Pastor's Notes

"I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold.

These also I must lead,
and they will hear my voice,
and there will be one flock, one shepherd."

John 10:15

In a time when there are forces in our nation and our world that would divide us into opposing camps, we hear the desire of Jesus for us to become one flock, guided by one shepherd. This can be interpreted as the need for all to become Christians. However, it seems to me that the voice of Jesus is heard and followed in many ways by those who, for a variety of reasons, may not adopt the Christian religion as their own. We who live under the name of Christian are called and challenged to be the voice of the good shepherd to all, including those who "do not belong to his fold."

Through the Sacrament of Eucharist, which we will share with our children for the first time next weekend, we become part of the One Body of Christ. We become the hands, the heart, and the voice of Christ in this world. It is reassuring that God loves us so much that the Good Shepherd seeks us out when we are lost and brings us home. It also is challenging that Jesus sends us out as good shepherds, to seek out those who feel lost, isolated, rejected, or in any way treated with less than the human dignity owed to all God's children from the moment of conception to the moment of natural death. We are to be his voice of mercy, forgiveness, and welcome. We are to reach out to others in all our diversity of race, class, ethnicity, orientation, and religion. We are to live as a community of welcome that speaks and acts against the language and behaviors that try to separate others from the one fold that is the vision and desire of Jesus, the Good Shepherd.

This Saturday and Sunday at two special Masses each day, we celebrate the **Sacrament of Confirmation** with our high school freshmen. These young men and women of our parish have devoted time to service and to developing their faith within a small group of their peers within the restrictions of COVID protocols. They are not only our future; they are an important part of our present as a community of faith. They have much to offer us in their talents, their challenges, and their enthusiasm. Please offer them your affirmation and prayers. A special thanks to Maggie McMahon, Fr. Rich, and all of our adult group leaders who made the Freshman Quest Confirmation Program possible this year.




