Pastor's Notes

Peter went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, rolled up in a separate place.

Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed.

John 20:8

Sorrow and guilt cannot perceive what the eyes and mind cannot confirm; love sees from the heart and believes without need for proof. This is the core of John's account of Easter morning. Mary Magdalene grieves the death of Jesus and the terror of recent days; she finds an empty tomb and runs to tell others. Peter is preoccupied with guilt for his betrayal of Jesus; he enters the empty tomb and fears his failure to protect even the lifeless body of Jesus. Only John, who stood at the foot of the Cross with the Mother of Jesus, enters the empty tomb with hope; he peers into the emptiness and sees Resurrection, even though none of them yet understand what that means.


Last Easter, we celebrated Easter through a recorded Mass in an empty church. This year our home of worship is open to a limited number of people who made a reservation in advance or who can join us via livestream. We may at first confront the emptiness around us: the required distances in what is usually a crowded church. We may see only what is missing. Yet we are invited to look again through our heart and the eyes of faith. Jesus lives in all the gaps in the pews; in the airwaves that reach out to homes; and in our efforts to connect with those who are isolated and lack an internet connection. Jesus lives in the hands and hearts of volunteers who weekly provided bags of food to those in our community in need. Jesus lives in the hope that vaccinations and will restore masks soon more normal connections with one another. The tomb is empty because Jesus lives among those who take up his mission to care for others and make good use of the gifts God has given us.

Welcome to all who are making your return to us after a year away. Welcome to those joining family or friends for this Easter celebration. Welcome to those who join us from near and far via the internet. Welcome to those joining us for the first time, or after a longer time away for whatever reason. Thank you to all who have generously shared your time, talent, and treasure to keep us vibrant in our mission to pray together, to continue to deepen our faith, and to serve those in need. May we never take for granted the blessings God continues to bestow on us.

At the Easter Vigil, our faith community grew a bit. We baptized Amy Whitsitt and her children Ellie and Jack; we welcomed into the Catholic Church Amy's husband, Garrett Whitsitt, and Catherine Murphy and Robert Goshorn. We then fully initiated all four adults into the Catholic Church through Confirmation and Eucharist. We are blessed by their decision to become one with us in Christ. Next Sunday at the 9:00AM Mass we welcome one more adult into the Catholic Church. Clarice Olson is a resident at Bethlehem Woods who was never formally baptized into any faith and who expressed a long-held desire to become a member of the Catholic Church. She is an inspiration to us all. The Spirit is indeed alive and at work among us!

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

As we walk on our life journeys in this world, we may often feel overwhelmed. Struggle and suffering can mark our lives because of health issues, job insecurity, family concerns, or the painful loss of a loved one. The world itself, in Saint Paul's words, "has been groaning" (Roman 8:22), as it struggles with wars, violence, ecological degradation, economic injustice, and natural disasters. And as we are keenly aware this past year, the Church herself has struggled mightily with the shameful legacy of abuse and its mismanagement.

It seems that the landscape of our lives is entirely shaped by struggle and suffering. And that might seem to be the sum and substance of it all, but, in faith, we know that it is not. Our celebration of the Lord's resurrection in this Easter season opens our eyes beyond this desperate landscape to a new and hope-filled horizon. There is more to the story than our struggle and suffering. In the Resurrection of Jesus, we can begin to see a new life ahead of us that God offers to us.

As we go forth in this Easter season, I am reminded of the great Psalm 118 that the Church so often prays:

I was thrust down, thrust down and falling, but the Lord was my helper.
The Lord is my strength and my song; and has been my savior.
There are shouts of joy and victory in the tents of the just. (vv.13-15)

May this Easter season renew within you and your loved ones the conviction that God is your helper and an abiding awareness of your victory in the Risen Lord Jesus.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

We, the diocesan bishops of Illinois, write today out of great concern. Bills have been introduced before the Illinois General Assembly to repeal Illinois' Parental Notice of Abortion Act. They are **House Bill 1797** and **Senate Bill 2190**. The enactment of this legislation would lead to tragic and irreversible outcomes.

The Parental Notice of Abortion Act simply requires that when a minor girl seeks to have an abortion, a parent or guardian is notified 48 hours before the procedure. The obvious hope of the law is that parents, by their deep love and moral obligation, will act to protect, support and guide their children. In every other facet of life, we are taught—and we teach—that parental involvement is key to the child's best interest. Repealing the Act is nothing less than an invasion into the sacred space of family life by the state, with no provision to support the minor emotionally, humanely or materially at a critical moment in her life.

It is unfortunately true that not all young people come from loving homes. In these cases, when the threat of abuse or neglect outweighs the rights of parents, the current law allows a young girl the opportunity to declare in writing that there is abuse, or she can seek an emergency hearing before a judge to explain her situation. We acknowledge that this can be emotionally difficult; however, such difficulty must be weighed against the harm done when our laws effectively undermine family life by separating children from the care of parents who love them the most. The state should do everything to support families, not destabilize them.

The existing Parental Notice of Abortion Act provides important safeguards against the evils of sexual abuse and human trafficking. If a minor girl can be taken by any adult man to an abortion clinic, in the hopes of erasing the evidence of his abuse, what protection exists outside of the girl's parent or

guardian being informed? Why would we want to create such a dangerous environment?

Simply put, the Parental Notice of Abortion Act works. According to statistics gathered by the Illinois Department of Public Health, since the law's final enactment by the Illinois Supreme Court in 2013, abortions performed on minors in Illinois have decreased over 30 percent. The lives saved by this law are real and present among us.

These are the reasons every state in the Midwest and 37 states overall have laws requiring some form of parental involvement in the decision of a minor to have an abortion. Illinois has been among those states for 8 years and no obvious problems or detriments have been publicly exposed. The repeal of Parental Notice of Abortion is a tragic solution in search of a problem.

So what can you do? As Catholics of good will, we call on you to engage your elected officials—state representatives, state senators and the Governor—and urge them to oppose House Bill 1797 and Senate Bill 2190.

Possible methods of contact include phone calls, letters, emails, and Zoom meetings between legislators and you, their concerned constituents. For all of these efforts, you will need to be able to identify your legislators and secure the appropriate contact information.

Here is how:

Visit the Catholic Conference of Illinois' website—www.ilcatholic.org—scroll nearly to the bottom of the homepage, click on "Find Your Legislator" and input the asked-for information. Doing this will identify one's state elected officials, and simply clicking on their names will provide the contact information.

In our concern for all human life, and particularly for the struggles of young girls in these difficult circumstances and their unborn children, we ask you to participate in this effort. Together we are strong, and we can make a difference. Thank you.


