

Pastor's Letter

"You are witnesses of these things."

Luke 24:28

Monday night, St. Cletus, St. John of the Cross, and St. Francis Xavier officially completed Phase 1 of the Archdiocesan **Renew My Church** initiative. As I have stated in earlier articles, Renew My Church has three goals for all archdiocesan parishes:

- To make missionary disciples
- To build vibrant faith communities
- ◆ To inspire witness

Three parish teams in our grouping presented a document to the Archdiocese that outlined the vision of each parish and our shared vision as we seek to realize these goals and reach out to all in our shared communities. I am grateful to the leaders from our parish team for their participation and dedication to this effort. Our document has been approved the bγ Presbyteral Council and Cardinal Cupich. You can read the full document via the following link to the parish website.

Among the **strengths** we identified for St. Francis Xavier Parish are: a pastoral staff wellequipped to support this effort; a strong elementary school; and a deep commitment to service and outreach. Challenges opportunities for growth include: expanded opportunities for adult formation and spirituality that serve various age and interest groups, including parents and married couples and those who have come to live on the fringe of parish life; reinvigorating our ministry to youth by reimagining our high school program through a parish youth minister and other adults; creating year-round service opportunities for families and individuals, and increasing our focus on justice issues.

The parish section of the document concludes, "Our implementing hope is that new opportunities to deepen their faith relationships with Jesus and others and inviting people into the life of the church by meeting them in their everyday lives just as Jesus did, will strengthen our parish community. Of course, it only begins there; we look forward to collaborating with our neighboring parishes,

sharing resources and ideas to improve parish life all around, and impacting the larger community with the gospel message."

Our parish grouping will <u>not</u> be undergoing any structural changes. Therefore, we are moving directly into the final phase of Renew My Church: implementing our vision over the next three years and beyond. In the language of Renew My Church, we begin to *Build the New Reality* of a vibrant church. This is not a new mission. It is realizing in *our* time and place the mission that Jesus gave to his first disciples before ascending to heaven. The lived witness of the first Christians drew so many others into relationship with Jesus. We, as a community and an area, will learn how and strive better to do this *here and now*. I am excited by the possibilities.

This weekend, we pause as a nation to remember the men and women who sacrificed their lives in service to our country and our values. We might also remember those who sacrificed their lives in the struggle for greater justice within our nation. Our belief that "all are created equal," and our commitment to a land of "freedom and justice for all" has grown and expanded over the years. We give thanks for all who have sacrificed to bring this hope to others, within and beyond our borders. Have a Blessed **Memorial Day**.

Second Collection: Fuller Center for Housing



The collection took place at last weekend's masses to support the efforts of our parishioners who volunteer their time and talents for one week each summer building homes in Mississippi with The Fuller Center for Housing.

For over 25 years, St. Francis Xavier has been sending groups of volunteers to the Mississippi Delta to build homes with Clarksdale Area Habitat for Humanity. In fact, plans are in place for construction of the 50th volunteer-built house in Clarksdale this summer.

Last year, the local Habitat chapter decided to align itself with a new organization – The Fuller Center for Housing.

Headquartered in Americus, Georgia, The Fuller Center for Housing was founded in 2005 by Millard and Linda Fuller, the same couple who founded Habitat for Humanity in 1976. The Fullers founded the nonprofit as a recommitment to the grassroots, Christian principles with which they launched their original affordable housing movement several decades ago.

Millard passed away in 2009, but Linda remains active in the ministry. The Fuller Center for Housing has been given a 100% score for accountability and transparency by Charity Navigator, and has received GuideStar's highest-level Platinum rating for transparency as well.

The Fuller Center for Housing (www.fullercenter.org) builds and repairs homes in more than 70 U.S. communities and more than 20 countries around the world. Much like Habitat, homeowners are full partners in the building process, contributing "sweat equity" as they work alongside volunteers, then repaying the costs of materials on terms they can afford, with no interest charged or profit made.


30-Day Journey with St. Joseph


