

#### Pastor's Notes

O Lord, our God, how awesome is your name through all the earth. Psalm 8:2

We are baptized in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. We begin and end prayer in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Spouses give and receive rings from one another at the time of their Marriage, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. In these moments, we affirm our faith in a God who lives in a communion of three distinct Persons, always in harmony of thought, word and action. At various moments in our lives, we may feel more drawn, or find it easier to relate to, one of these three Persons over the other two. Yet we always are in relation with one God whose love for us is without limit.

How awesome is the name of God! How awesome the God who creates us, redeems us, and sustains us. How awesome the God who made us each unique, yet all in God's image; who teaches us who we are and how we are meant to live; and who sends us with diverse gifts to be the living, active presence of God in the world.

This weekend we honor the fathers in our lives, including stepfathers, grandfathers, godfathers, and all who showed us a father's love and care. We give thanks for those men in our lives who thrive in this role and responsibility. We seek peace with those who struggle to do so or who are hindered by circumstances beyond their control. We pray for those with whom we will have an opportunity to connect this day; we pray for those who have completed their journey on earth, including ancestors whom we never may have met but who have shaped our story. God bless them all!

Last Sunday, over eighty parishioners from the parishes of our Deanery gathered with Cardinal Cupich to share their sadness, their frustration, and their hopes as the church continues to offer healing to those abused by clergy in the past; to hold accountable both abusers and those who covered up or ignored the abuse; to create safe church environments for children and youth today; and to inspire Catholics of all ages to reshape the church for ourselves and future generations. I have been blessed to have him as a colleague and housemate for four years, and as an associate for the past two years. #### **Scripture Reflections**

One challenge we have in discussing the Trinity is that we've been given so many images and metaphors for it. For example, it's been said that St. Patrick used the shamrock, a three-leafed clover, to teach the natives about Trinity. But of course God is more than three leaves, and each "person of the Trinity" has a more dynamic relationship than leaves on a shamrock. Some church fathers used the image of the sun for the Trinity, saying that the Father was like the sun itself, the Son the light, and the Spirit the heat. All three are in dynamic relation, but the sun itself is primary. This is a better image than a shamrock, but expresses the three persons as inanimate objects. Something similar happens when modern thinkers imagine the Trinity as the three modes of water in a liquid, solid, and gaseous state, but all at once!

The many images of Trinity and each of them incomplete in one way or another contribute to a fundamental challenge in discussing Trinity. Ultimately, it is best to go back to Scripture itself, and let that inform our understanding, which we do today by reading from the Gospel of John.

#### You are invited to Eucharistic Adoration

June 20 from 6:00-7:00pm

WHAT: During Eucharistic Adoration, the Blessed Sacrament is exposed on the altar for individual, silent adoration. As Catholics, we proclaim the Real Presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament, not only during the Mass but in the preserved Hosts. "Jesus remains in the Blessed Sacrament to give us the privilege of approaching him personally as so many people were able to do two-thousand years ago in Galilee and Judea" (Fr. F. Racine).

**HOW:** Adorers are invited to meditate on Scripture or read devotional books, pray the rosary or another devotion. You may also choose to just simply sit and 'be' with Jesus. If you are interested, prayer and reflection suggestions are available as starting points.

WHO: Jesus waits for us, each one of us, in the Eucharist. He waits when you are joyful, thankful, frustrated, or tired. All are welcome, including children. He specifically calls children to Himself, "Let the children come to me."

WHY: Since Apostolic times, Catholics rightly have gathered to celebrate Mass in community as Jesus instructed. Adoration provides an opportunity for an intimate relationship with Jesus through individual worship, prayer, and listening.

WHEN: The next Eucharistic Adoration will be Thursday, June 20. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed from 6:00-7:00pm. Come when you are able for as long as your schedule allows. If you have any questions, please contact Katie Kanzer at k.f.kanzer@gmail.com.





#### Area Respect Life Ministry Legislation Update

Statement of Cardinal Blase J. Cupich Archbishop of Chicago on the Passage of Senate Bill 25 June 1, 2019

The passage of Senate Bill 25, eliminating even the minimal limitations on abortions under previous law marks a sad moment in our history as a State. We have worked to make the case for a consistent approach to human dignity in Illinois and will continue to do so even as elected officials single out unborn persons for particular disregard. It remains our hope that Illinois will eventually distinguish itself as a safe place that welcomes not only those seeking a new life or second chance, but also the most vulnerable among us who deserve a chance at life.

We are resolved to let women and families in the Chicago area know they have alternatives to abortion. We will continue to provide help during their pregnancies and throughout their journey as parents. Our ministry in Cook and Lake Counties has taught us that when teenagers in underserved communities experience an unplanned pregnancy without proper support, the consequences for the health and well-being of mother and child can be grim.

But, we have also seen that a brighter outcome is possible when support is provided. Catholic Charities and its partners serve hundreds of young women and developing families every year. They nurture the mother and therefore the baby by providing classes in health and child development. They encourage the new families toward independence by providing childcare and making referrals for education, housing and employment.

As a young woman, served by a Catholic agency said, "It was like a second family when I came here. My Doula took me to doctors' appointments, explaining what all the papers and procedures meant, how my baby was developing, the changes my body was going through and how to eat and exercise to stay healthy."

Today, her son is thriving in the organization's early childhood program and its family support program helps her stay on track with personal goals. She will begin a bachelor's degree program this summer. With loving encouragement, she has turned stressful circumstances into a positive, hopeful future for herself and her son.

Women have a real choice when they are given the support they need to bring their children into the world and parent them, supported by a society that truly values them. We will give that support to all who seek it in the hope that by offering them a choice, we will build stronger families and a better Illinois.

#### **Infant Baptisms**


