

Pastor's Notes

"Peace be with you." Luke 24:36

Once more, we hear the Risen Jesus speak these words to his disciples. He speaks peace to their terror, confusion, joy, and amazement. They struggle to recognize and believe that it is indeed Jesus; even after having just heard the account of the two disciples who met Jesus on the road to Emmaus. At first they see only the ghost of their own guilt for having abandoned Jesus in his hour of need; they fear what judgment the Risen Lord might impose on them.

"Peace be with you." Jesus offers healing and comfort rather than judgment. He shows them the marks on his hands and feet to prove that he <u>is</u> the one who died on the Cross and now lives. Jesus tries to open their minds and hearts to what they do not yet understand about his suffering and death. He sends them as witnesses to all who will listen of the loving forgiveness Jesus offers to all who will turn their hearts to God.

"Peace be with you." Where in my life is Jesus speaking these words to me, at this moment? How have fear, or confusion, or even excess joy so overwhelmed me that I fail to recognize the One at the center of my life? What have I not yet allowed God to forgive; or for what have I not yet forgiven myself? Will I allow Jesus to continue to speak to my mind and heart until I understand

what he has done for me and what he asks of me in return?

Next weekend will present both great opportunities and practical challenges. One year ago, the former "barely adequate interim coordinator of youth ministries" (me) and the parish elementary school managed to schedule the bi-annual Auction Party and the annual Confirmation Ceremony on the same date - Saturday, April 21. By the time we realized this, neither side could change the date (of course, we did replace that interim youth minister!). So...next weekend, the west parking lot will be occupied by a huge tent and therefore unavailable for parking. Everyone is welcome to purchase a ticket and join the SFX College Game Night Party on Saturday night. Earlier that day, 160 plus Confirmation families will be dropping off all but the driver and then seeking parking at Ogden School or on neighborhood streets. The tent will be up until Monday, so the same parking challenges will continue through all Sunday Masses. With the help of the Spirit that Jesus breathes upon us, we can all get through next weekend with joy, creativity, patience, and kindness to our neighbors and one another.

Scripture Reflection

Living the Paschal Mystery

Each time we celebrate the Eucharistic, the risen Christ is made known to us as he was made known to the disciples on the road to Emmaus. We may wish for a resurrection appearance where Jesus would eat baked fish, but those appearances are complete. After the ascension, the primary way we come to know him is though the breaking of bread. The risen Lord is flesh and bones, a true human being, raised to new life by the power of God. We participate in that new life by consuming the bread broken and shared. The breaking symbolizes the death. And the sharing symbolizes the community united in the one loaf. The bread is nourishment and life-giving as is Jesus himself. It is no wonder that the early Christians, like us, find Jesus made known in the breaking of bread.







ST FRANCIS XAVIER FOOD PANTRY mission is twofold: (1) provide supplemental nutritious food assistance to those in need in a safe, respectful and prayerful environment, and (2) partner with our community to support the pantry through food drives and volunteer opportunities. We serve an average of 90 families (or approximately 275 individuals) each week. Each family receives non-perishable and perishable food as well as toilet paper. We also provide "specials" when available, including: coffee, tea, snacks, condiments, baking goods, personal hygiene products, baby items, laundry and dish detergent and paper towels. Our homeless clients receive a bag specially packed to meet their needs (ready- to-eat, pop-top cans, paper plates, bowls, utensils, cold drinks, etc.). Leftover perishables are donated to the Constance Morris House, a home for abused women and children. We also share food with BEDS Plus, an overnight shelter organization. We have about 25 weekly volunteers who assist with food pick-ups and preparing and packing the food bags. We are so grateful for the ongoing support of our generous community!

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS LAGRANGE COUNCIL 6483 partners with local community groups to distribute flyers and collect food in the community and deliver it to local food pantries. Projects helps local teens get community service hours and helps the food pantry to provide nutritional assistance to local residents of the community. Aligning the needs of the local council, local community groups, the local food pantry and local residents benefits all of us when we work together. Experiencing the cooperation and generosity of the community and volunteers renews my faith in God and my neighbors, and our ability to make the world a better place.


