

Pastor's Notes

"A person scatters seed on the land and sleeps and rises, night and day. Through it all, the seed sprouts and grow, they know not how." Mark 4:26-27

We enter "summer time." The seeds of crops to be harvested have been sown in fields that show few signs of growth. In the weeks to come, they will produce juicy, red tomatoes and corn stalks "as high as an elephant's eye." Peaches, apples, and pears will be picked from trees whose blossoms recently floated in the air with their sweet scents. We can study agricultural factors of sun and rain, soil quality and weeds, aeration and irrigation. transformation from seed to harvest remains somewhat of a mystery when viewed from a day -to-day perspective. We weed and water the garden and deadhead the flowering plants; yet how the flowers continue to appear can fascinate us.

Such is the kingdom of God, Jesus says. All of creation will one day bear fruit when all is brought to completion in Christ. Each of us is destined for a kingdom just beyond our sight. The seeds already have been planted. We water the soil and weed the garden; yet in the short span of our lives on earth, we cannot always see their growth from day to day. Nonetheless, there will come a harvest time, when all that God has been about will be clear to us all. We are asked to serve God's kingdom with patience and diligence; trusting that what we cannot yet see will still come to be in God's time. And the harvest will be more bountiful than we can imagine.


One of the gifts of summer is the time to relax a bit more in the extra hours of daylight that are given us. We are offered the opportunity to change some of our routines, to take in the beauty of nature, to gather outdoors, and even to sleep in more often than usual. These gifts

may feel especially precious after living under some of the stricter protocols of the coronavirus for more than a year. We continue to be asked to maintain reasonable precautions; yet we are free to travel and gather with others in ways that lift our spirits and renew our hopes.

How will you spend this precious gift of summer time? Will you spend time enjoying the beauty and mystery of what is, trusting in the abundance of what is yet to be? Will you treasure the gift of time spent face-to-face with others and the opportunities to reach out to others with an unmasked smile, a word of encouragement, or a gesture of kindness? Will you "tend the garden" of the seeds that God has planted within you, and that may bear fruit at the end of this summer, even if their full fruit awaits you in the kingdom?

Set aside some time to ponder. Offer God some space next to the lawn chair or beach blanket or car seat. Sleep and rise, day and night, and trust that God's seed is alive and growing within and through you, even when you know not how.

Collection For Retired Priests



This weekend, there will be a special collection for the Retired Priests. There are over 200 Retired Archdiocesan Priests. They represent 30% of all the priests serving in the Archdiocese. Normal retirement age is 70 for Chicago priests. Sixty-five priests still live in a rectory and assist the parish on a regular basis. Close to 140 retired priests celebrate Sunday Mass weekly, perform marriages and baptisms; and visit the sick in hospitals. Without these dedicated men, many parishes would not be able to offer the full range of Masses and sacraments that are currently available.

This collection is solely for the retired priests of the Archdiocese of Chicago. The retired priests of the Archdiocese receive no funds from the Religious Retirement Collection taken up in December. Those funds go for religious nuns and brothers and religious order priests.

The Archdiocese of Chicago is committed to caring for our retired priests, but we need your assistance and the generosity of every parish community.

Special Circumstances For Receiving The Eucharist

The Catholic Church has historically recognized the intimate relationship of wheat hosts and wine as matter for the Eucharist. However, if you have Celiac Sprue Disease or a family member suffers from a gluten intolerance or if you are alcohol intolerant, receiving the Eucharist is life-involving in seriously challenging ways. The logistics or manner of accommodating lay persons with gluten or wine intolerance in a parish setting during the Liturgy of the Eucharist is left to the afflicated party and the pastor to decide the best way during Mass for the afflicted party to safely receive the Precious Body or the Precious Blood.

If you or a member of your family is affected by this circumstance, please contact our pastor, Fr. Bill Tkachuk, to discuss the particulars of your situation. Fr. Bill can be reached by calling the Rectory Office at 708-352-0168.

Are You Registered As Parishioners? Do We Have A Record of Your Children?

We invite all to register as parishioners. If you are not receiving periodic mailings from the parish, you are not in our database. A registration form can be picked up at the back of the Church or printed out from our website, www.sfx-lg.org.

To help with our planning, we also ask that you let us know about your children, so that they can also be included in the database. Sometimes children are baptized elsewhere or families move into the parish after their children have been baptized. Consequently, we don't know about them until it is time to register for the Day School or for Religious Education.
