

Pastor's Notes

"Live by the Spirit. The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control."

Galatians 5:16,22-23

Confirmation instills in us the seven *gifts* of the Holy Spirit: wisdom, courage, understanding, counsel, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord. We believe that the Spirit fills us with these gifts, each in the measure needed to fulfill our specific mission in the Body of Christ. But what about the *fruits* of the Spirit? *Baptism* made us one with Christ in his death and resurrection. *Eucharist* makes us members of the One Body of Christ each time we gather and receive Communion. *Confirmation gifts and sends us* to bear good fruit through word and deed. These three Sacraments fully initiate us as Catholic Christians with a mission to *go make a difference* in Christ and the Spirit.

The first disciples were baptized through the literal death and resurrection of Jesus. They received the Eucharist on the night before he died and then broke bread with him on several occasions after the resurrection. Yet, fifty days later, the Jewish feast of Pentecost finds them huddled in fear. It is the breath of the Spirit that gives life to the new church, just as the breath of the Creator gave life to humankind. Doors are unlocked, the message of Jesus is received in many different languages, and the disciples begin to heal the sick, show mercy, and proclaim the kingdom of God in word and deed. The mission of our parish community has remained vibrant through many ministries during this time of COVID. As more people can gather each weekend for Eucharist and more of our ministries can resume, the Spirit continues to breathe life into each and all of us. May our response to that breath bear much good fruit.

Revised Seating Guidelines. The Archdiocese recently issued new seating capacity guidelines. We still are required to keep every other pew empty; but *could* reduce social distancing from 6' to 3'-4'. The parish


staff, Parish Pastoral Council, and Reopening Leadership Team have discussed how to proceed at St. Francis Xavier.

Many regular attendees have expressed how much they value our emphasis on providing a safe environment. We want to maintain this sense of safety for parishioners.

S0, we decided to expand our seating capacity to 25% (150 individuals) for weekend Masses, weddings, and funerals, and then determine how many more individuals we can accommodate at 6' social distancing. Last weekend, we were able to seat everyone at all Masses except on Sunday at 9 and 11. We will continue to monitor attendance to discern the optimal balance for those who worship here. We welcome your feedback and ask you patience as we navigate this transition.

Catholic Women's Club Day. Women of the parish reinvented the *Pre-Lenten Luncheon* as a "Post-Easter Event" enjoyed by many women of the parish. Highlights included a yoga class at Luxxe Honor (attended by 25 women and streamed online) and a gathering at The Elm (attended by 75 women) – both sell out events. Many supported the event as Angel donors or purchased raffle tickets. **Special thanks** to Catherine Murphy (President), Lindsey Mackenzie (1st Vice President), and the entire CWC Board!

Dear Members of the Christ the King Parish and School communities,

On April 21, 2021, I informed you of an allegation of sexual assault against your Pastor, Father Lawrence Sullivan dating from 1984 when he was eighteen years old. In keeping with our procedures, Father Sullivan was asked to step aside from his pastoral duties until a thorough investigation could be completed. This has been a difficult time for your parish and school communities and all involved. Thank you for your patience with this process.

A thorough review of this matter by the Archdiocesan Office of Child Abuse Investigations and Review and an outside investigator, including multiple unsuccessful attempts to obtain information from the accuser, concludes that the accusation against him, which was alleged to have occurred prior to his entering the seminary, cannot be substantiated. Therefore, I am reinstating Father Sullivan as your Pastor effective immediately.

Father Sullivan has fully cooperated with the investigation during these weeks. He has steadfastly reaffirmed the imperative for us as a Church to keep the protection and safety of our children as our priority.

As I informed Father Sullivan of my decision to re-instate him as your Pastor, he again stated that we must remain vigilant in protecting our children, and spare no effort to bring healing to victim survivors. He fully embraces our longstanding policies and practices on the conduct of all church personnel.

Let me take this occasion to remind our parishioners and the public that:

- since 1992, we have enforced safe environment protocols and a code of conduct for all who work with minors and we have reached out to victims with pastoral and personal attention;
- 2. since 2002 we have reported all allegations to the civil authorities and in that year we reported all historical allegations to these authorities;

- beginning in 2006, we have publicly listed the names of diocesan priests who
 have substantiated allegations of abuse of minors against them and in 2014 we
 published more than 20,000 pages of information on these cases;
- 4. in accord with our zero tolerance policy, no priest with even one substantiated allegation of abuse of a minor remains in ministry.

It is important to note that our policies also call us to do everything possible to restore the good name of priests when the process has determined allegations cannot be substantiated. This, too, is a matter of justice. Therefore, out of regard for Father Sullivan and all our priests, I resolve to see his good name restored. Toward that goal, I will share this letter with pastors in the Archdiocese of Chicago, asking them to provide it to their parishioners. This letter will also be sent to all employees of the Archdiocese and the media and posted on our archdiocesan website.

Healing now must be the pathway forward for all of us. Father Sullivan shares this sentiment and you can honor him by doing everything to make sure that a spirit of reconciliation and unity prevails as you move ahead. In this way, the mission of Jesus can flourish. That is my prayer for you.

Habitat for Humanity transitioning to Fuller Center for Housing



For over 25 years, St. Francis Xavier has been sending groups of volunteers to the Mississippi Delta to build homes with Clarksdale Area Habitat for Humanity. In fact, plans are in place for construction of the 50th volunteer-built house in Clarksdale this summer - with one important change.

The local chapter has decided to align itself with a new organization – The Fuller Center for Housing.

Headquartered in Americus, Georgia, The Fuller Center for Housing was founded in 2005 by Millard and Linda Fuller, the same couple who founded Habitat for Humanity in 1976. The Fullers founded the nonprofit as a recommitment to the grassroots, Christian principles with which they launched their original affordable housing movement several decades ago.

A 1996 recipient of the Presidential Medal of Freedom, Millard passed away in 2009, but Linda remains active in the ministry. The Fuller Center for Housing has been given a 100% score for accountability and transparency by Charity Navigator, and has received GuideStar's highest-level Platinum rating for transparency as well.

The Fuller Center for Housing (<u>www.fullercenter.org</u>) builds and repairs homes in more than 70 U.S. communities and more than 20 countries around the world. Much like Habitat, homeowners are full partners in the building process, contributing "sweat equity" as they work alongside volunteers, then repaying the costs of materials on terms they can afford, with no interest charged or profit made.

The second collection for this ministry took place at masses during the weekend of May 16th. Donations placed in Habitat envelopes will be credited to Fuller Center. Also, you may donate online at <u>Fuller Center (Habitat for Humanity)</u> (givecentral.org).
