## Pastor's Letter

*Jesus breathed on them and said,  
"Receive the Holy Spirit."*

*And they were filled with the Holy Spirit.*

John 20:22

Acts 2:4

Scriptures provide two accounts of the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the first disciples. John describes it as the breath of Jesus upon the disciples on the Day of Resurrection. Luke describes it as a strong driving wind and tongues of flame that drive the disciples out of hiding fifty days after the resurrection. We realize in this that the coming of the Holy Spirit into the hearts of the first disciples was a process and not a moment. Even though the Spirit had been breathed into their hearts on Easter morning, it was not until the feast of the spring harvest, Pentecost, that the Spirit within them drove them to action.

We are called to be alive in the Spirit! This call comes amid senseless gun violence through mass shootings and on the streets of our cities, destructive wars in Ukraine and many African nations, increasing threats to our environment as a result of our self-serving behaviors, a virus that has claimed millions of lives across the world, and an overall decline in respect for the dignity of each human life from conception to natural death. We may want to hide behind locked doors in imagined safety, as did the first disciples. Yet the Spirit persists and insists that we go out into the world to be God's breath of healing, forgiveness, and peace.

We learn something else from the Pentecost story. The first disciples are understood by people who speak many different tongues and normally would not understand one another. While the breath of the Spirit is one, its expression is many and varied. Our diversity is only a problem when we try to create an artificial uniformity or to silence all opposing voices. The Spirit invites us into a harmony of many voices hearing and expressing God's Word in their own tongue, which is to say, their own way of understanding the world. We go forth into the world not only to proclaim the Good News in our own voices, but to listen as God's Word is proclaimed through many other voices.

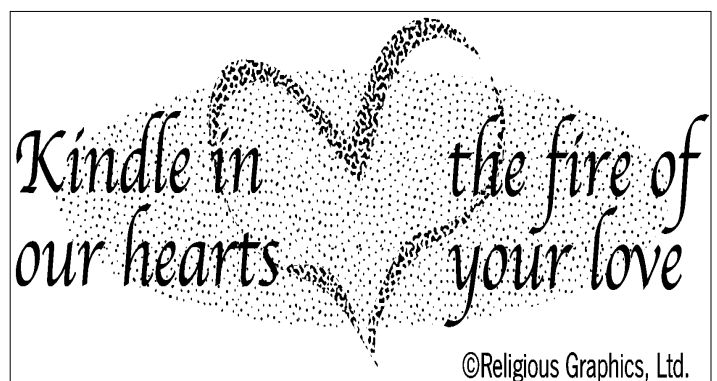
God does not give any one person, political party, or outlook on life the answer to all of our problems and doubts. The Spirit of God speaks through all of us, so that in listening to one another, we might discern the voice of God among us. We build faith communities of welcome and engagement to inspire others to witness with and among us – to expand and deepen our understanding of what God is calling us to do and to provide, among a more diverse group of people, the many different resources to do what God asks. We are One Body of many diverse members sent to transform the world in the Spirit.

We are amid a season of graduations. Congratulations to all the young men and women who complete a course of studies and move forward into the next part of their journey. Congratulations to our newly confirmed, whom we hope will bring the Spirit's life into our community in new and challenging ways.

Our Parish Service Day and parish Party are only two weeks away. Make plans to reach out to serve one of the many needs for those we serve, both here and beyond. Make plans to gather and celebrate a summer evening with other parishioners and to give thanks for what God continues to do in and through us. Meet someone new and introduce them to some of your "old" parish friends. Rejoice in the Spirit among us!

## Collection For Retired Priests



Next weekend, there will be a special collection for the Retired Priests. There are over 200 Retired Archdiocesan Priests. They represent 30% of all the priests serving in the Archdiocese. Normal retirement age is 70 for Chicago priests. Sixty-five priests still live in a rectory and assist the parish on a regular basis. Close to 140 retired priests celebrate Sunday Mass weekly, perform marriages and baptisms; and visit the sick in hospitals. Without these dedicated men, many parishes would not be able to offer the full range of Masses and sacraments that are currently available.

This collection is solely for the retired priests of the Archdiocese of Chicago. The retired priests of the Archdiocese receive no funds from the Religious Retirement Collection taken up in December. Those funds go for religious nuns and brothers and religious order priests.

The Archdiocese of Chicago is committed to caring for our retired priests, but we need your assistance and the generosity of every parish community.

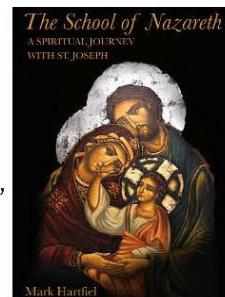
## 30-Day Journey with St. Joseph

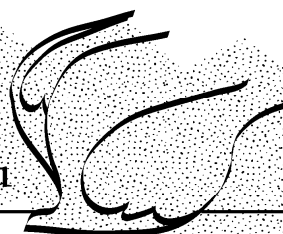
## Kitchen Angels
