Pastor's Notes

"He took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them, and said: 'Take it; this is my body.' Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them, 'This is my blood of the covenant which will be shed for many.'" Mark 14:22-24

"We are the Body of Jesus, broken and given that others might live." The opening words of this hymn, written by Sr. Kathy Sherman, CSJ, proclaim the heart of this day's feast. Its driving rhythm proclaims that Jesus forms us as his Body through the Eucharist so that we will go out to bring his presence into the world. Ours is more than a holy ritual contained within the walls of a worship space. Our celebration of Eucharist is nourishment for our mission, uniting us in a communion of diverse ministries, gifts, and callings. We, as a communion of faith, are called to be the real presence of Jesus in our homes, our communities, and our places of work, study, and play.

Our weekly gathering is central to our life as a Catholic Christian community. There is never a Sunday in which we do not seek the healing of Eucharist for the small sins of the previous week and the grace to begin again. Our minds and hearts are fed as the Word of God seeks a place in our lives. Each week we become what we receive, the Body of Jesus, who gives us the nourishment to live out our calling as we go forth into another week to love and serve the Lord in our loving service of others.

I appreciate the extra effort required to "get to church" on summer weekends, especially when travelling. I sometimes confront this challenge on a vacation weekend. Yet, when I attend Mass at another church, I usually feel my connection with something larger than myself: God, who nourishes me in Word and Eucharist; and a community, whether familiar or unfamiliar, that reminds me that I live my faith as a member of a much larger and diverse communion. *I encourage us all to make the effort* to come together on these summer weekends and allow the Lord to nourish, teach, and send us as members of the Body of Jesus who lives in the community of St. Francis Xavier.

Monday night we celebrate the graduation of the Class of 2018 from St. Francis Xavier Elementary School. They are an amazing class who bring many gifts into their high school years. We honored our other eighth grade graduates at the end of the religious education year, and our high school graduates at the 6PM Sunday Mass at the beginning of May. I add congratulations to all who just graduated from college, and those who completed advanced degrees or certificate programs. As you enter the next chapter of your lives, may you carry the knowledge, wisdom, and grace that has blessed your journey to this moment. May you always find among us a home where your gifts are celebrated and encouraged to flourish.

Jesus said: This is the cup of salvation, poured out for love of you. It is the sign of a promise that will never end. And so we sing: (Antiphon)

Jesus said to love one another, and to love as I have loved you. You will live as my friends if you keep this command. And so we sing: (Antiphon)

Every time we gather for Eucharist, we are commissioned to "go" and be Jesus for others. We respond with the phrase, "thanks be to God." We are not saying thanks because it is over. When we say, "thanks be to God," we are announcing to the world and reminding ourselves that we will be the Body of Christ everywhere we go.







Please Take Note...

In December of 2000, parishioner Dan Bagley lost his battle to cancer. While undergoing chemotherapy, Dan would often sit in the sacristy where he could hear the mass on the PA system and be away from the crowd to avoid being around excessive exposure to infections. After Dan's death, his family and friends purchased a new chair for our sacristy for use by those whose chemo might otherwise keep them away. As a reminder to all, especially new parishioners, anyone undergoing chemotherapy is welcome to make use of the "The Dan Bagley Chair" while attending mass. Or, if you have some other medical need for which the chair may help, you are welcome to use it.

Also, be aware that the parish is equipped with special hearing devices for those who need hearing assistance. Those devices can be found in the priests' sacristy.

For those who may be experiencing low blood sugar due to diabetes or other health issues, orange juice is located in the small refrigerator in the priests' sacristy.

Anyone with a physical challenge is encouraged to sit in the east transept (Spring Avenue side) near the exit door. A Eucharistic minister will bring communion to you, rather than have you approach the altar.


