be prepared for the kingdom of heaven. Their presence is a blessing for all of us. The blessing of young families in church is a gift to all of us.

Some parents recently spoke to us of the moments when their little children need a break through a change of scenery or the opportunity to walk. Many use the grounds surrounding the church for this purpose in warm weather. The narthex has minimally served the need in cold or inclement weather. These parents asked whether it would be possible to activate the speakers in Unity Hall during Sunday Mass so that parents could allow their child a break in any season without having to leave the building, and allowing the accompanying parent to stay connected with what was occurring in church.

Unity Hall will provide a natural extension of the narthex and a gesture of hospitality to younger families. However, we want to emphasize that Unity Hall is not a "cry room" to which we expect parents with little children to gather. It is a space for little children who need a break. We continue to welcome within the church the giggles, cries, squirms, outbursts, and other expressions of little children who are comfortable where they are. We hope that the parents of these children will know that they are welcome to remain, and are surrounded by more than a few "older parents" who remember what it was like.

The sound system in Unity Hall will be connected to the church sound system for the 9:00, 10:30, and Noon Masses each Sunday, unless a group is using Unity Hall for a gathering during that Mass. We will evaluate whether there also is a need at the remaining three Mass that we are able to accommodate.

Let us all remember the importance of hospitality and welcome as hallmarks of a vibrant community of faith.

Revised Parish Mass Intention Policy

A long-standing Catholic practice has been to offer a Mass for the soul of someone who has died. Some also ask that a Mass be offered for a special intention, such as a birthday or wedding anniversary. Local policy recommends a \$10 donation, which the presider at that Mass receives as part of his income. If we accept additional intentions for any Mass, the additional donation is used to support parish ministries. Every parish is asked to accept multiple intentions for <u>no more than two</u> Masses each week.

We began accepting Mass intentions for 2019 on Thursday, March 1. To align parish policies with those of the Archdiocese, as of March 1, 2018 the parish office accepted new intention requests as follows.

- *We will accept intentions for Sunday Masses* as of the weekend of April 7-8. On a rotating basis, two Masses each weekend will be reserved as follows.
 - One Mass each weekend will be reserved for the "People of the Parish." Per Archdiocesan policy, no other intentions will be accepted for this Mass.
 - One Mass each weekend will be reserved for "Multiple Intentions." More than one intention will be accepted for this Mass.
- We will accept more than one intention for the *Monday 9:00 Mass each week*.
- We will accept only one intention for the remaining Sunday or weekday Masses.
- We will honor all multiple Mass intentions that we already have accepted.
- We will do our best to make *exceptions for special circumstances*, such as the anniversary of a death.

We appreciate your patience as the office staff transitions to these new procedures,




